#### Here are some activities you can do with your child to support Language Arts learning at home:

- Make reading an enjoyable part of your child's daily routine. Designate a time free of technology for your child to read for pleasure.
- Encourage your child to read a variety of materials: magazines, newspapers, recipes, instructions, comic books, chapter books, etc.
- Encourage your child to write in a journal or diary, or write notes, letters, and e-mails to friends and family.
- Have your child write a response about what they read. Some questions you might ask are:
  - What was your favorite part of the story and why?
  - What do you think will happen next 0 and whv?

#### A sample of what your child will be learning in Fourth Grade Math:

- Using whole-number arithmetic to solve word problems, including problems with remainders and problems with measurements
- Adding and subtracting whole numbers quickly and accurately (numbers up to 1 million)
- Multiplying and dividing multi-digit numbers in simple cases (e.g., multiplying  $1,638 \times 7$  or  $24 \times 17$ , and dividing 6,966 by 6)
- Understanding and applying equivalent fractions (e.g., recognizing that 1/4 is less than 3/8 because 2/8 is less than 3/8
- Adding, subtracting, and multiplying fractions in simple cases (such as 23/4 - 11/4 or  $3 \times 5/8$ ), and solving related word problems
- Understanding simple decimals in terms of fractions (e.g., rewriting 0.62 as 62/100)
- Measuring angles and finding unknown angles in a diagram

#### Here are some activities you can do with your child to support Math learning at home:

- Have your child estimate the total cost of the groceries before checkout.
- Provide opportunities for your child to manage money, such as budgeting an allowance, recording transactions after making a purchase
- Ask your child questions when using measurements. Some questions you might ask are:
  - If the football game starts at 5:15 and it ο takes 22 minutes to get to the field, what time do we need to leave?
  - If we need to make two batches of 0 cookies and each batch requires <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup
