The other day, one of our students had a health issue that did require us to contact the paramedics. Don't worry, the child is fine and was back at school two days later.

I am telling you this because we had to ask a few cars to move out of the fire lane in the car circle so that the ambulance would be able to get as close to the front of the school as possible. The fire lane is a no parking zone for this very reason. We must ask that all families respect this lane in the same way that you would when out and about, in an area that would be patrolled by a police officer with the promise of a parking ticket.

Now that I have your attention and while on the subject, I would once again like to share my concern about all those cars that park on the alternate side of Country Trail. During the dismissal process, this is a VERY high traffic area and poses dangerous street crossing with low visibility. Our afternoon walker and carpool dismissal process is designed to maximize safety for your children, while successfully moving over 250 car-riders to their cars in less than 20 minutes.

Please help us to set a positive example and make this a safe process for your children by either parking in designated spaces in the parking lot, or following the carpool flow when picking up your children.

have consistently addressed importance of allowing our students to remain at school the entire instructional day, but I would like to address the importance of getting your child to school no later than, and actually earlier than, 9:15 am. When a child arrives late, there is a bit of a domino impact. For other children, who arrive by the expected time of 9:15, a student who arrives late interrupts the flow to the beginning of their day. The teacher must stop what they are doing with the students in order to address tardy student. For your children, when they arrive late, their day is simply started wrong! They are immediately stared at by the other children, singled out by the teacher to rush into through a morning routine in order to catch up to where the rest of the class... the students who got to school on time... has accomplished academically.

However, if your children must be late, our policy has been communicated that parents or guardians MUST come in with their children to properly sign them in. DO NOT send your children in without an adult to accompany them.
