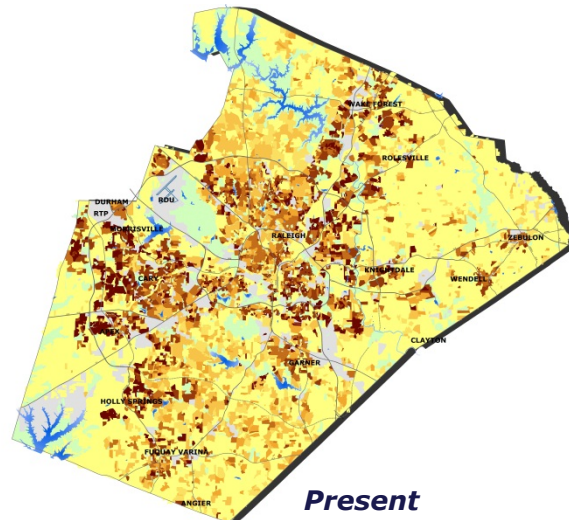

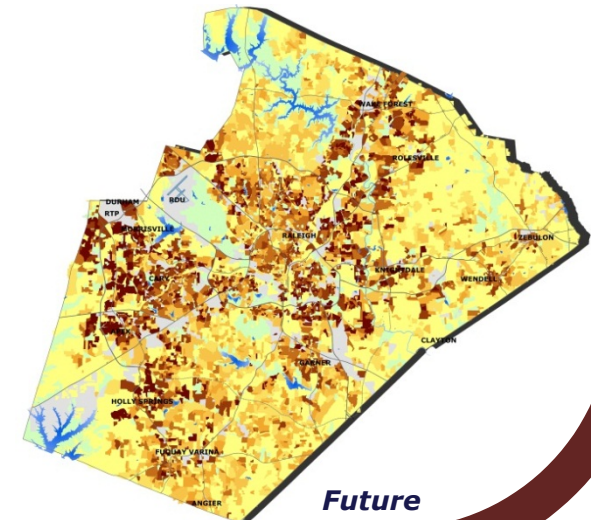

Report Overview

The Wake County Public School System's Demographics Profile: 2012-2013, School Statistics and Maps Report

was created to offer a snapshot of the current demographics in the Wake County Public School System through a data-driven and visually-pleasing manner. Information includes district overview, quick facts, individual school reports, student demographics, and enrollment projections. The majority of the data and maps included in the report represent summaries for the 2012-2013 school year. However, also included are enrollment projections until 2022, and the Capital Improvement Plan 2006 updates of data/maps that used to support the one billion building program approved by Wake County voters in 2006.

ENROLLMENT/SCHOOL DISTRICT RANKING

Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) has been growing steadily over the past two decades. Student population has almost doubled since 1994 and more than 40,000 new students are projected by year 2022. The WCPSS is currently the largest school district in the North Carolina and the 16th largest in the United States. The 2012-13 enrollment was 149,508 students, with an annual increase of 2,821 students and 1.9 percent student growth. Enrollment of about 153,000 is estimated for the upcoming 2013-14 school year.

NEW SCHOOL OPENINGS

With this growth comes the need for more schools to accommodate the increase in enrollment. WCPSS opened four schools at the beginning of this school year: one elementary school (Richland Creek, early start at Dubois Center), one middle school (Rolesville), and two leadership academies (Wake Young Men's Leadership Academy and Wake Young Women's Leadership Academy). In addition, Hilburn Drive Elementary (KI-5) transitioned to become Hilburn Drive Academy (KI-8) by opening 6th grade this year. Two new schools are planned to open by 2015: Rolesville High in 2013 and West Apex High in 2015.

SCHOOLS BY LEVEL

WCPSS has 104 elementary schools, 33 middle schools, 25 high schools, 4 special/optional schools, and 3 academies for a total of 169 schools.

SUMMARIES BY LEVEL

Enrollment and Facility Utilization

149,508 students are enrolled in 169 schools. The annual school campus capacity is 157,186 seats (including 1,136 temporary classrooms), resulting in an overall crowding of 95.1 percent.

Race/Ethnicity

The students' racial/ethnic composition in 2012-13 school year is consistent with the recent WCPSS race-ethnicity trends. Enrollment of White students (49.1%), Black or African-American students (24.4%), American Indian or Alaska Native (0.3%) and Two or More Races (4.2%) has declined as a percentage of total students, while Hispanic/Latino (15.4%), and Asian (6.5%) student enrollment percentage has increased. Percentages of Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander (0.1%) students remain the same as in 2011-12.

Limited English Proficiency and Free and Reduced Lunch Program

The need for special services in LEP (Limited English Proficiency Program) and ESL (English as a Second Language Program) has been decreasing for the several years. Approximately 11,143 or 7.5% of students were classified as LEP, and 5,326 or 3.6% of students required ESL services. However, 50,432 of WCPSS students, or 33.7%, applied and qualified for F&R (Free or Reduced-Price Lunches) – an increase of 0.4 percent since last year – with the majority of them being elementary school students.

Academically or Intellectually Gifted Program and Special Education Services

Academically Gifted Programs are offered in grades 4 through 12. As of April 1, 2013 (SY 2012-13), there were 26,889 students, or 26.5% enrolled in academically or intellectually gifted programs. In addition, 20,353 of WCPSS PreK-12 grade students were enrolled in Special Education Services or 13.35 percent of the total student population.

CALENDAR SCHEDULE

Of the 169 schools:

- 50 schools operate on a year-round calendar (40 elementary schools and 10 middle schools). Please note that five Y-R elementary schools switched to a single track calendar.
- 5 schools operate on a modified calendar (2 elementary schools, 2 middle schools and 1 high school),
- 4 schools operate on a calendar matching the community college calendar (Wake Early College of Health and Sciences High School, NC State STEM Early College, Wake Young Men's Leadership Academy and Wake Young Women's Leadership Academy), and
- 110 schools operate on a traditional calendar (62 elementary schools, 21 middle schools, 22 high schools, 4 special/optional schools, and 1 academy).

MAGNET SCHOOLS

31 schools offer magnet programs: 19 elementary schools, 8 middle schools, and 4 high schools.

WCPSS SUPERINTENDENT/AREA SUPERINTENDENTS

The WCPSS Interim Superintendent is Dr. Stephen Gainey. Seven area superintendents provide regional leadership to Wake County's 169 schools. The area superintendents are: Eastern Area: Danny Barnes, Central Area: Rose Anne Gonzalez, Northern Area: Pamela Kinsey-Barker, Northeastern Area: Andre Smith, Southern Area: Lloyd Gardner, Southwestern Area: Clinton Robinson, and Western Area: Jacqueline Ellis.

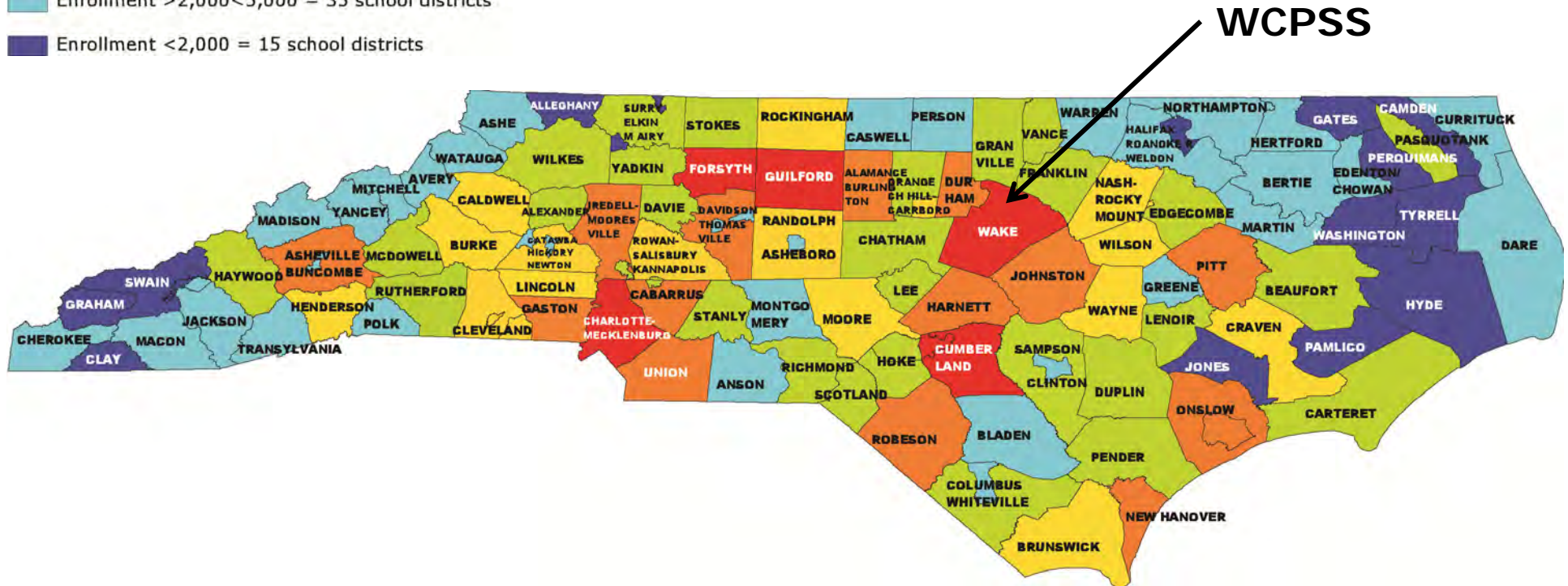

Student Enrollment 2012-13, Month 1* By North Carolina School Districts

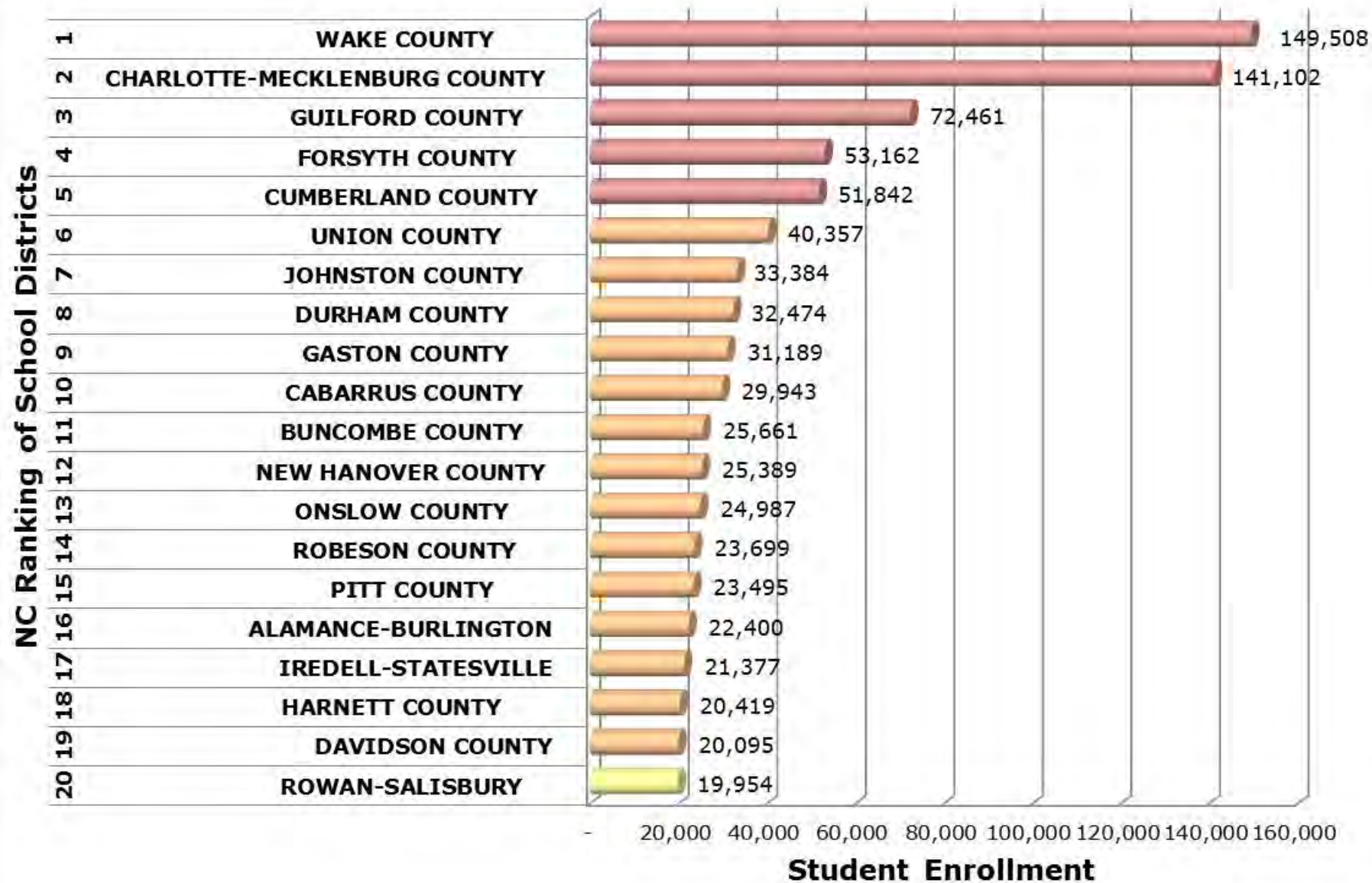

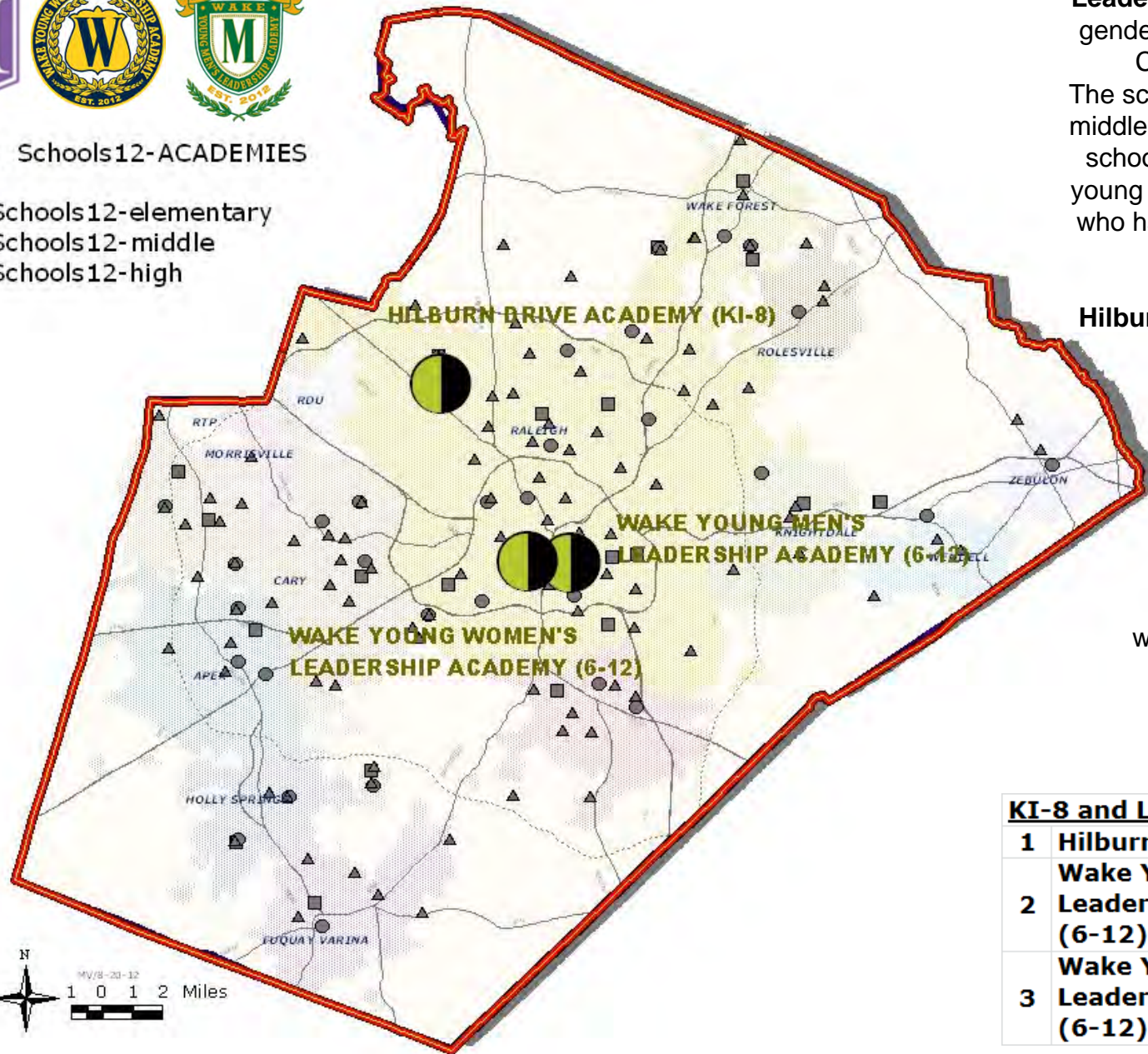


NEW KI-8 AND LEADERSHIP Academies

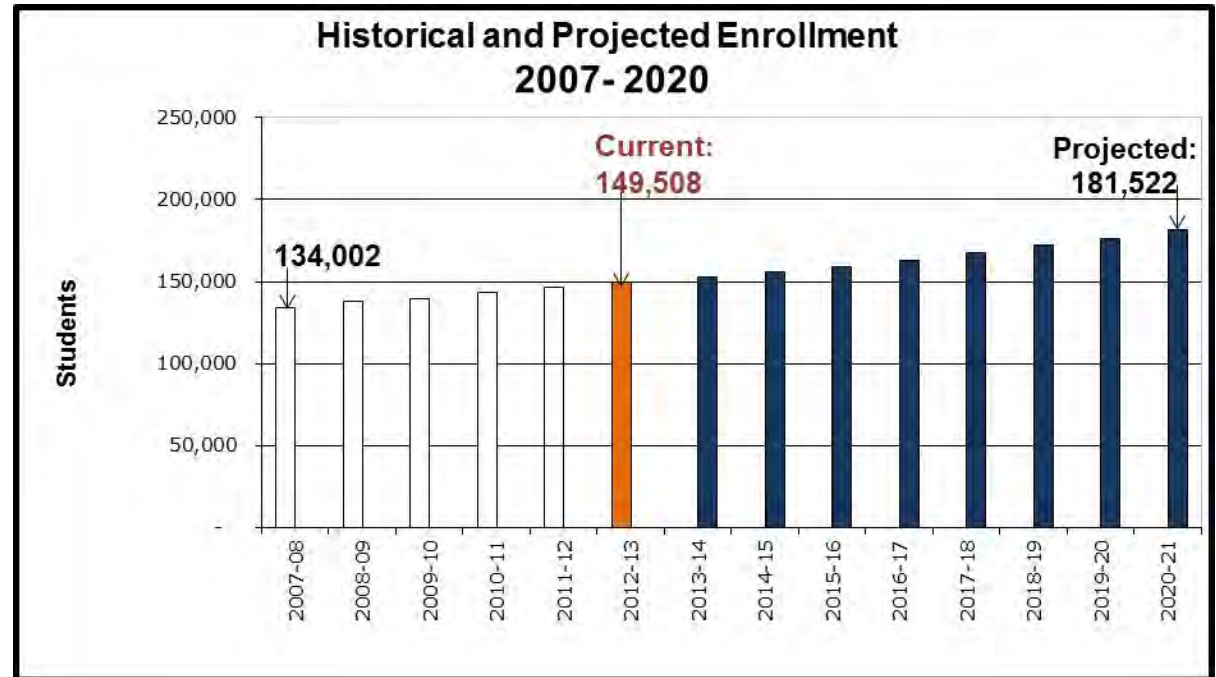
Hilburn Elementary was identified as an under-enrolled school and there was a need for approximately 300 additional middle school seats in the northern area of Wake County, so Hilburn was converted to a K-8 school. In 2012-13 Hilburn opened with a full 6th-grade class, and will add grade 7 in 2013-14 and grade 8 in 2014-15.

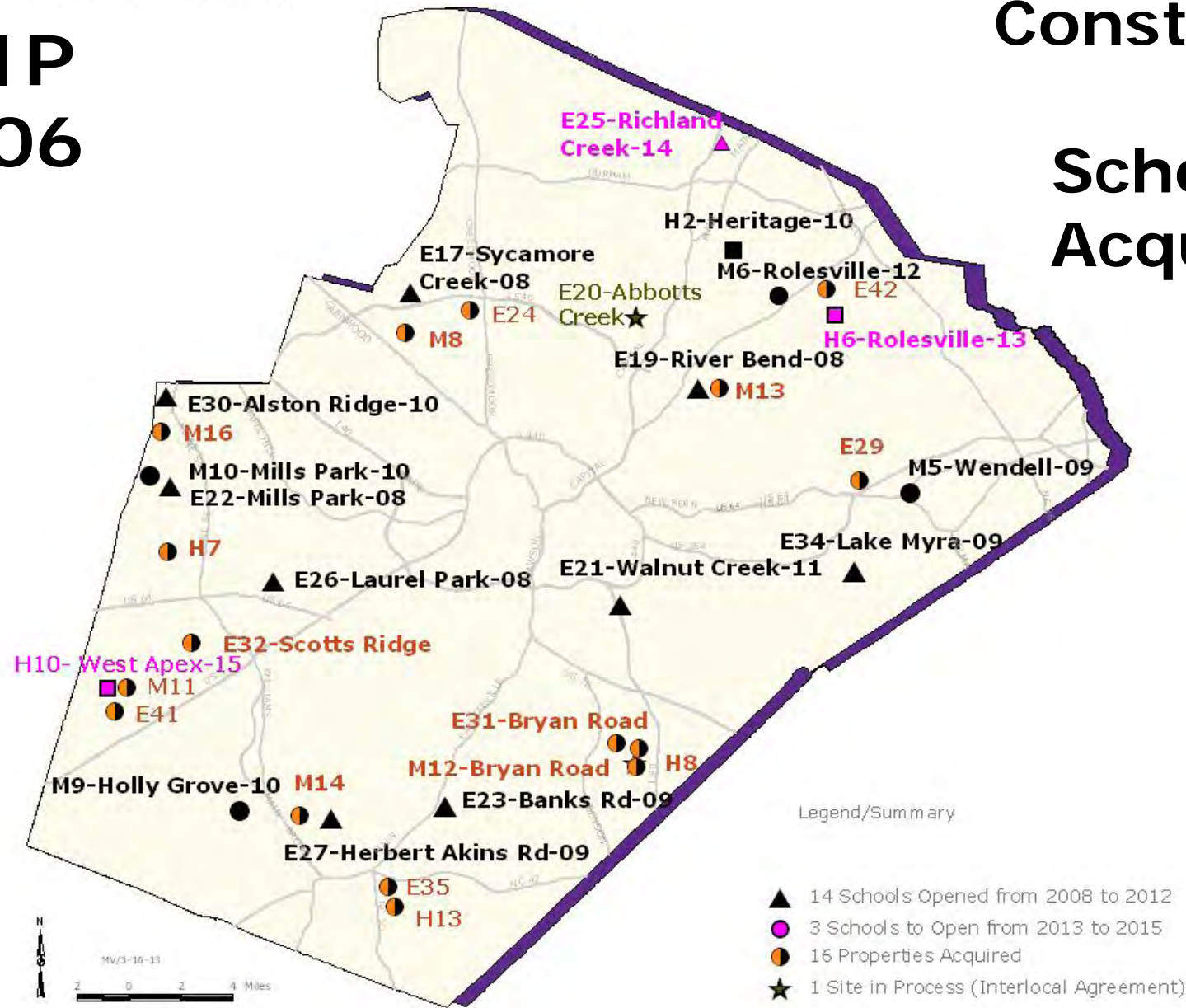

SUMMARIES BY LEVEL – Race/Ethnicity and Gender, 2012-13

WCPSS is reporting race-ethnicity data following the Census Bureau-driven changes and the US Department of Education new standards for data collection and reporting since 2010-11. A slight shift in WCPSS demographics is consistent with the overall WCPSS race-ethnicity trends. Enrollment of **White students (49.1%)**, **Black or African-American students (24.4%)** and **Two or More Races (4.2%)** is declining as a percentage of total students, while **Hispanic/Latino (15.4%)** and **Asian (6.5%)** student enrollment percentage is increasing as the state of North Carolina itself becomes more diverse.

In the current school year, approximately 7.5% of students are classified as LEP (Limited English Proficiency) and 3.6% required ESL (English as a Second Language) services. In addition, 50,432 of WCPSS students (33.7%) qualify for F&R (Free or Reduced-Price Lunch Program), with the majority of those being in elementary schools.

The academy is a smaller learning community that focuses on a career theme and is integrated into the students' studies including their core curriculum courses.

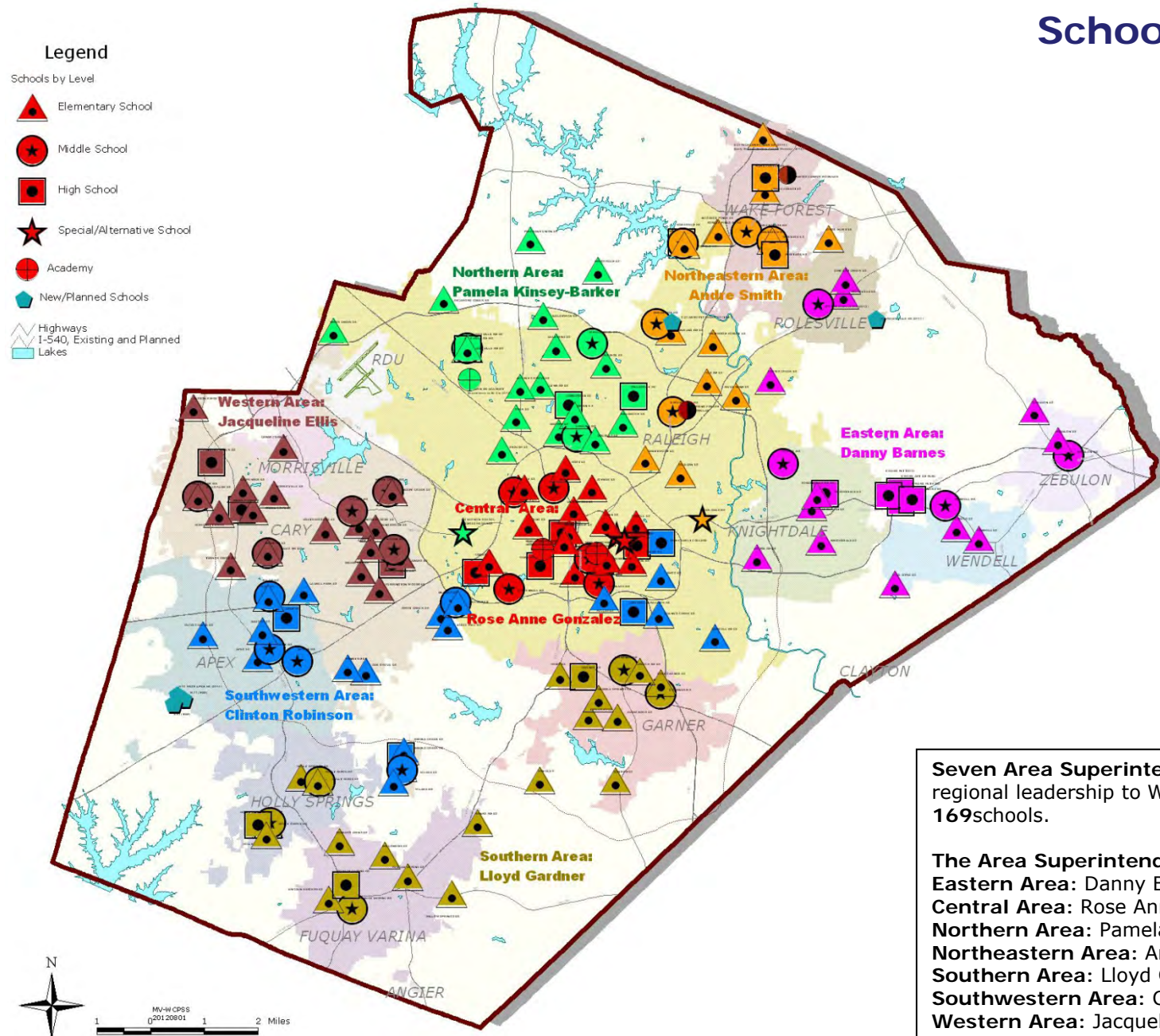

The 2012-13 annual increase was 2,821 students with 1.92 percent student growth. Four new schools opened in 2012-13, bringing the total number of WCPSS schools to 169. There are 104 elementary, 33 middle, 25 high, 4 special/optional schools, 1 academy (K-8), and 2 leadership academies (6-12).

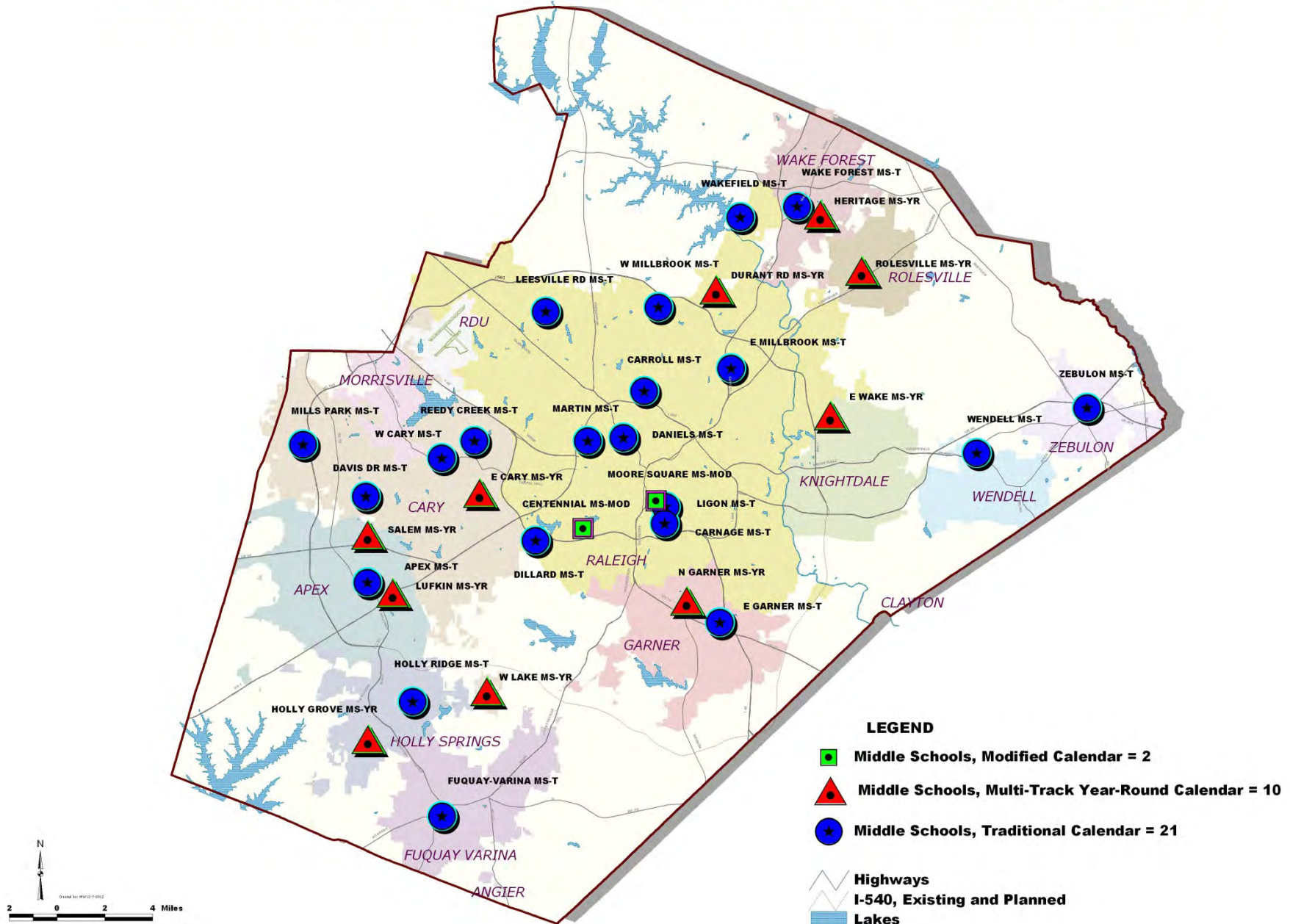

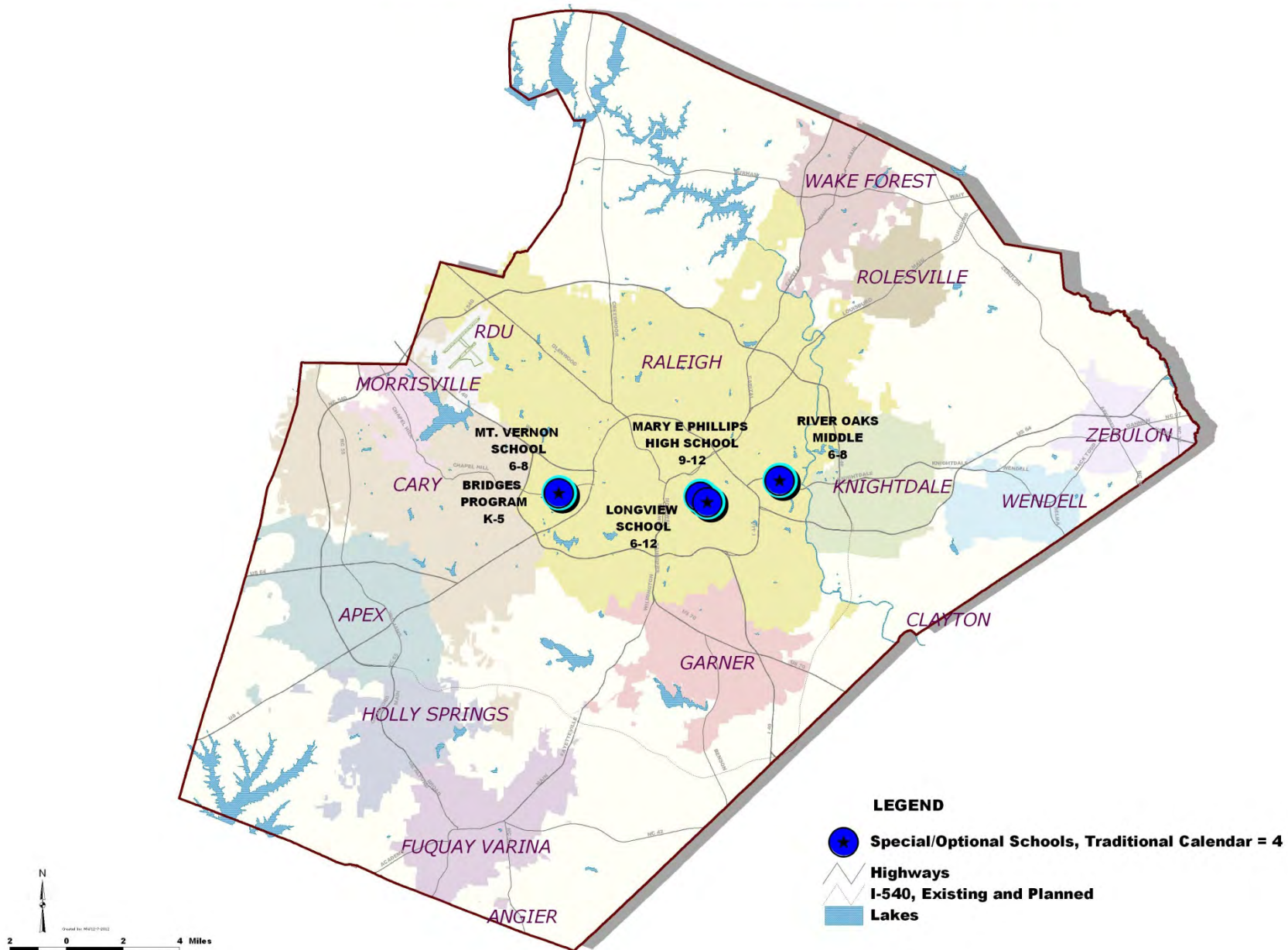

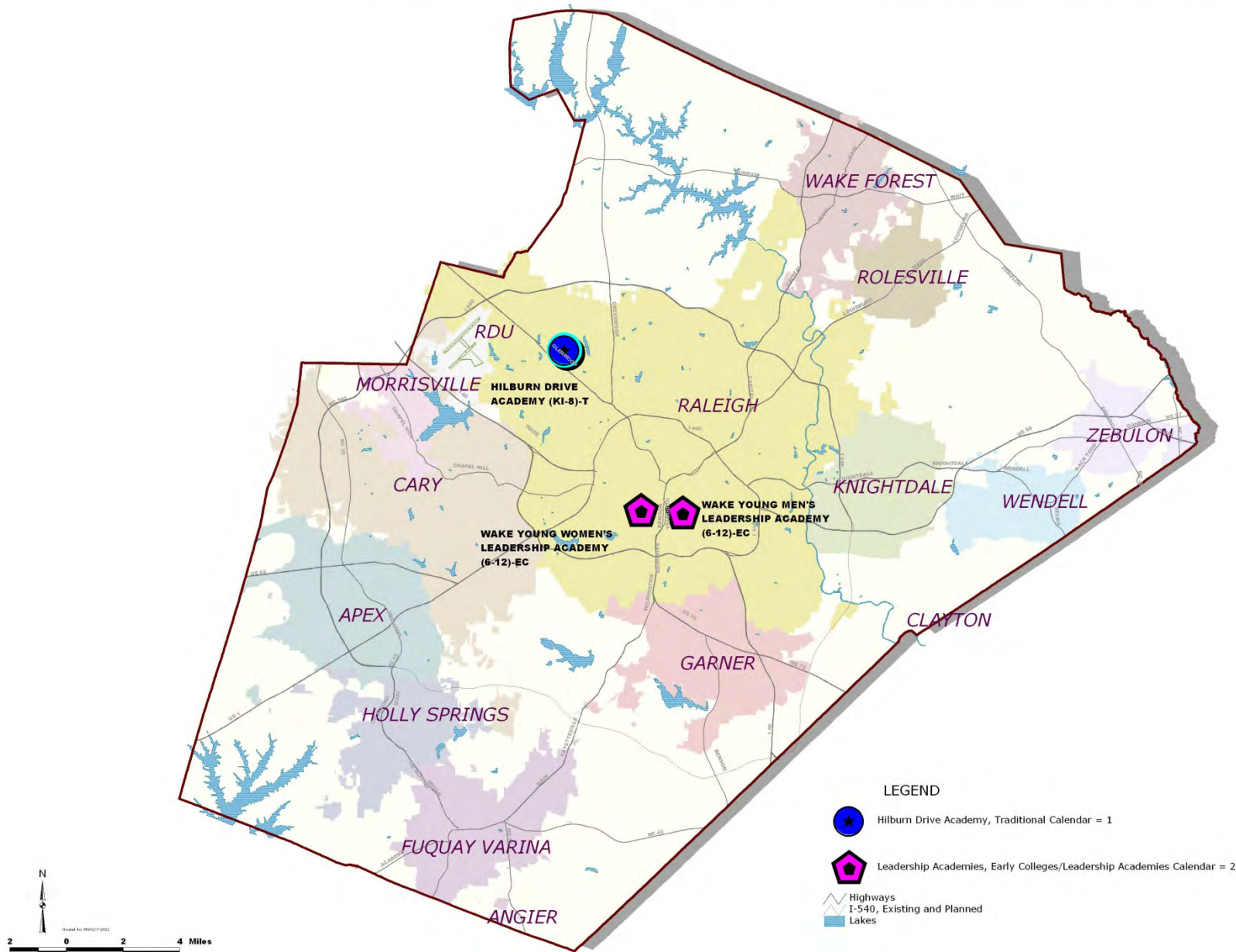

WCPSS has **104 elementary** schools, **33 middle** schools, **25 high** schools and **4 special/optional** schools, **1 academy (K-8)**, and **2 leadership academies (6-12)**, for a total of **169** schools.

149,508 students are enrolled in **169** schools. The annual school **campus capacity** is **157,587** seats (including **1,106 temporary classrooms**), resulting in an overall **crowding** of **92.7 percent**.

Of the 169 schools:

- 50 schools operate on a year-round calendar (40 elementary schools and 10 middle schools). Please note that five Y-R elementary schools switched to a single track calendar.
- 5 schools operate on a modified calendar (2 elementary schools, 2 middle schools and 1 high school)
- 4 schools operate on a calendar matching the community college calendar (Wake Early College of Health and Sciences High School, and NC State STEM Early College, Wake Young Women's Leadership Academy, and Wake Young Men's Leadership Academy).

Student Enrollment Projections For WCPSS

Student enrollment projections for the 2013-2014 school year reflect the comparatively slow enrollment growth experienced in the past year. The building program projections continue to reflect the impact of a moderately recovering economy and lower birth rates, with increased rates of growth within the next ten years. Enrollment growth is still projected, but the growth is moderate. The enrollment projection for next school year is 152,684 students, which is growth of 3,176 students (2.1%) over the 2012-2013 20th-day student enrollment.

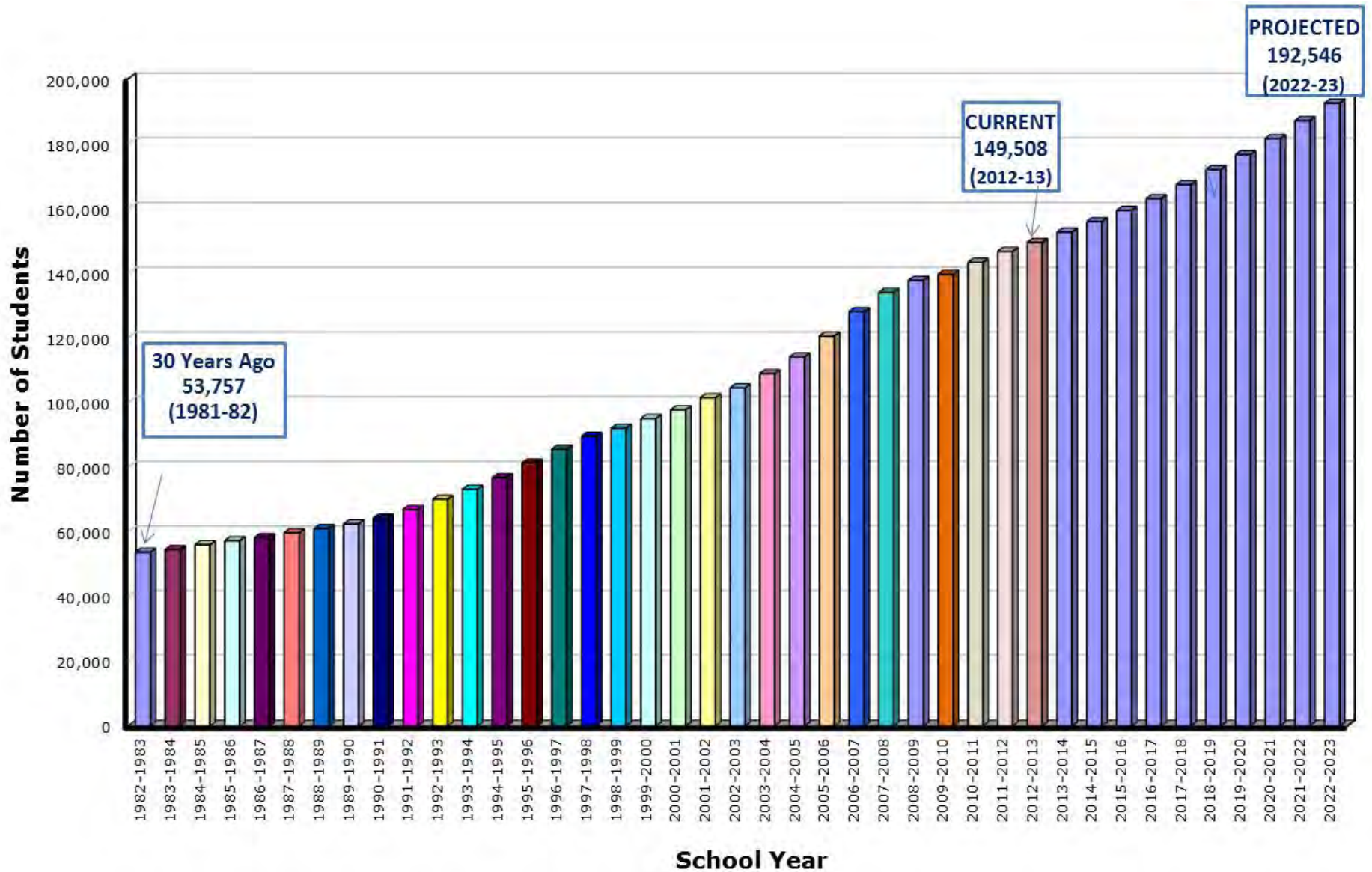

Forecasted Student Population Distribution by Municipal Urban Service Areas

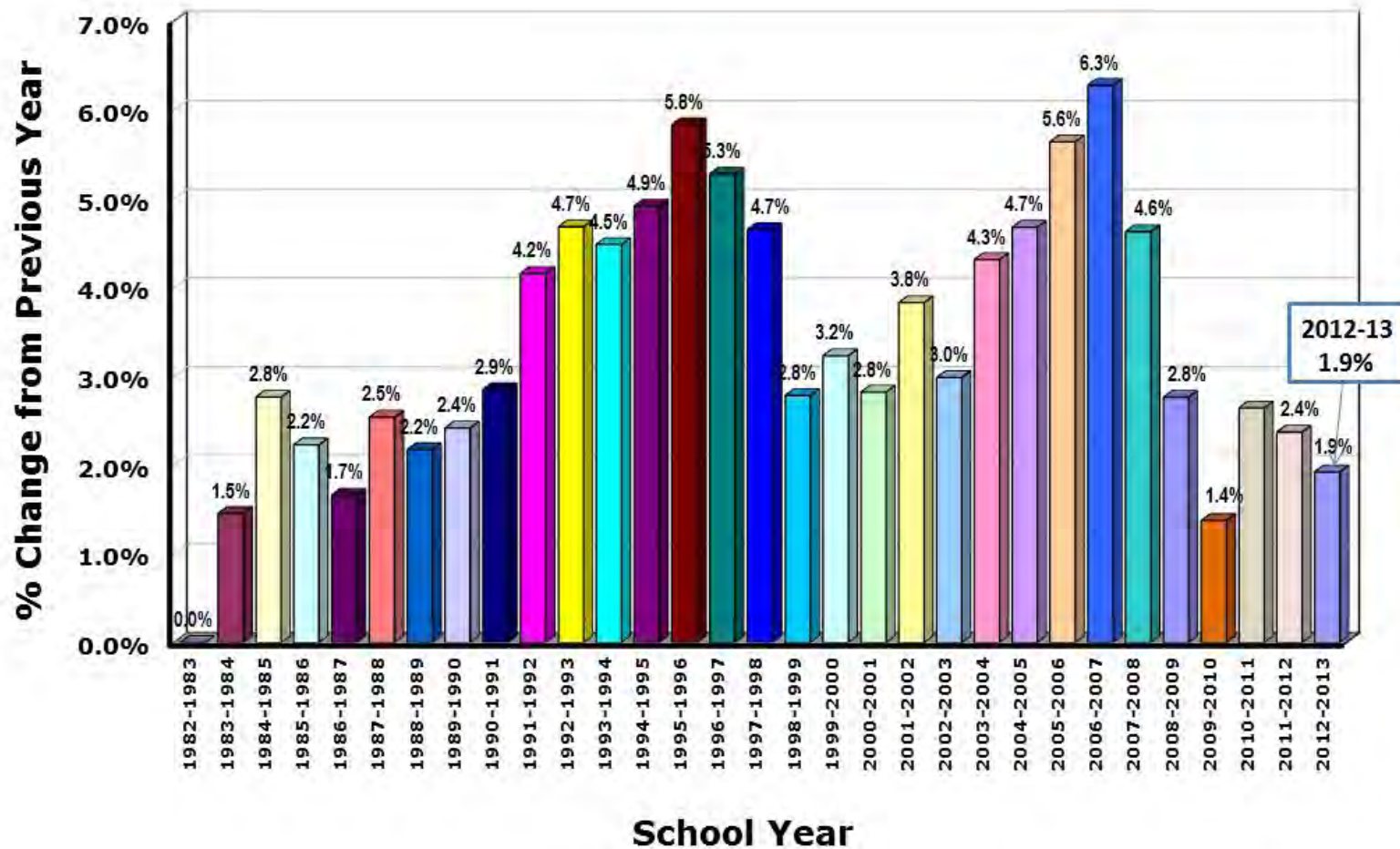

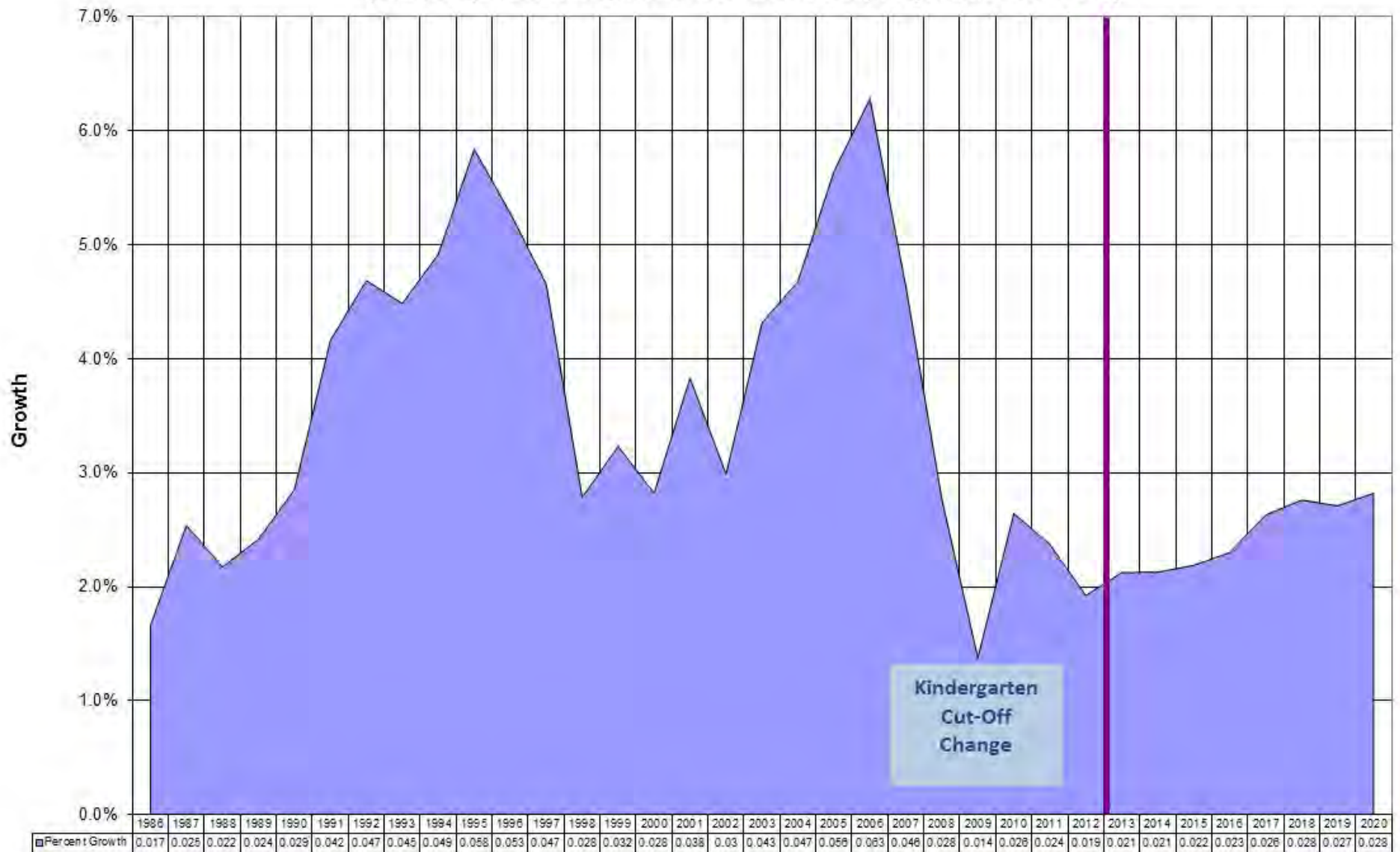


WCPSS Enrollment Change

PROJECTED ENROLLMENT GROWTH FOR BUILDING PROGRAM: 2013 - 2020



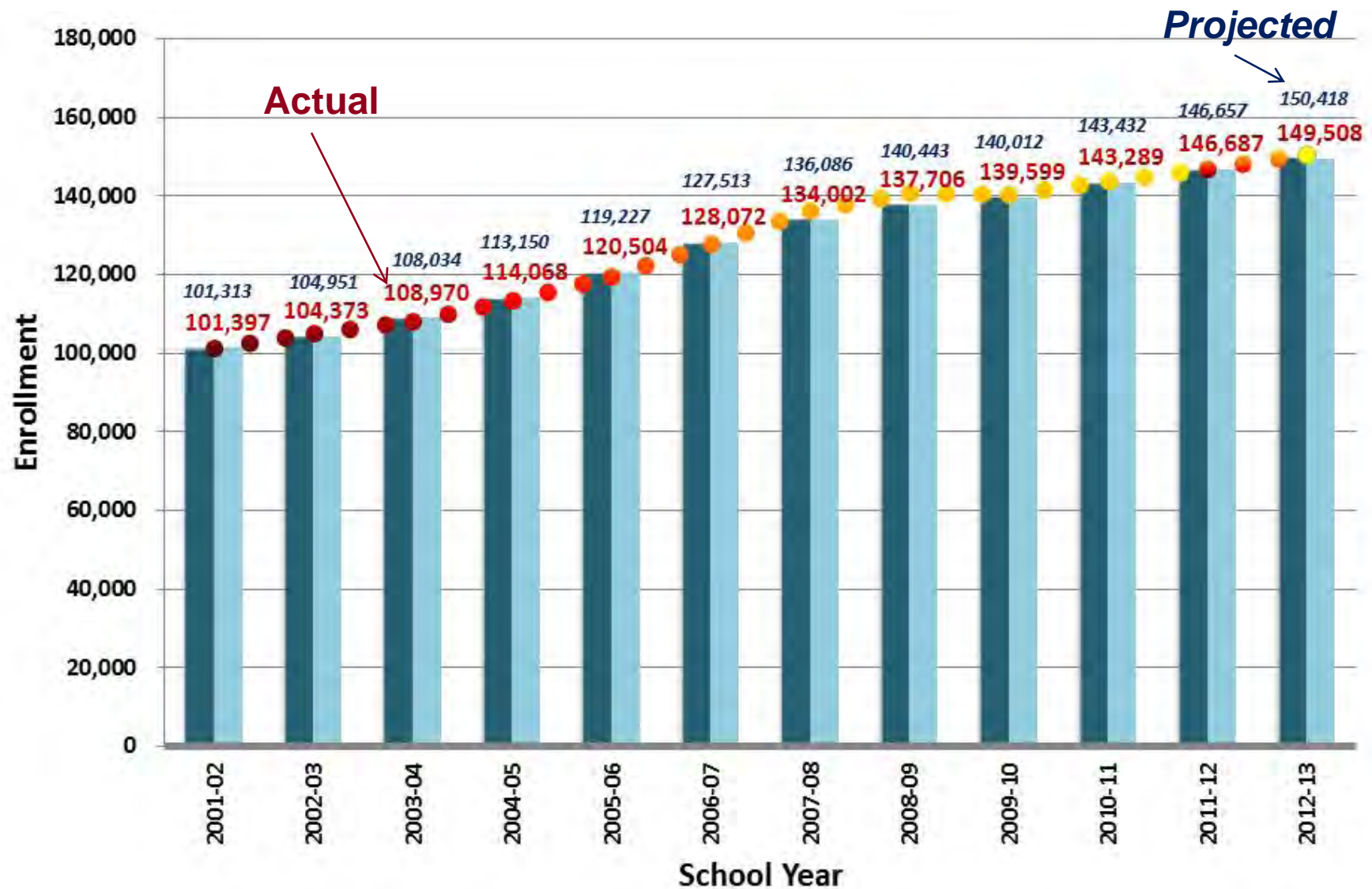

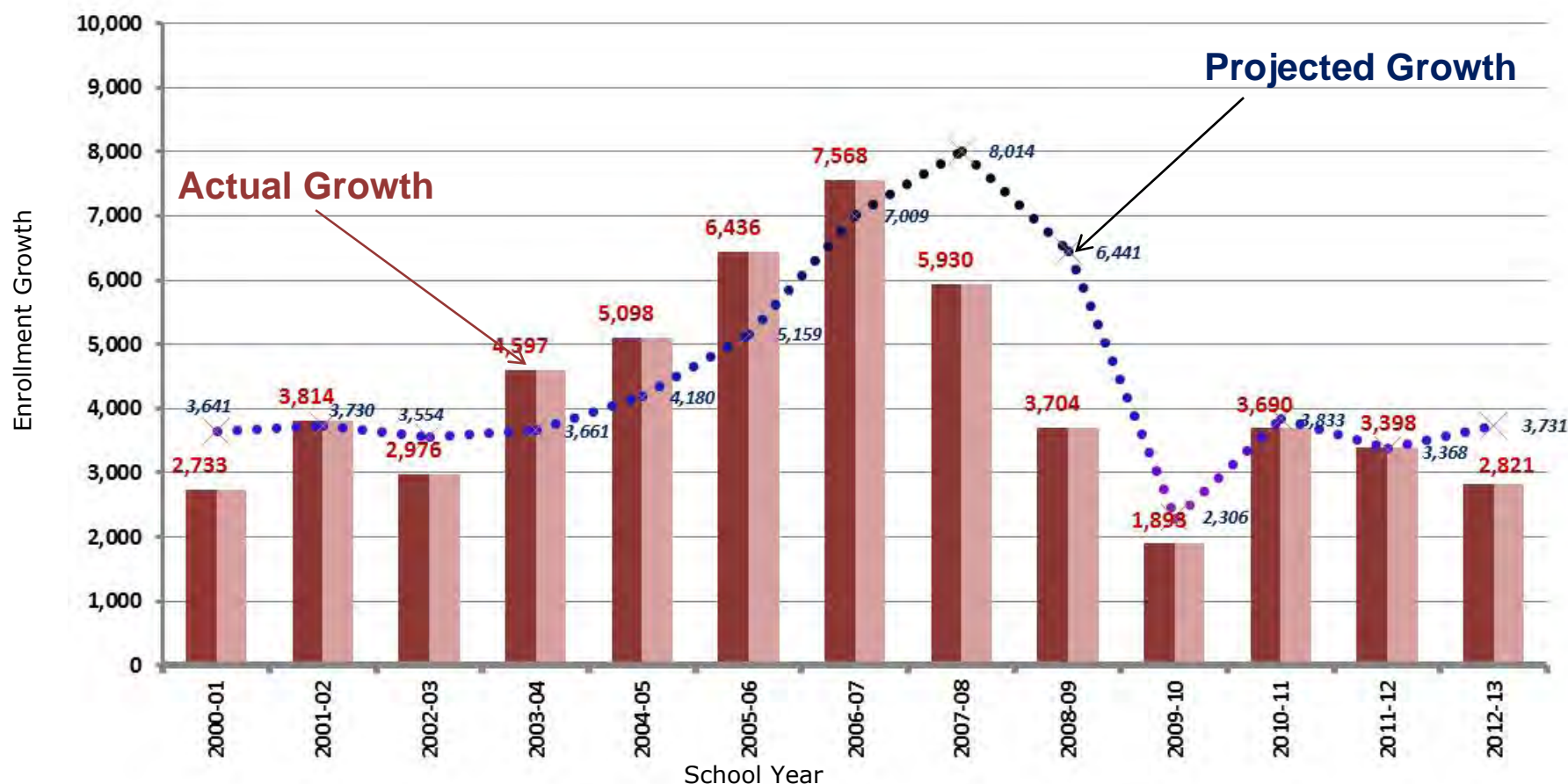

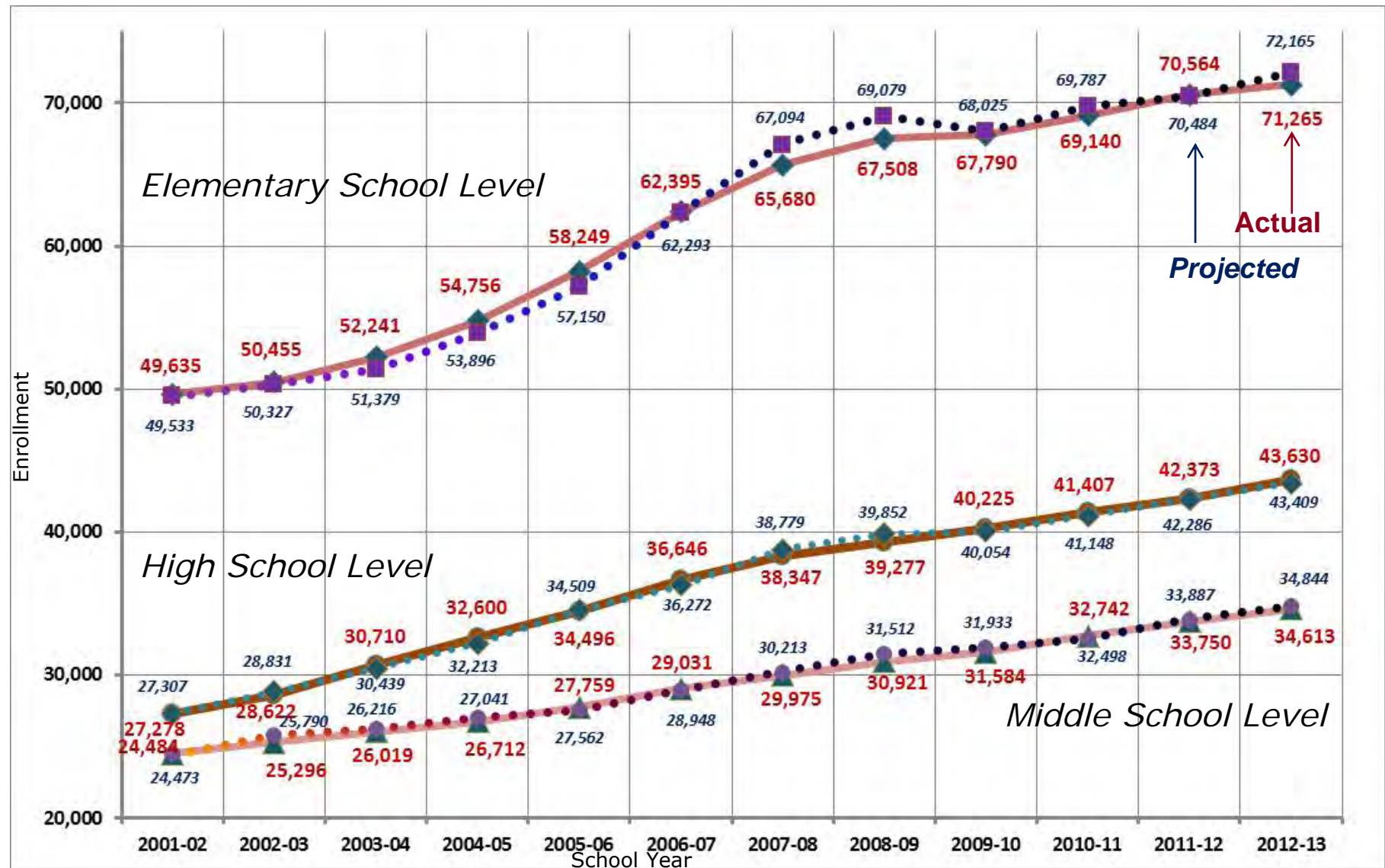

Actual and **Projected**, from 2001/02 to 2012/13



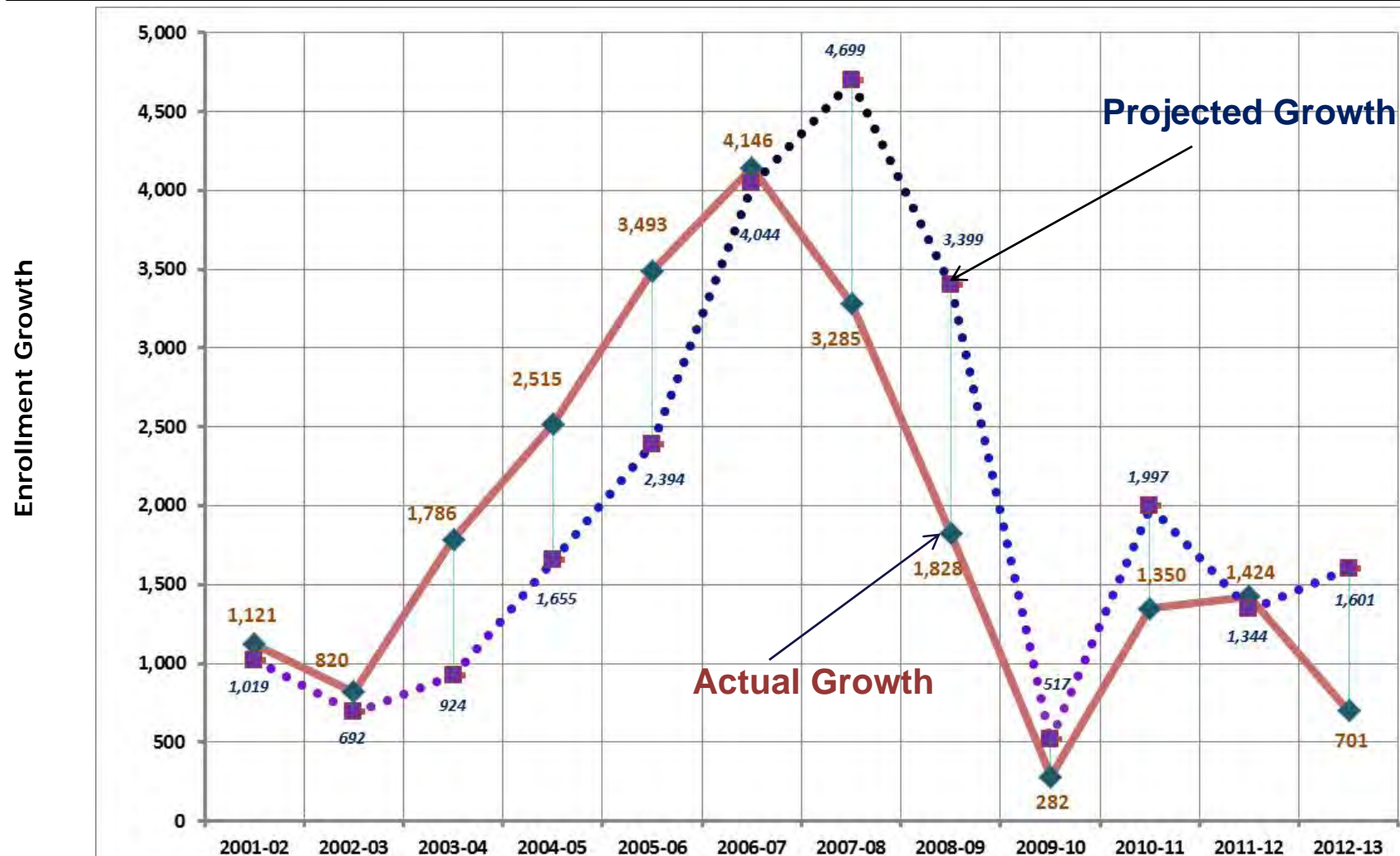

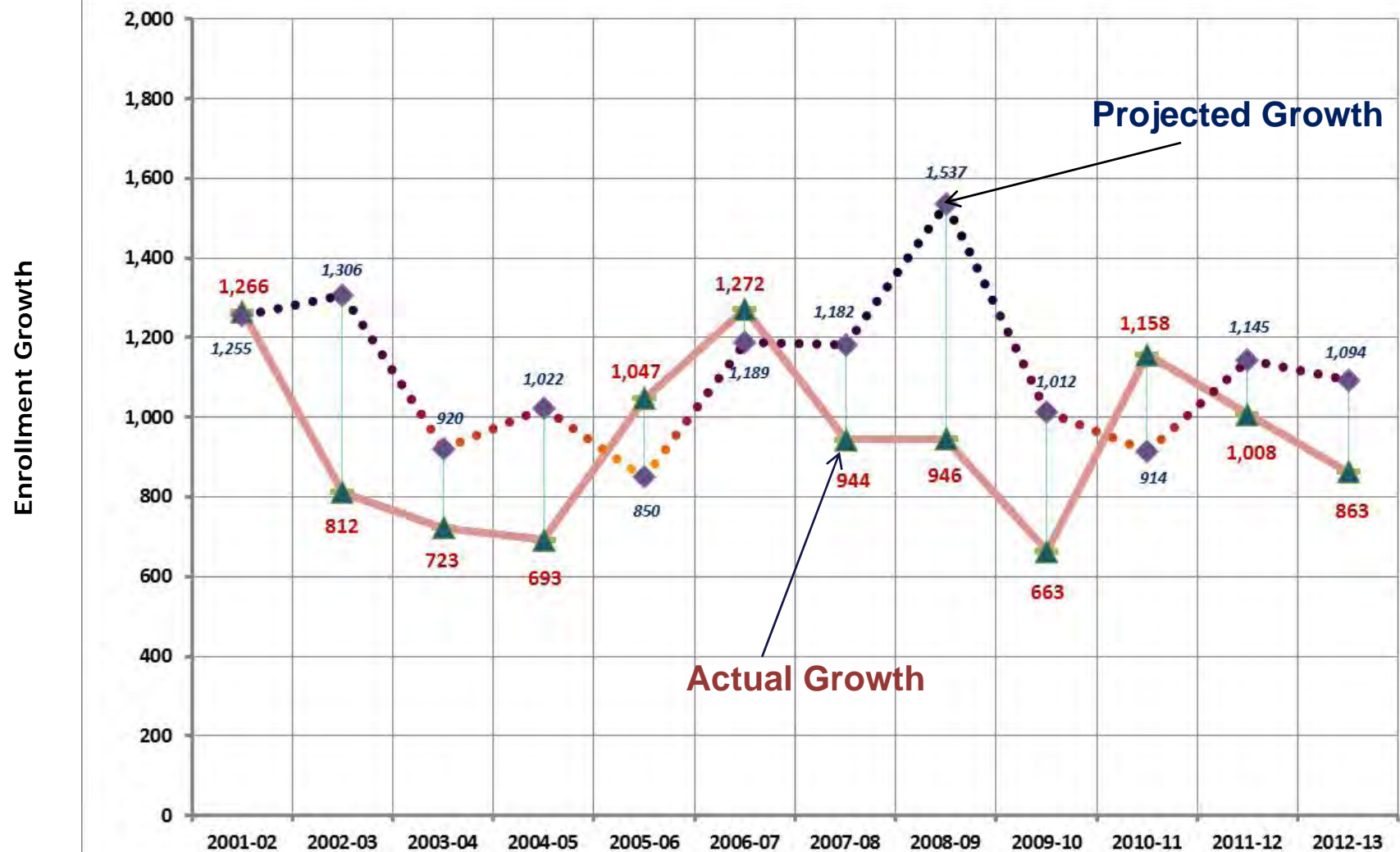

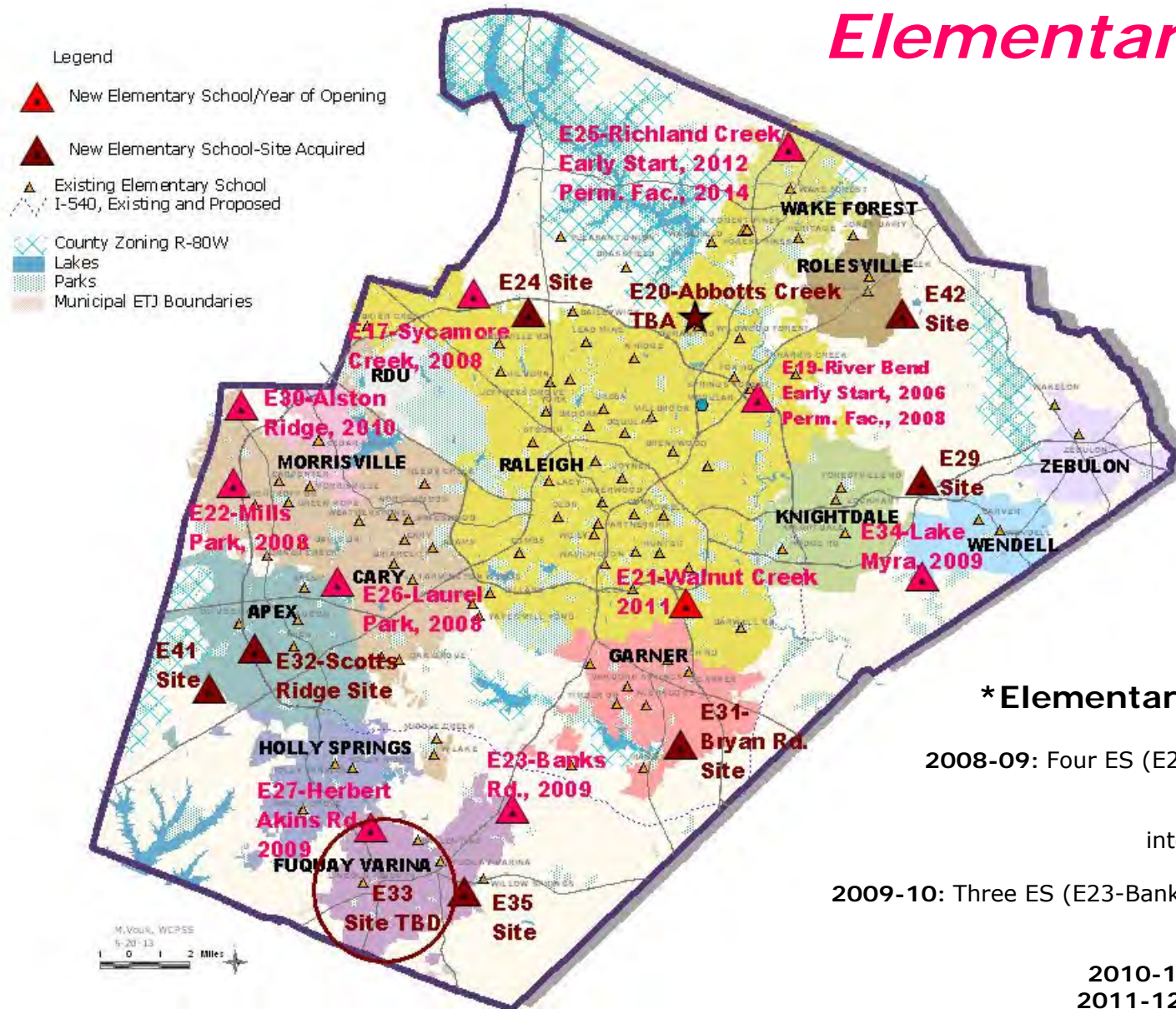

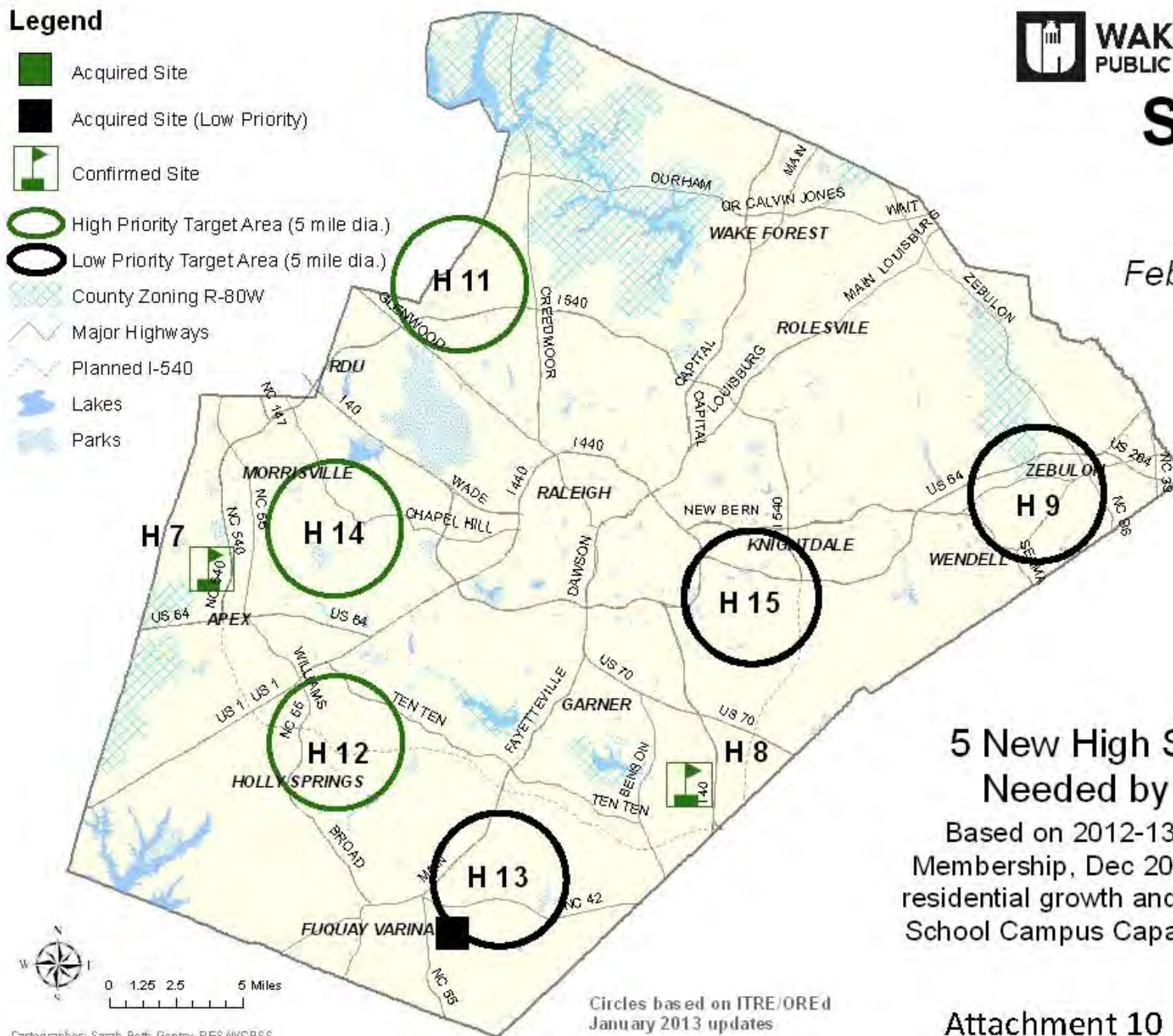

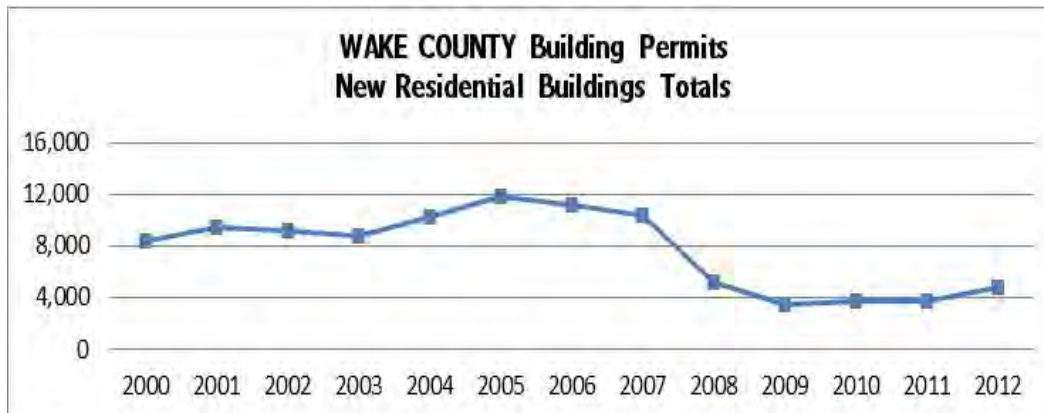

A measure of growth WCPSS tracks is the number of new residential building permits (a permit is one housing unit). In 2012, there were 4,822 building permits issued in the county according to the Wake County Revenue data; an increase of 1,119 permits, or 30 percent, compared to 2011.

Most of the permits were issued for Raleigh and Cary, about a 1,000. While Apex, and Holly Springs experienced double-digit growth (up to 400), Rolesville saw its permits tripled. On the other hand, Wendell and Zebulon issued only about ten permits.

Between 1998 and 2003, the number of permits issued countywide averaged about 9,000. The peak year was 2005, when 11,879 permits were issued. However, 2009 saw only 3,493 permits issued – the lowest number since early 90's. Since then, there has been an annual increase in number of permits indicating a steady building recovery.

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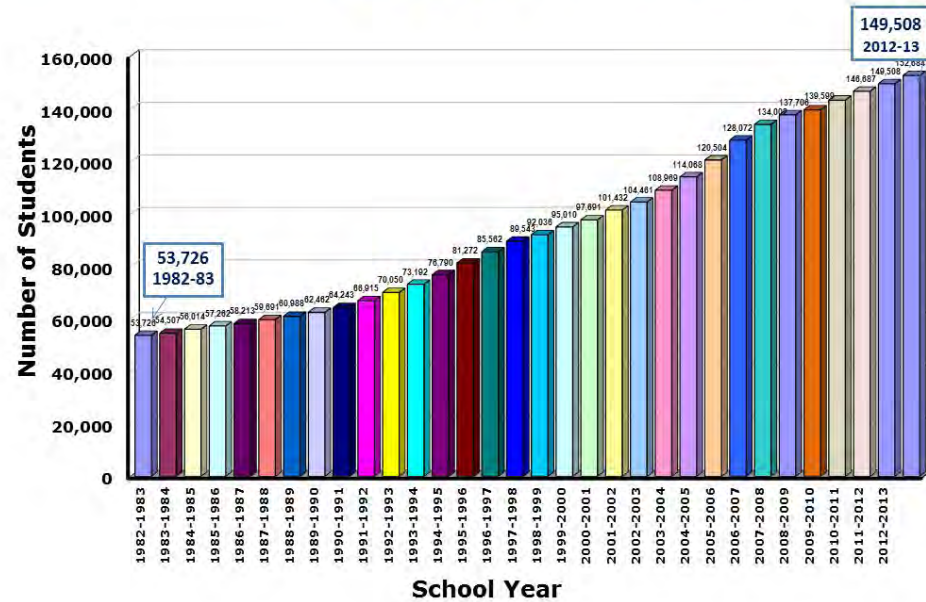

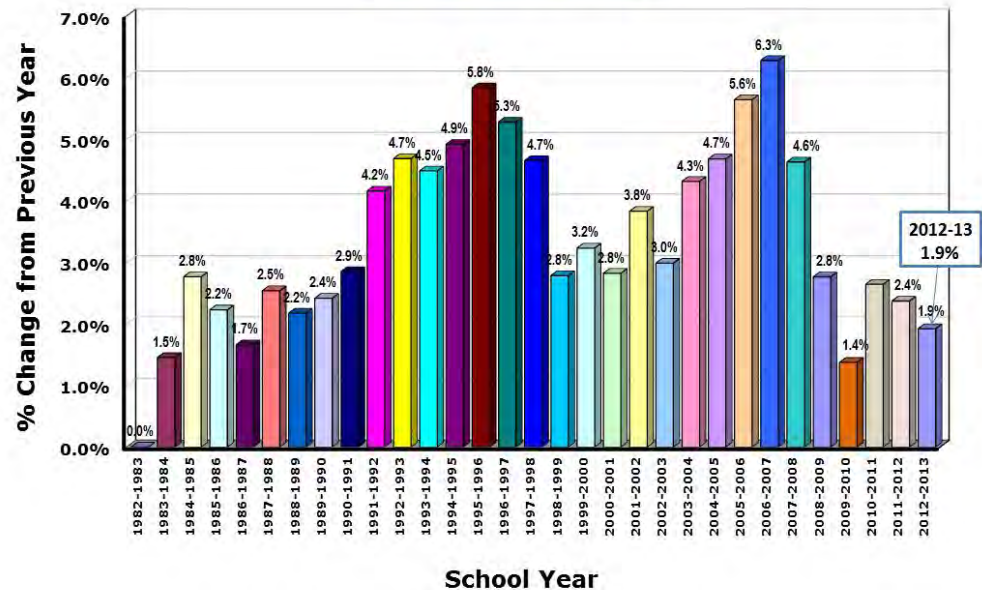

Percentage Year-to-Year Change in Total Enrollment



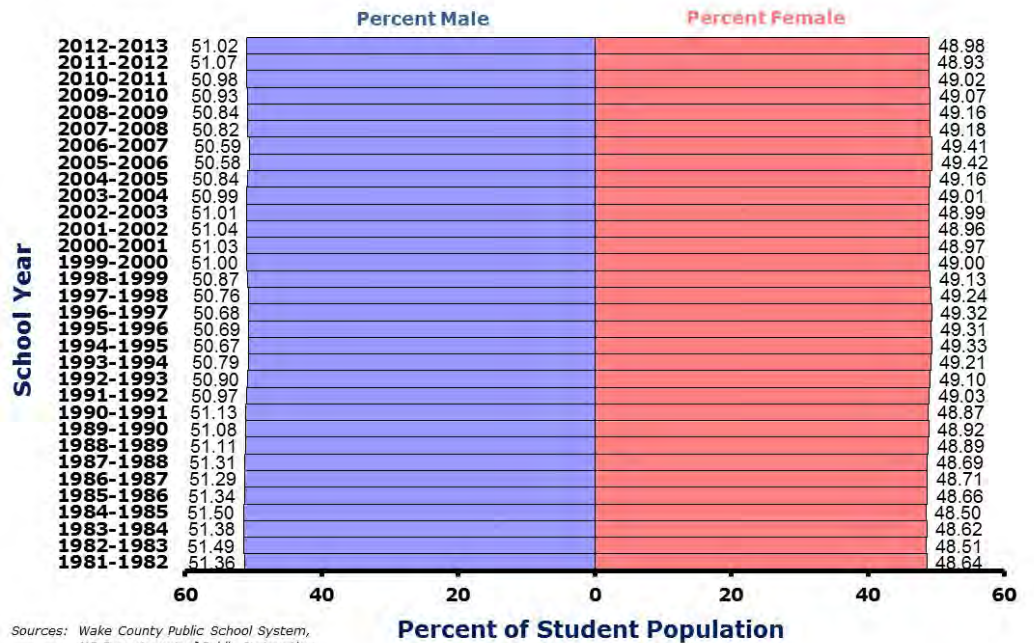
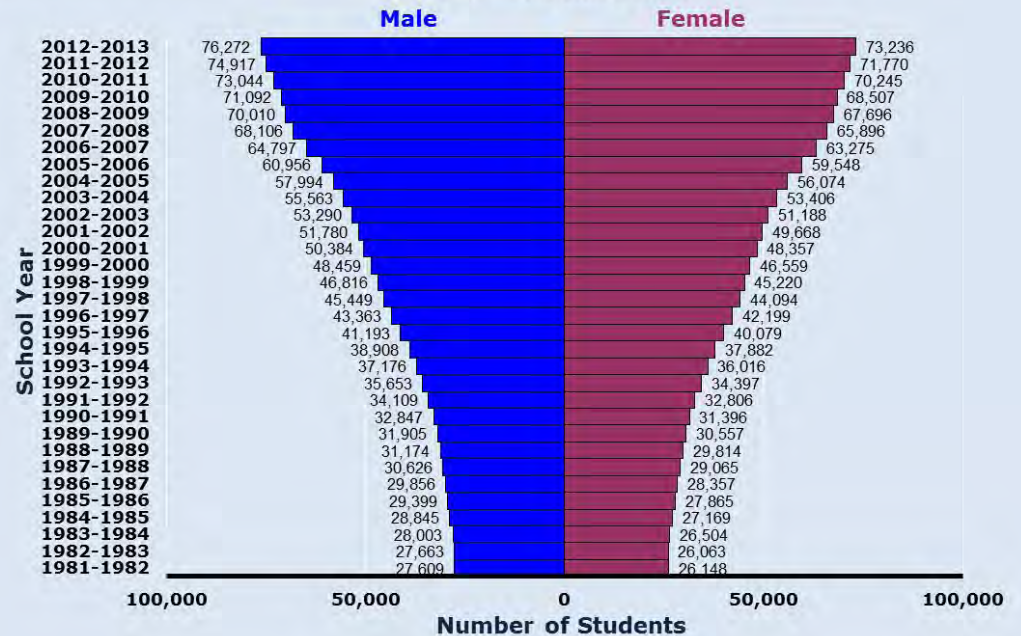

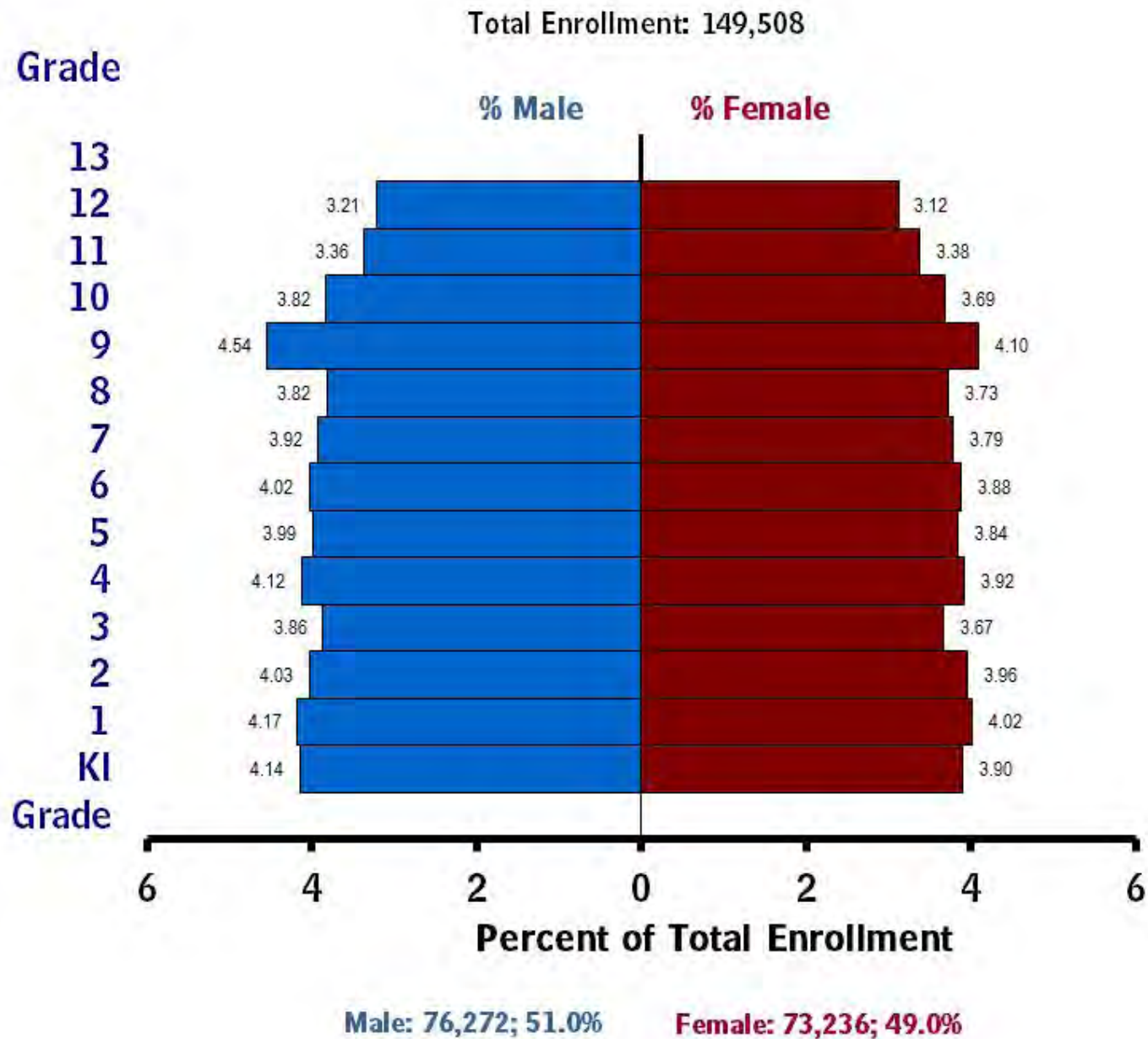
Population by Gender and School Year

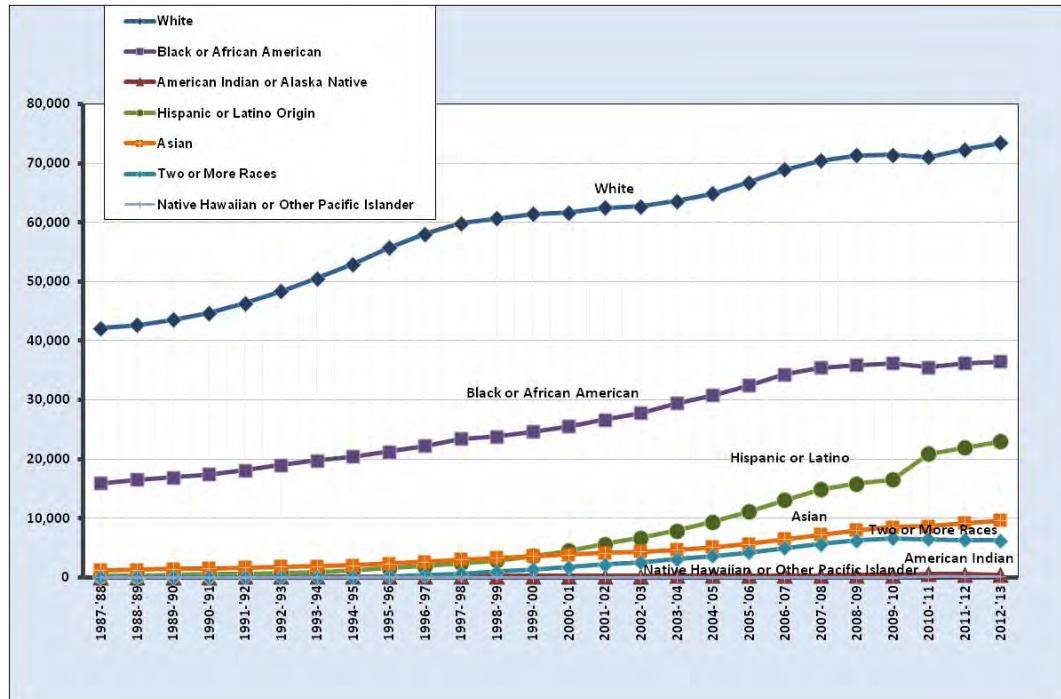

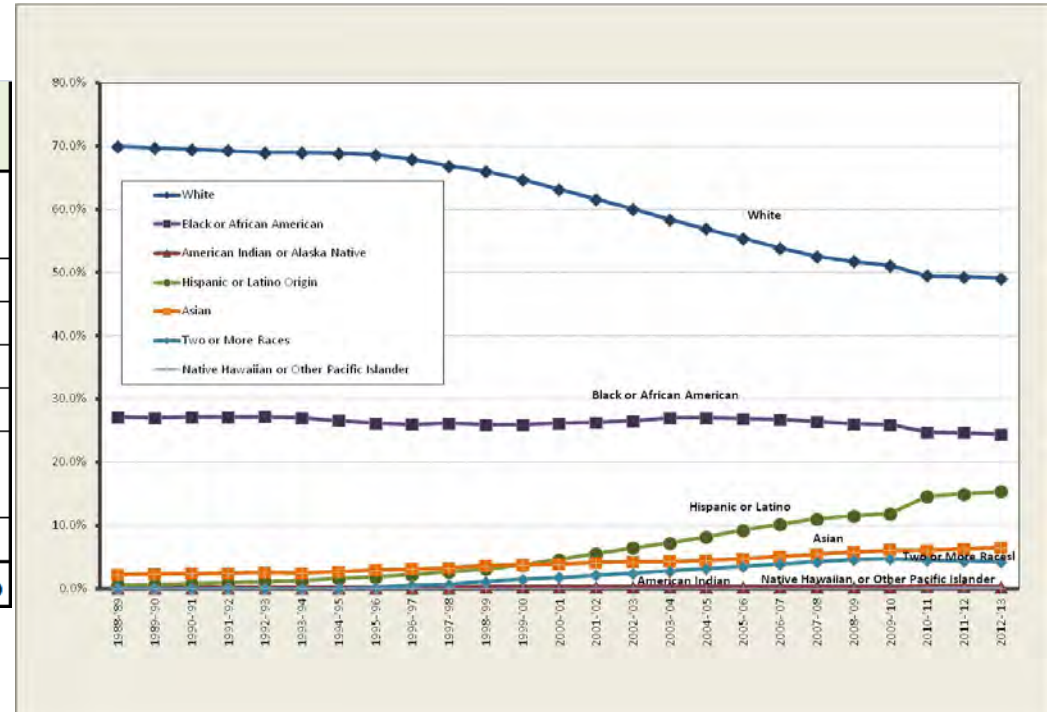

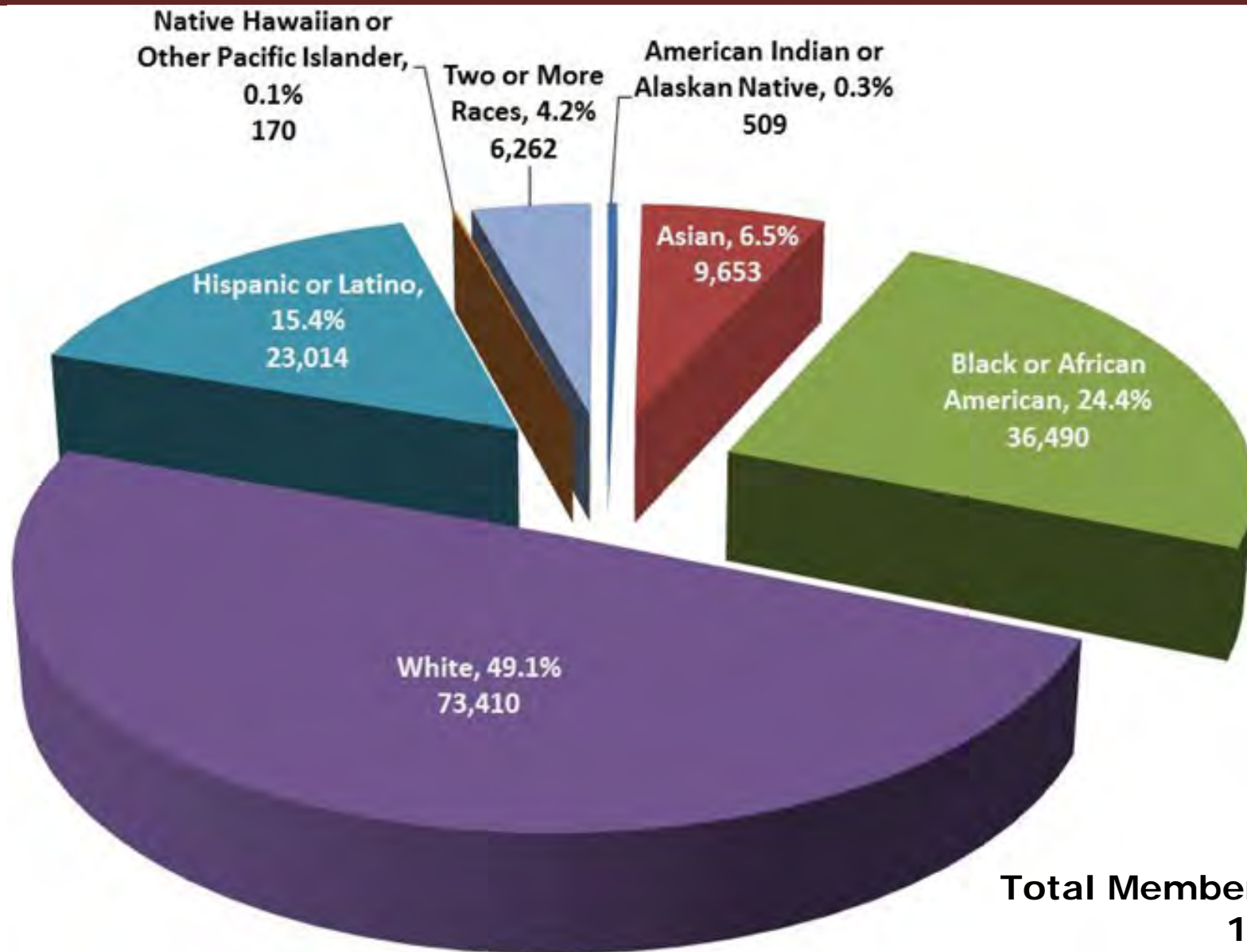

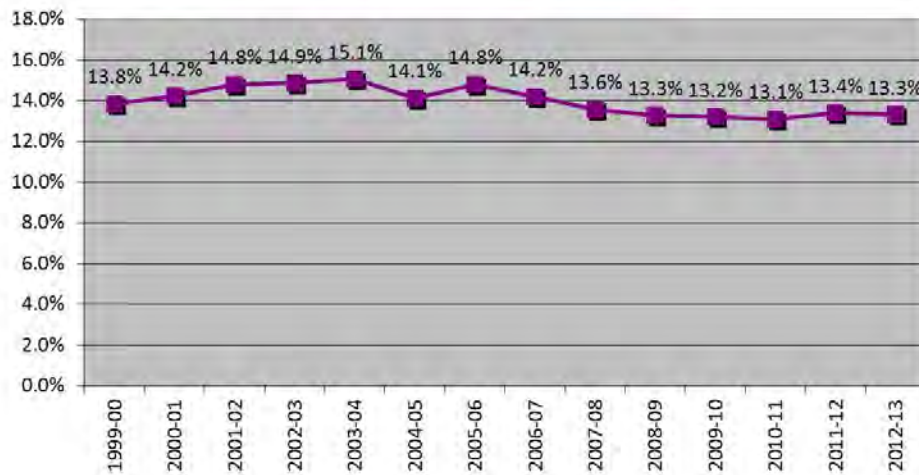

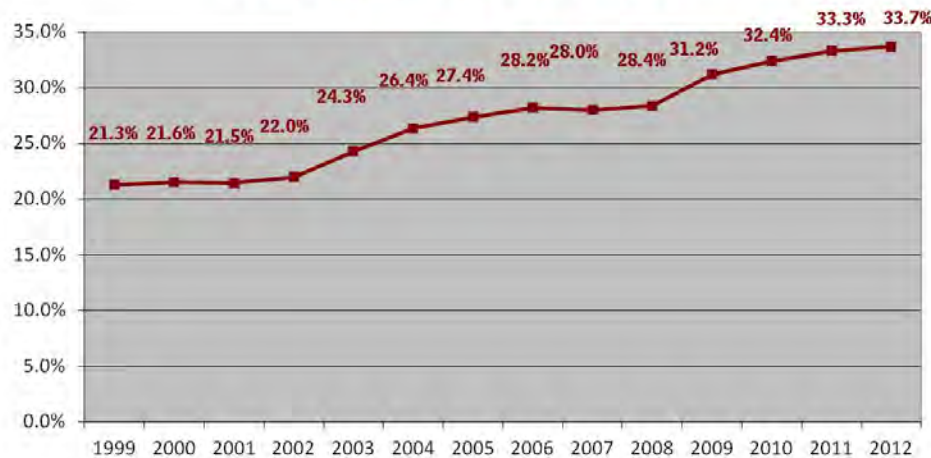

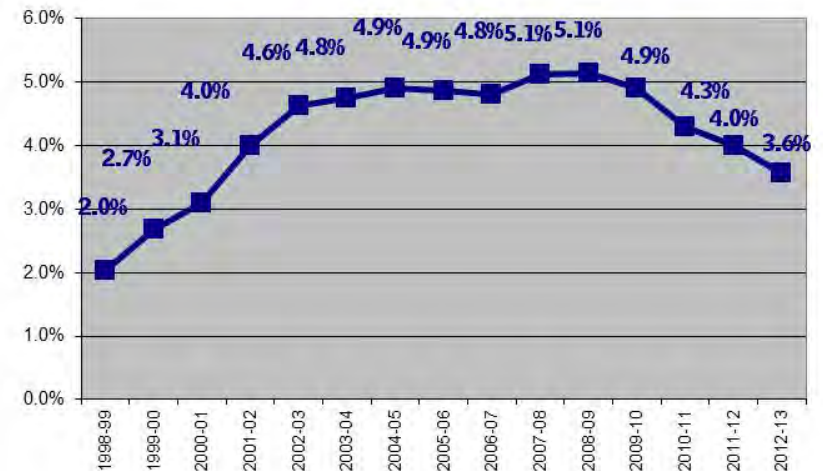

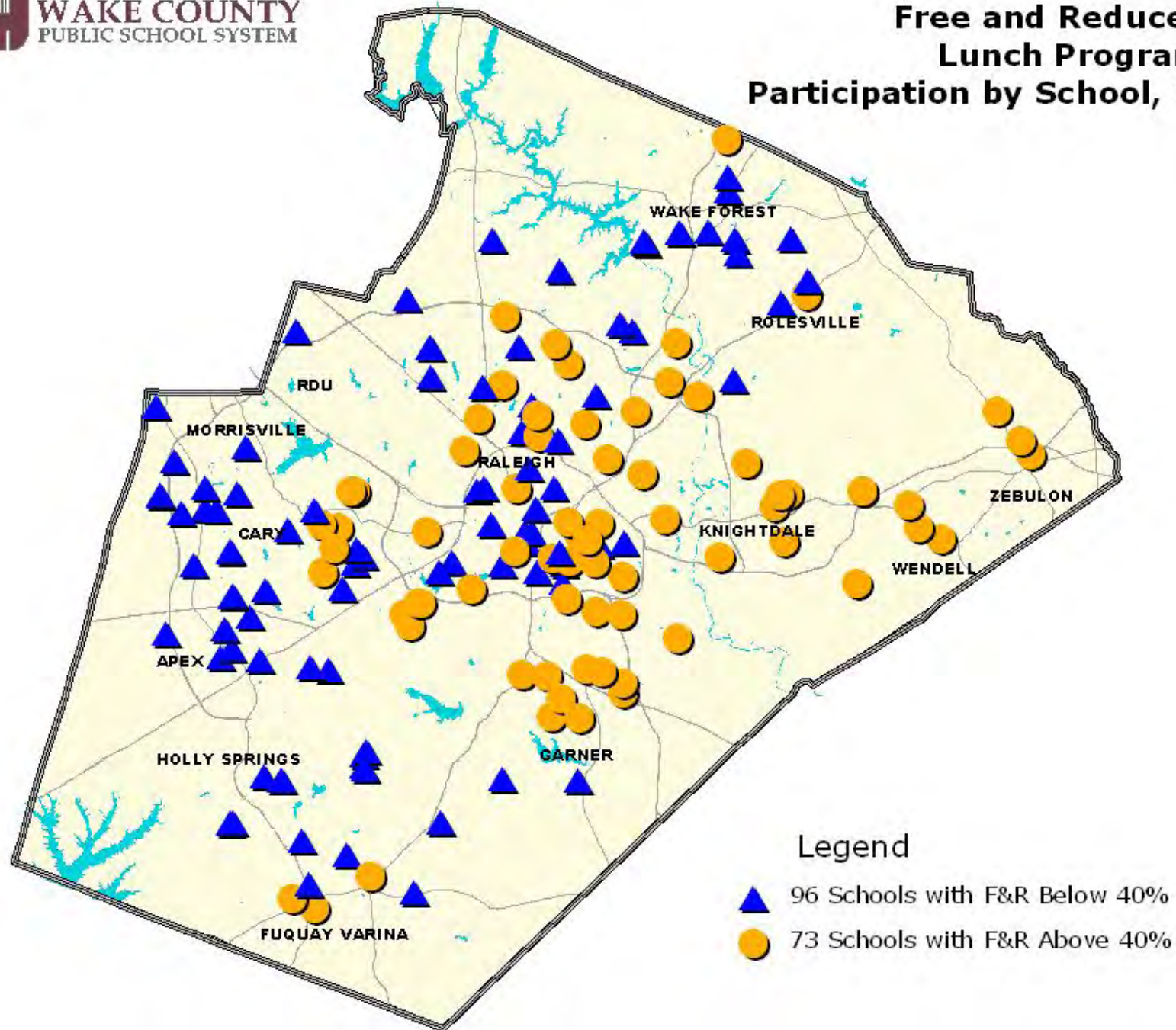

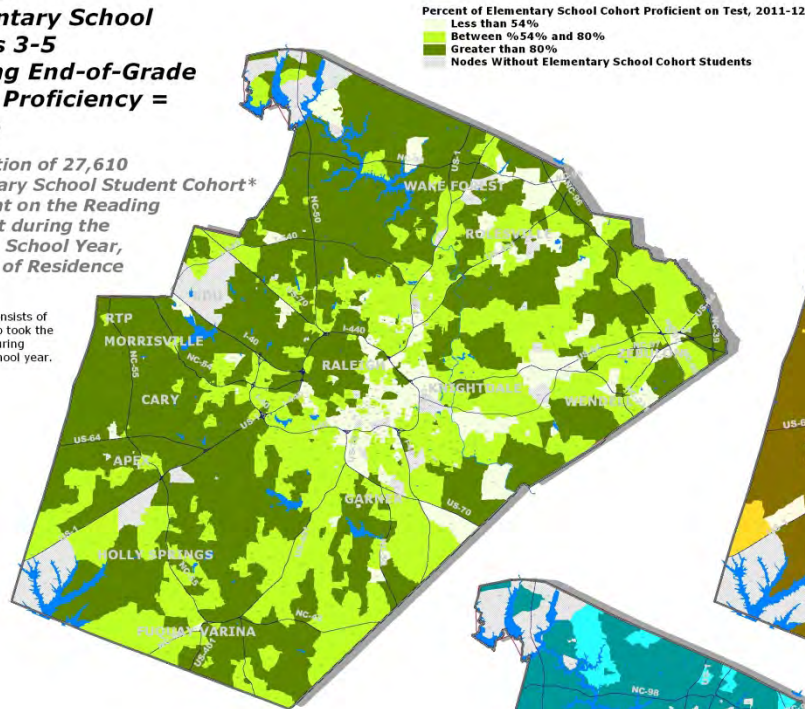

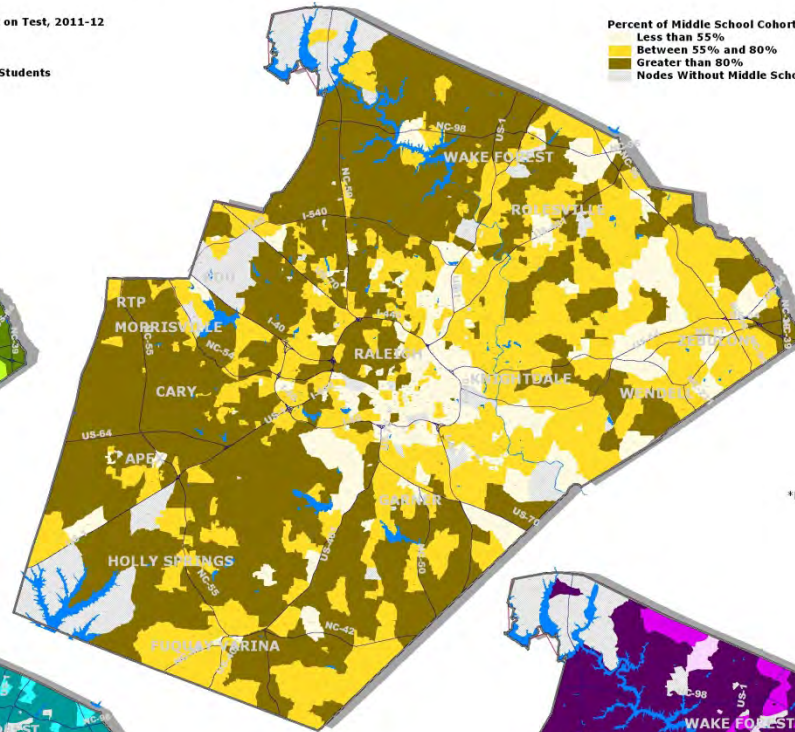
Percent of Middle School Cohort Proficient on Test, 2011-12

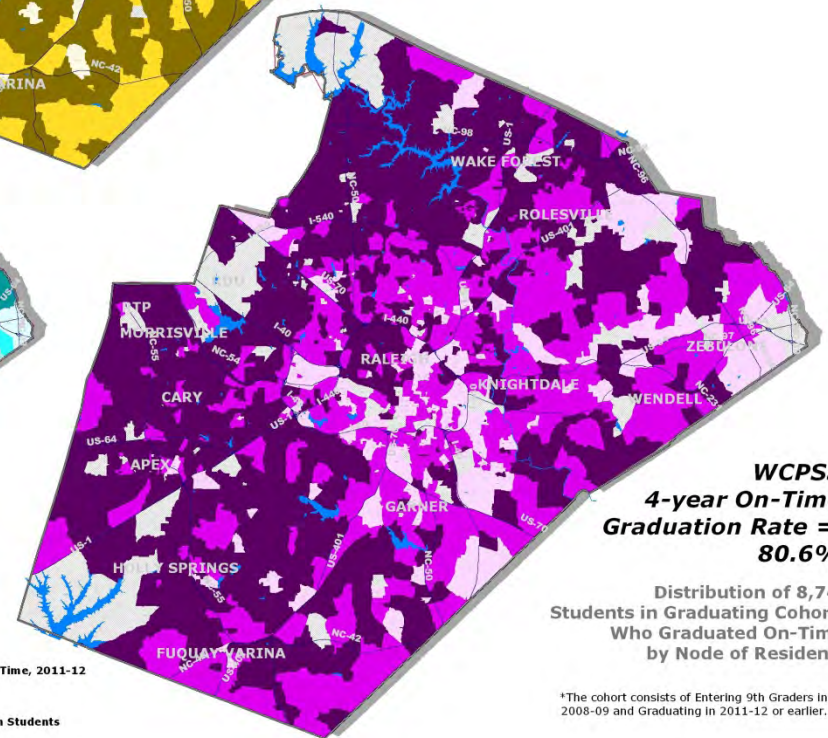

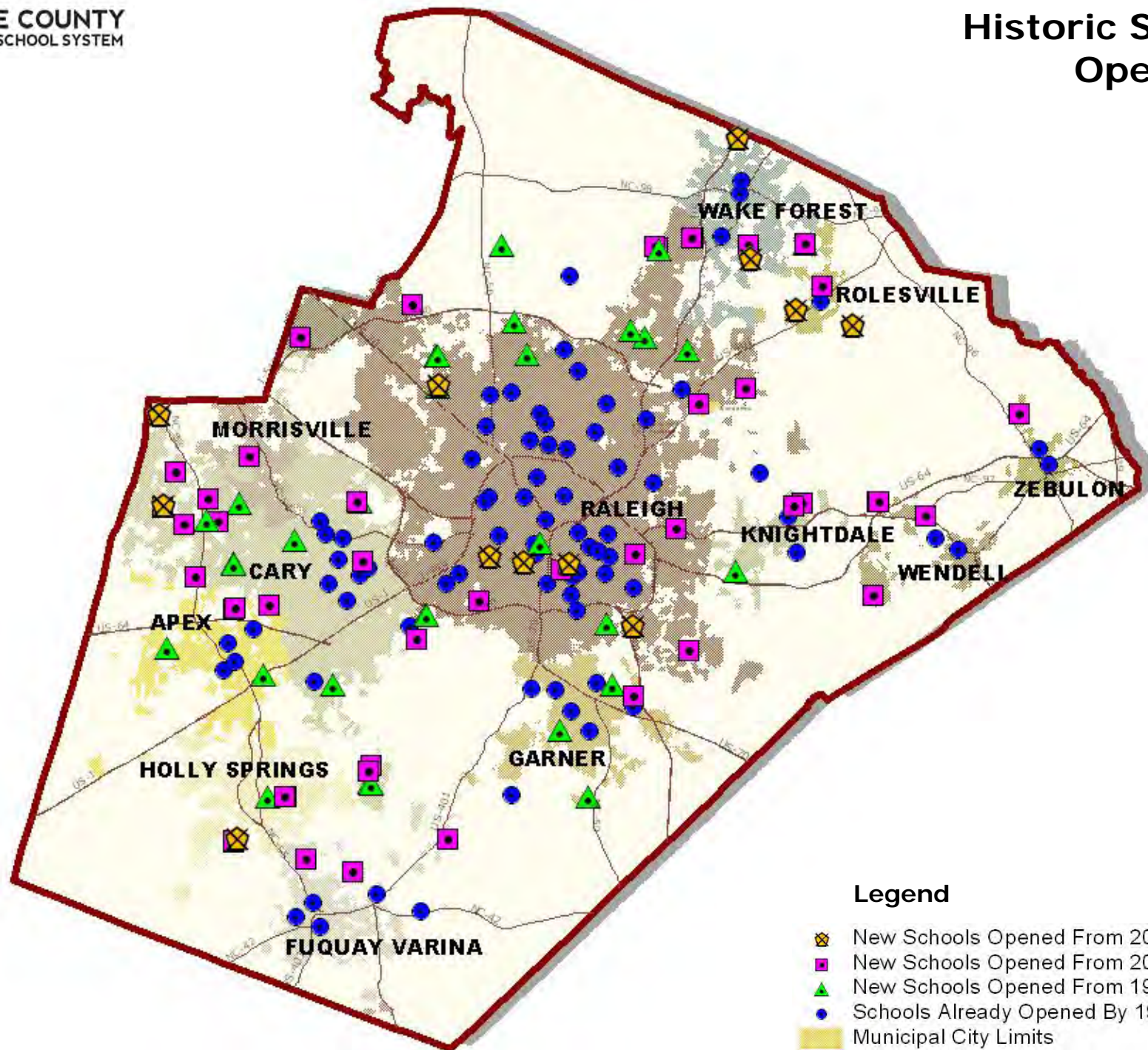

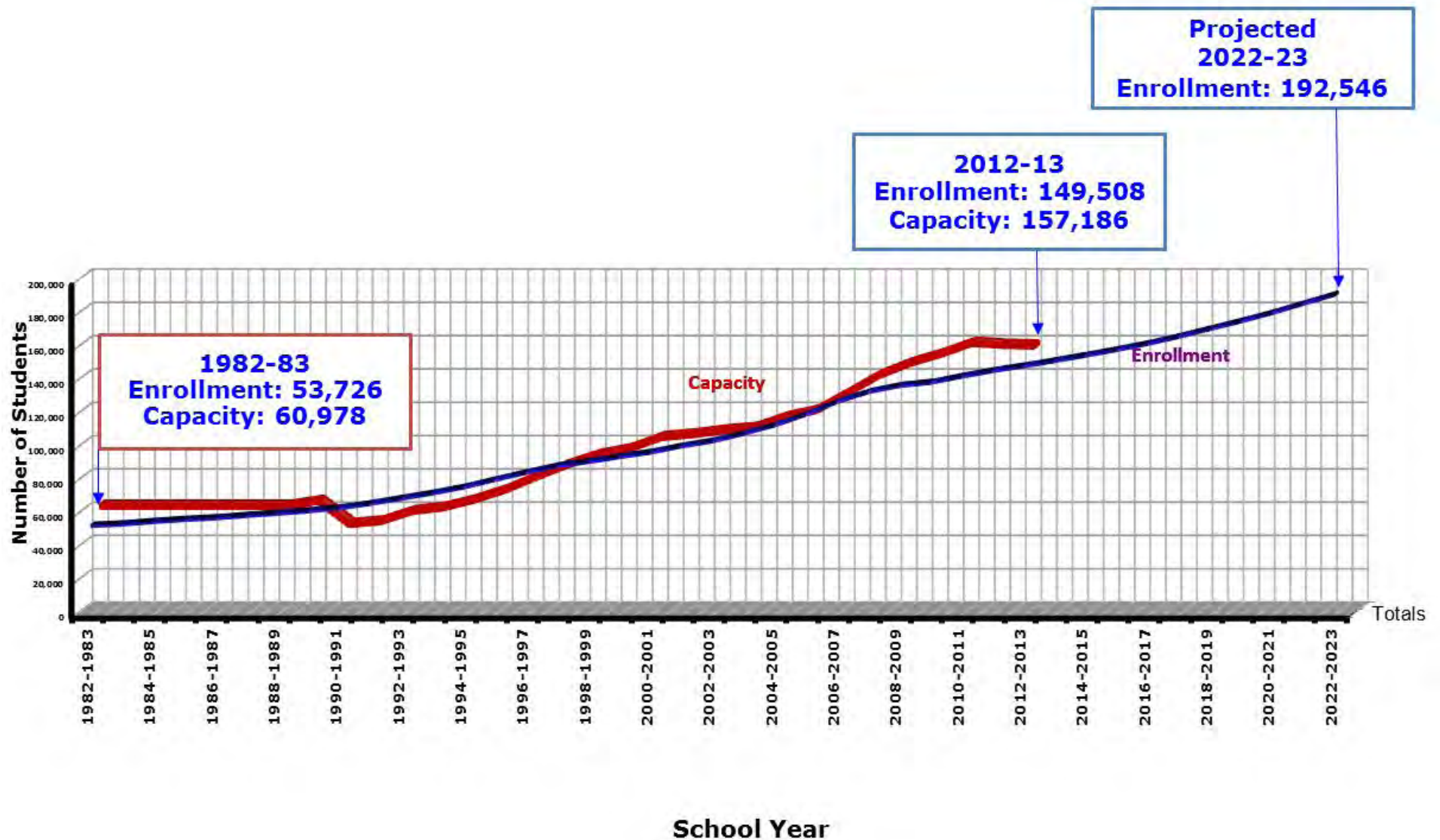

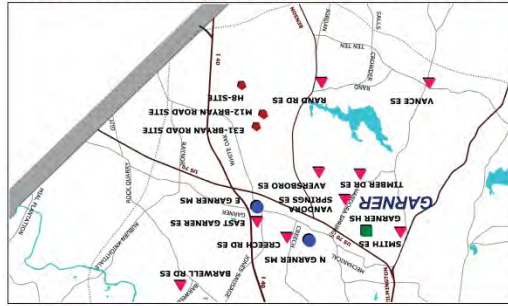

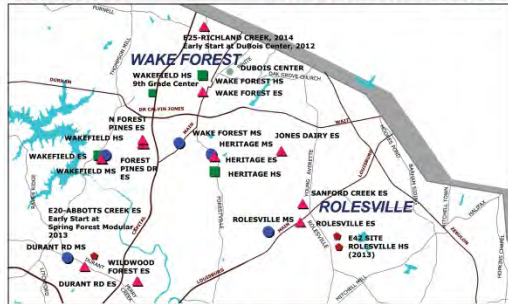


MAP INSET 4 FUQUAY-VARINA/HOLLY SPRINGS

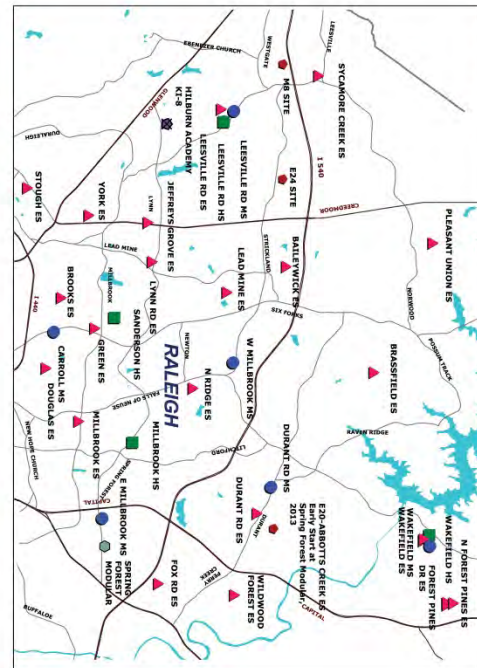
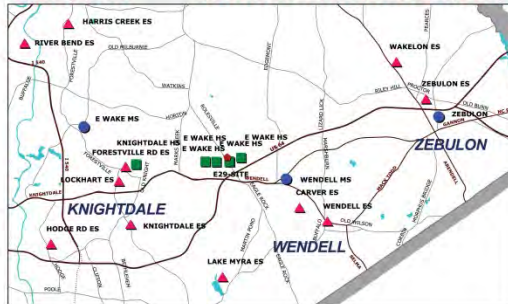


MAP INSET 3 GARNER

MAP INSET 5 WAKE FOREST/ROLESVILLE

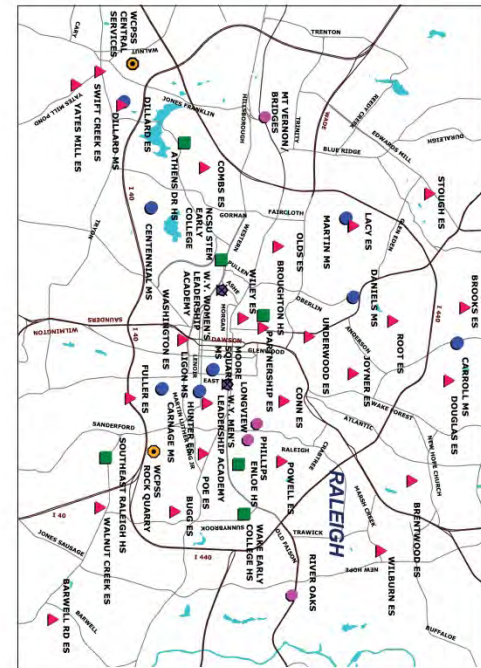


MAP INSET 6 KNIGHTDALE/WENDELL/ZEBULON

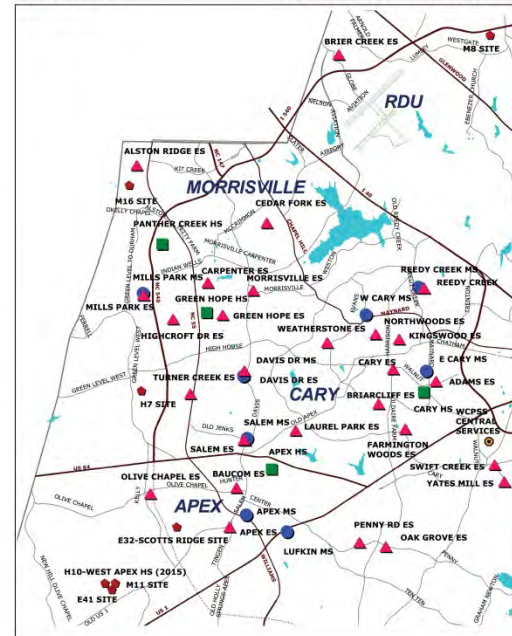

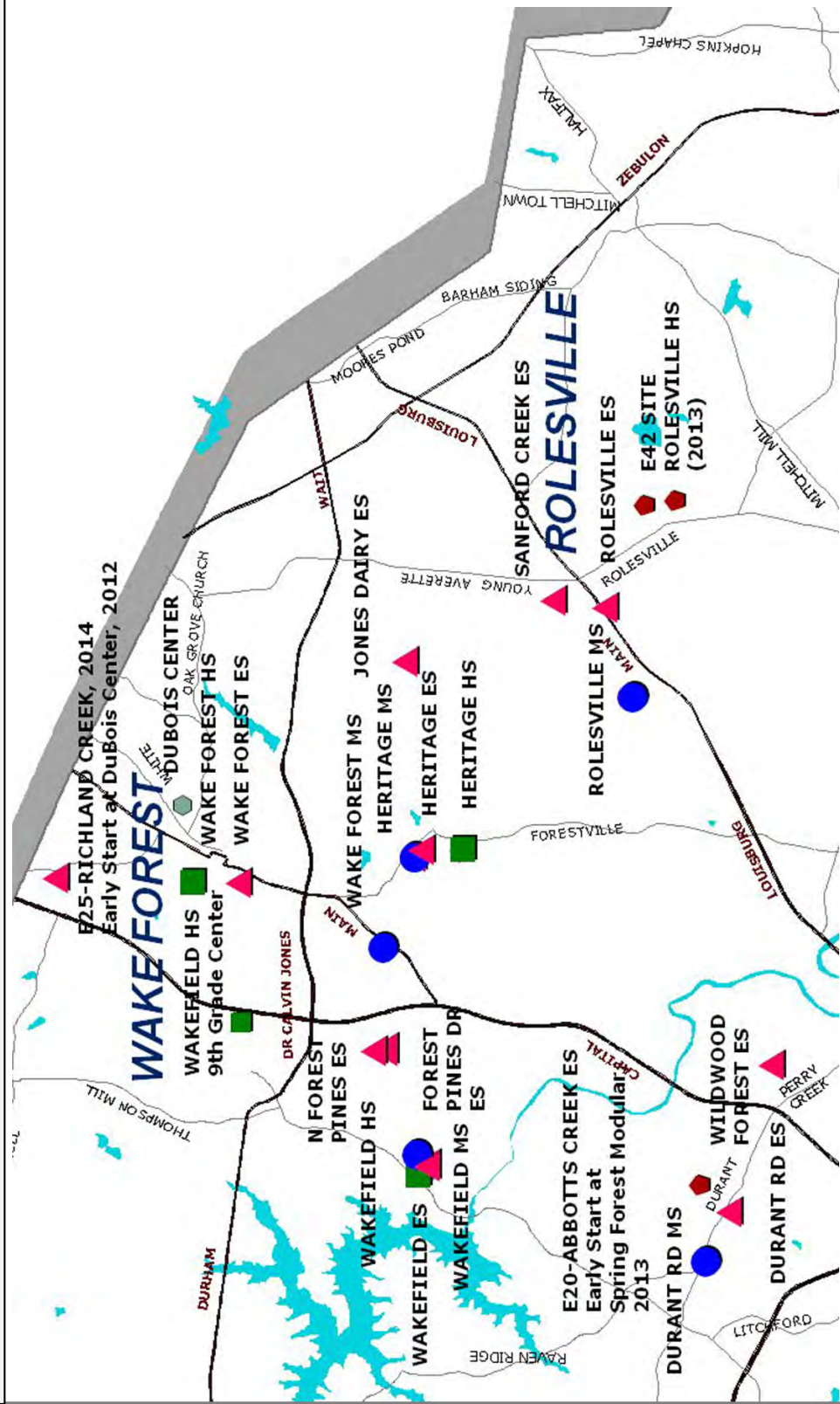

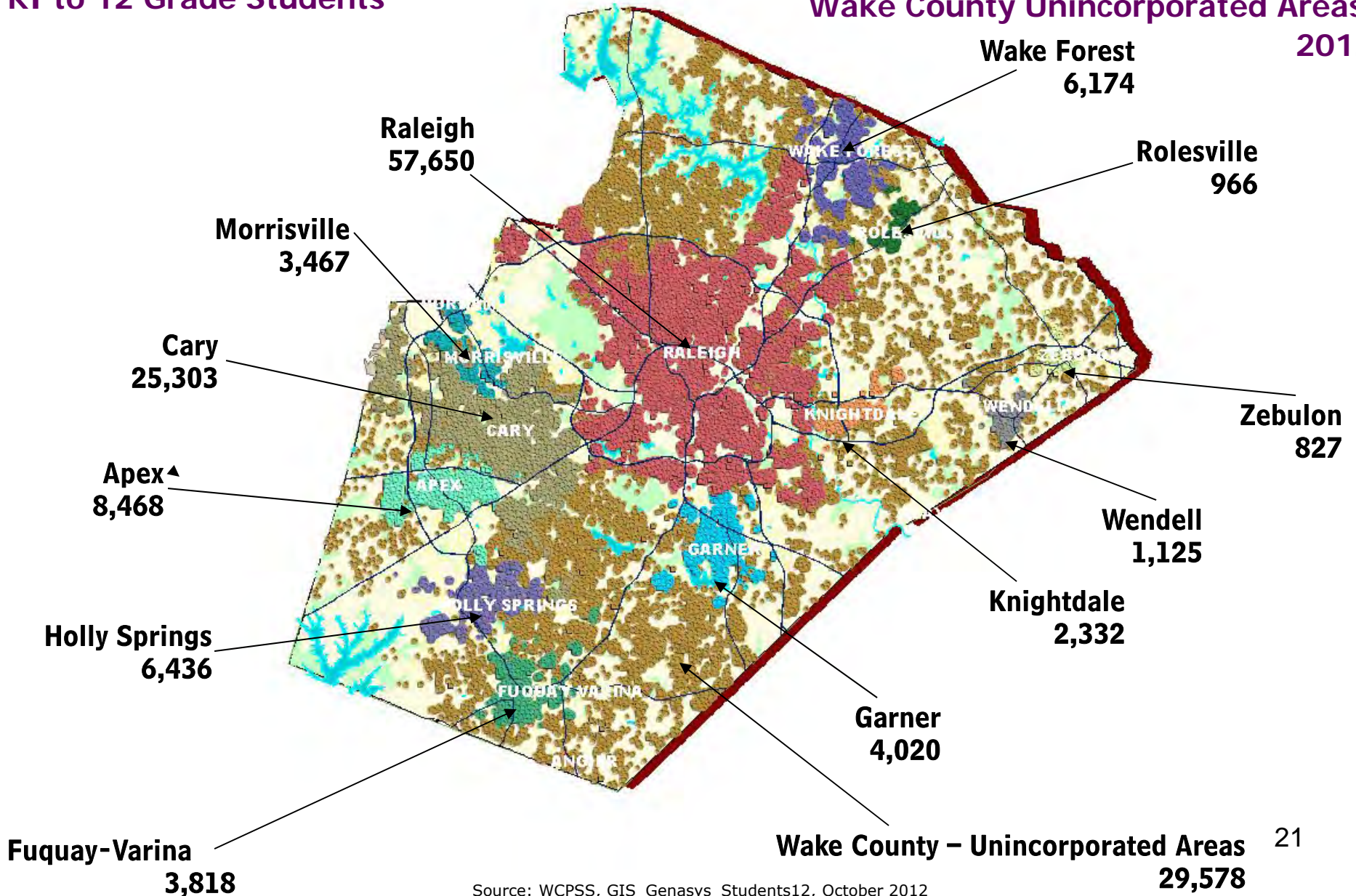

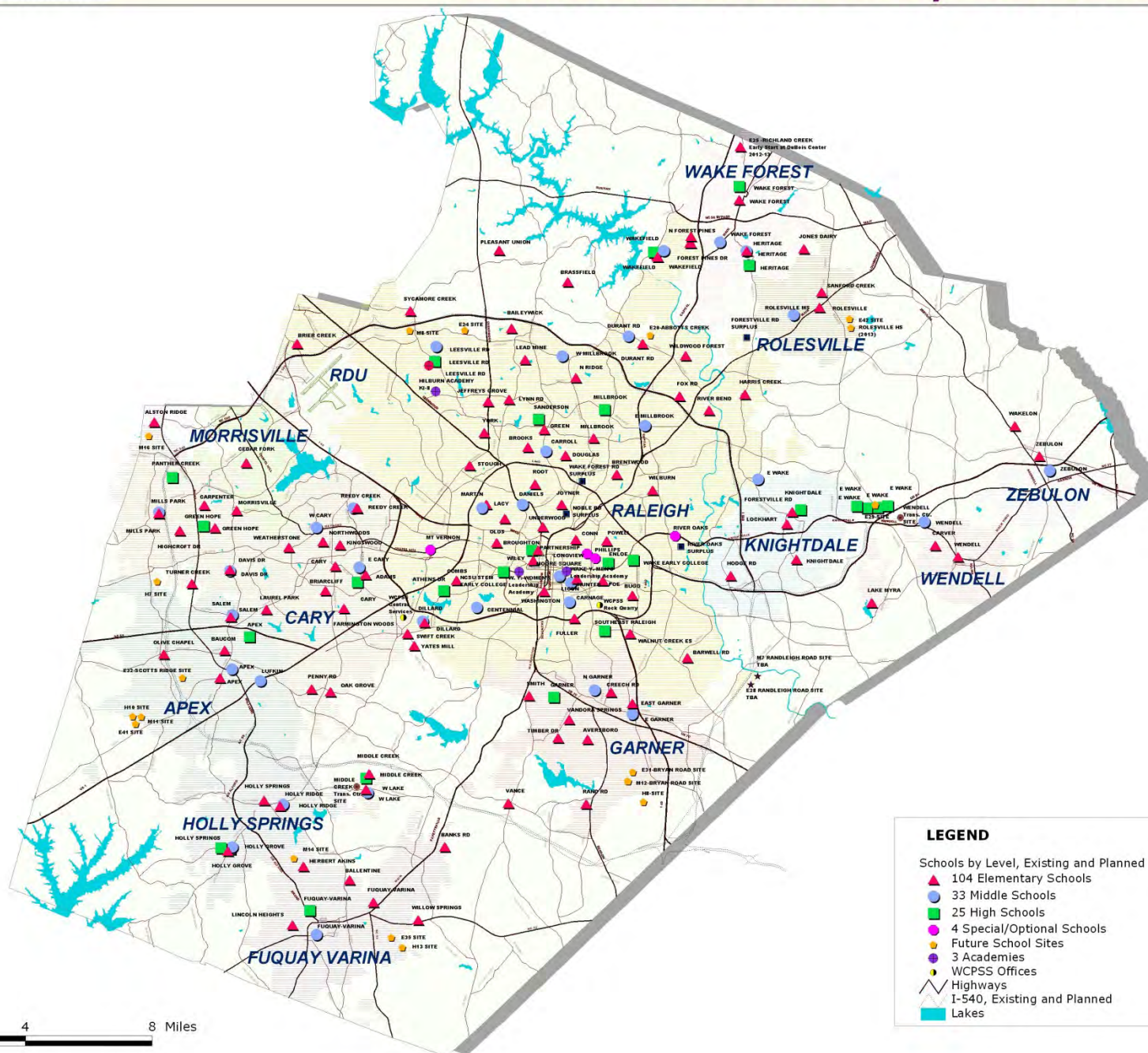

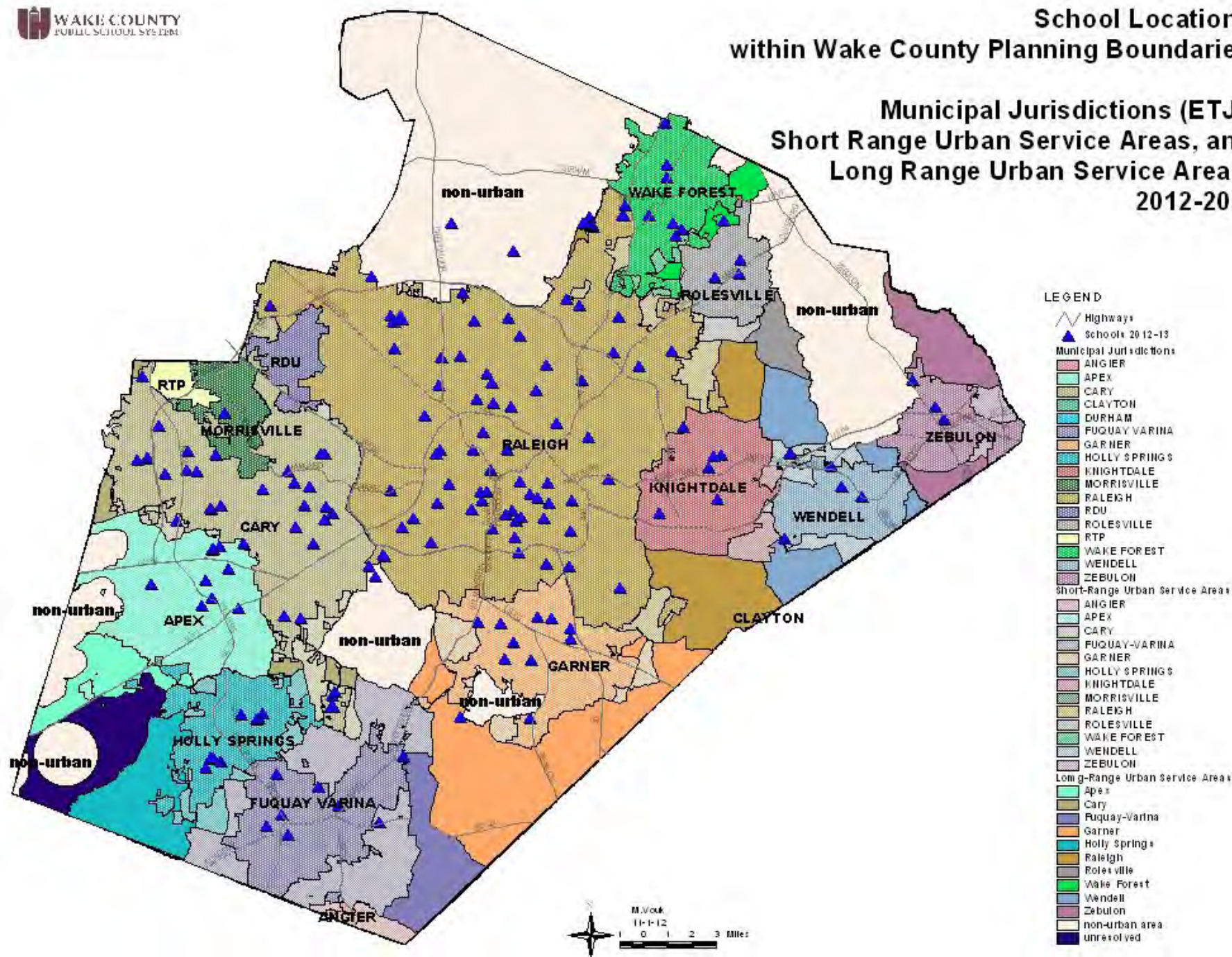

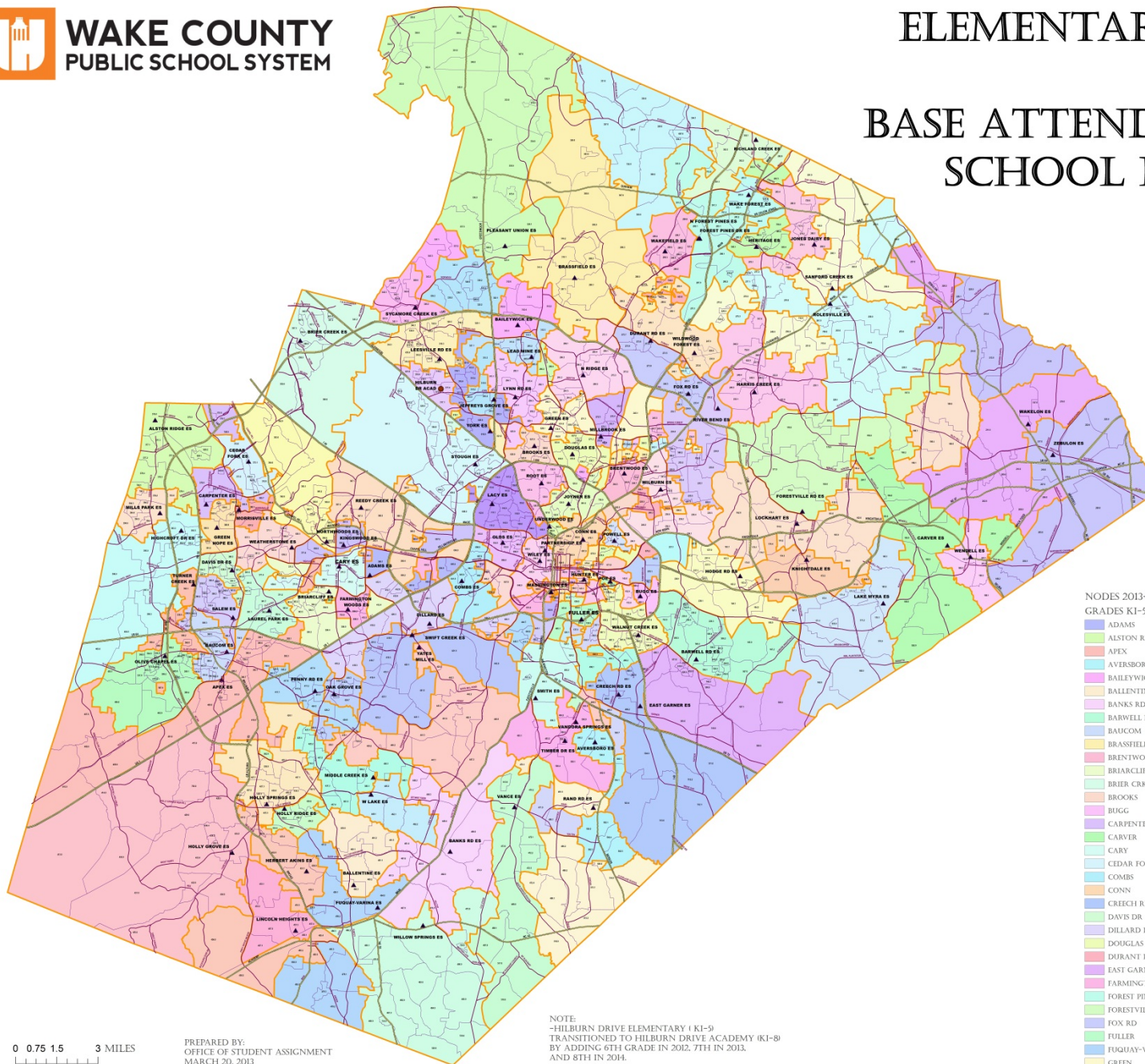
