PROGRAM FEATURES

- Students will experience academic rigor, creativity, innovation and collaboration with an emphasis on technology.
- Core classes in math, science, English, socials studies and healthful living are offered.
- A Daily SMART Lunch schedule will provide students time during an extended lunch period to study, complete makeup work, and explore additional academic interests.
- Ninth and tenth-grade students will have elective options in Spanish, French, Career-Technical Education, Fine Arts, Social Studies, Science, English and Healthful Living.
- Heritage will open with a comprehensive athletic program and will enter the CAP 8 Conference. FACILITY FEATURES

- Heritage High construction was completed a year early through a joint-venture partnership with Heery International and D.H. Griffin Construction. For the 2009-10 school year, the school facility served as swing space for the Wake-Forest Rolesville High school community while WFRHS underwent renovations.
- The school is a reuse of the Knightdale High prototype originally designed by LS3P / Boney that was also used at Panther Creek High.
- The 264,416 square-foot building is located on a 110.46-acre site and has a student capacity of 1,600.
- The site features an upgraded ball park provided by the Town of Wake Forest and the Wake County Parks and Recreation Department.
- The school was built as part of the \$970 million Capital Improvement Program approved by Wake County voters in 2006.

DIRECTIONS

- From the beltline in Raleigh: Take US 1 North. Go approximately 13 miles to US 1A at Leith Chevrolet. Turn right on 1A. Go approximately 1 mile until you come to a light with Wake Forest Middle School on the left. Turn right at that light onto Rogers Rd. Continue past Heritage Elementary and Middle schools. At the traffic light, turn right onto Forestville Road. The school is on the right.
