

## Professional Development And a Growth Mindset at LES



The faculty and staff have had two wonderful opportunities this past week. The first was a visit from Dr. Valerie Falkner, a professor in the School of

Education and recognized authority in the development and processes surrounding math instruction. Dr. Falkner spoke to us once before and will do so again next month and always sparks our interest and causes us to think. Her most recent visit was on equity of educational opportunity and how we address the differentiated needs of our diverse learners. Dr. Falkner has an ability to speak to and reach all of her audience, regardless of grade level or content area taught.

Two days later, at our monthly Faculty/ Staff Meeting, the Leesville faculty took a critical look at how we are teaching and promoting writing strategies to our students. We will be employing a process referred to as "Almost There" Writing, which we believe will encourage the highest order reasoning and critical thinking skills. As a school, we have been discussing the processes we will

employ for a deliberate and intentional role-out of what we believe to be an innovative instructional approach.
