# Promotion & Graduation Requirements

- To promote to grade 12, eleventh graders must have credit for English I, II & III, a minimum of 18 credits, and be able to successfully complete all remaining graduation requirements the next school year.
- Students must earn 26 credits to graduate.

# Graduation Requirements

Content Area	Courses
English	4 Credits= English I, II, III, & IV (AP Lang can substitute for Eng III, AP Lit can substitute for Eng IV)
Mathematics	4 Credits= Math I, II, III and 1 math beyond math III (AFM, Pre-Calculus, Essentials of College Math)
Science	3 Credits= Earth/Environmental, Biology, and a Physical Science (Physical Sci, Chemistry or Physics)
Social Studies	4 Credits=World History, Civics/Economics, American History I & American History II <b>OR</b> AP US History +1 additional Studies elective.
Health/Physical Education	1 Credit=Health and Physical Education
Additional Electives	10 Credits
World Language	<b>** Not required for graduation**</b> (2 credits required for admission to any UNC System school)

# Course Selection for Senior Year

- Select courses needed to meet graduation requirements
- Determine any college-specific admission requirements
- Choose courses **WISELY!** (balance rigor)
- College admission decisions will be based upon senior-year course selections. Create a schedule that is strong academically.
- Students must select 8 primary courses and 3 alternates on their registration form. Adjustments will be made for Mid-Year Graduate and Partial Day requests after applications have been approved.
- Counselors will meet with Juniors to help with course registration Feb 1 – Feb 6.

# Scheduling Options for Seniors...

## Mid-Year Graduate

Mid-year graduates choose to graduate after **7 semesters** in high school, in January of senior year. Students must be able to demonstrate completion of minimum graduation requirements by the end of 1<sup>st</sup> semester. Students wishing to apply for mid-year graduation must meet with their counselor and complete an application.

\*\*Except for AP exams, mid-year graduates are not allowed to participate in any senior activities (prom, senior picnic, senior awards day) after their completion in January.

**Application Deadline JUNE 9, 2017**

## Partial Day

RHS Administration must approve a Partial Day schedule for any students wishing to apply. Partial Day will only be approved for **2<sup>nd</sup>** semester of senior year. This opportunity is available only to seniors who have a demonstrated need to leave early due to job/work obligations. **\*\*This must be demonstrated through documentation from the employer.\*\***

Students who will be dual enrolled with Wake Tech will need to meet with their counselor regarding scheduling for partial day.

**Application Deadline SEPT. 1, 2017**

# Important Registration Dates

- March 14 – Course selections entered into PowerSchool during 2<sup>nd</sup> period.
- March 24 – Course selection verification sheets given to students
- March 31 – Deadline to submit application for any course that requires an application.
- June 9 – Last day to submit application for mid-year graduate.
- July 15 – Last day to submit request to drop an AP course

# College/Post Secondary Planning

- Prepare for the ACT, which all Juniors will take on **Feb. 28<sup>th</sup>**.
- Research Colleges (location, programs, admission requirements, etc.)





## CAREER AND COLLEGE PROMISE (CCP)

Wake Tech's Career and College Promise (CCP) was created in 2012 to provide dual enrollment educational options for qualified North Carolina high school students, in order to accelerate the completion of college credentials. CCP replaces all earlier dual-enrollment programs, including Huskins, Learn and Earn, and Learn and Earn online.

### PROGRAM PATHWAYS

CCP offers the following options or "pathways" for students in high school:

- Career and Technical Education Pathway (CTE) leading to a certificate, diploma, or degree; or
- College Transfer Pathway (CT) leading to a minimum of 30 hours of college credit in Associate Arts or Associate in Science.

Students select a pathway and then take only the courses within that pathway, as required by the program legislation. Depending on their eligibility, students may enroll in up to two (2) CTE and/or one (1) CT pathway at

# What is CCP?

- The Career and College Promise Program (CCP) is a **dual enrollment** program designed to provide eligible **NC high school students** an opportunity to **earn college credit** while still in high school.
- CCP is a state-mandated program administered by Wake Tech.
