

LOCAL ARTICULATED CREDIT AGREEMENT BETWEEN
WAKE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM AND WAKE TECHNICAL COMMUNITY
COLLEGE July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017

DEFINITION

Articulation is a systematic, seamless student transition process from secondary to postsecondary education that maximizes use of resources and minimizes content duplication.

GOAL

Students will make a seamless transition of identified courses from the Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) to Wake Technical Community College (Wake Tech).

GUIDING CRITERIA FOR ARTICULATION

- The Local Articulated Credit Agreement between the Wake County Public School System and Wake Technical Community College builds on the *North Carolina High School to Community College Articulation Agreement*. The local review teams (or ‘matrix teams’) are comprised of a minimum of one WCPSS Curriculum Specialist and one Wake Tech Curriculum Specialist.
- WCPSS high school courses for which advanced credit is granted must have been completed with the grade and conditions as specified in this agreement.
- Advanced credit hours shall be applied toward Wake Tech graduation requirements if applicable to the major, but shall not be calculated in the student’s grade point average.
- The student must enroll in the Wake Tech curriculum program within two years after leaving a WCPSS high school.
- The student must be enrolled at Wake Tech in the semester for which credit is granted.
- Students who receive advanced credit will not be required to register and pay tuition for courses for which they receive such credit.

IDENTIFICATION AND ALIGNMENT OF ARTICULATED COURSES

The matrix teams used the following procedures to identify courses for articulation:

1. Reviewed WCPSS high school and Wake Tech course descriptions.
2. Reviewed high school course blueprints and community college course outlines to compare competencies.
3. Determined if articulation is course to course, courses to course, courses to courses, or course to courses, and if competencies are equivalent.
4. Followed policies and regulations of licensing/accrediting bodies.

CRITERIA TO AWARD COLLEGE CREDIT

The following criteria will be used to award college credit for identified high school courses:

1. Grade of B or higher in the course, and;
2. A scaled score of A on the CTE post assessment (either provided by NC DPI or an approved third party), and;
3. Students must enroll at Wake Tech within two years of their high school graduation date.

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Articulated credit is credit that is granted in specific courses by Wake Technical Community College to students who have satisfactorily completed equivalent high school courses. The general conditions and procedures for granting credit by articulation shall be as follows:

- In order to receive articulated credit for high school courses listed in the course matrix of this agreement, the student must meet the grade and CTE post-assessment criteria specified in this agreement under the section titled “Criteria to Award College Credit.”
- The student must enroll in a Wake Technical Community College curriculum program within two years after graduating from a WCPSS high school or as approved by the Wake Technical Community College registrar and department heads.
- The student must be enrolled the semester for which credit is granted.

This Local Articulated Credit Agreement between the Wake County Public School System and Wake Technical Community College is effective for students enrolled in the aforementioned high school courses during the 2016-17 academic year. This agreement shall be reviewed and updated every year.
