Playground Area After school - As the weather warms, we have more children going to the playground after school to spend time before going home. Due to the lack of extra staff to supervise students during this time, students may not play at the playground after school. We will ask all students to leave the playground area if their parent is not present to supervise them. Parents may not take responsibility for another parent's child during this time. Students, who walk home without a parent, may return to use the facilities with their families after 3:30 pm. Recent incidents have caused increased concern for students' safety during the time immediately after school. While we want our families and community members to feel free to use the field and playground area after hours, we must ensure that all students arrive home or are received by their parents safely before enjoying time at the playground. Parent(s) of Third, Fourth and Fifth Graders:

There have been some changes made to the End of Grade Testing schedule, and we need to share this information with you so that you can plan accordingly. Please bear in mind that the End of Grade tests are required by North Carolina State legislation, and we must comply with all guidelines and mandates. Third, fourth and fifth grade students will take ELA (Reading) End of Grade tests on Thursday May 26th. Math testing will take place on Friday May 27th. The fifth grade Science End of Grade test will be administered on Wednesday, June 1st.

****Please take note that May 27th is the Friday of Memorial Day Weekend. <u>Testing will begin as early in the day as possible</u>. Most students will finish the assessment in the allotted time of 180 minutes, and those who need extra time will receive an extra 60 minutes. <u>If at all possible</u>, please do not plan on withdrawing your child from school before 1:00 p.m. on the afternoon of the 27th.***
