2nd Grade:

Rain, sleet, hail, or snow doesn't stop our second grade students from being weather watchers and weather researchers. Our students have kept their eyes on the sky daily while recording their weather observations in their classroom. Classrooms have also been using the National Weather Service website to see today's weather and the upcoming weather predictions. Mr. Liang taught our students Mandarin weather vocabulary and compared our local weather to China's weather. In the upcoming weeks second graders will be visiting the inquiry center to learn additional research skills from Mrs. Grice and use their text feature/non-fiction knowledge to create a personal non-fiction text about a type of weather.

Demonstrate Cooperation

Music Updates: This December we experienced music through the Nutcracker. Kinders followed the listening

Kinders followed the listening map for the Waltz of the Snow-flakes, kept steady beat to the Overture with their rhythm sticks, and

danced to Trepak, the Russian Dance. Students in 1st grade played quarter and eighth note rhythms with the Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy, while 3rd graders experienced \(\frac{3}{4}\) time in the Waltz of

the Flowers. Students in 2nd grade made global connections playing triangles and woodblocks with the Chinese Dance. Some groups also labeled a map with countries

represented by the different dances (Spanish dance- chocolate, Chinese dance- tea, Arabian dance- coffee.) 4th grade worked together to play many instruments for the Dance of the Reed Flutes, and 5th graders learned to drum to Trepak with our beautiful new tubano drums.

Information is easy to find, but you MUST be a detective to find out if it is real or fake, fact or opinion, credible or not credible. Consider the 5w's:

- •Who created the site, and what makes them an expert? Contact info?
- •What is the URL? .gov, .com, .edu, .mil, .ora
- •When was it last updated? Do the links still work? Pictures still load?
- •Where else can you find the same information? Accurate information is usually repeated.
- •Why was the site made? Sell? Persuade? Inform? And for what audience? Remember: If you're going to jump in the internet pool, you've got to learn how to

swim!

Attendance Matters

Keep your child healthy; keep your child in school!

As the cold weather sets in and students are confined to indoor spaces, please be sure to follow these simple steps to help keep your children healthy in the winter months.

1. Dress them warmly for the cold weather.

2. Stress the importance of eating a good breakfast every morning.

3. Stress hand washing, particularly in the winter months. Send your child to school with a small bottle of hand sanitizer. Research shows that something as simple as hand washing can improve attendance.

4. Talk to your doctor or school nurse about when a sick child should come to school. A child can attend school with a cold as long as there is no fever, vomiting, or diarrhea. Please keep your child home if the following conditions exist: fever of 100 degrees F or higher, nausea or vomiting, severe headache, diarrhea, red, watery eyes with yellow drainage, or an undiagnosed rash.

Kindergarten Registration

- 2017/18 Kindergarten Registration began on January 5, 2017. Registrations are accepted daily between 10am-12noon.
- Incoming kindergarten students must be 5 years old by August 31, 2017.
- Parents should register their incoming kindergarten student at their base school and will need to provide their picture ID, their child's original birth certificate, and a current proof of residence (one of the following: light, water or gas bill, or a lease agreement signed within the past 60 days).
- A North Carolina Health Assessment form and up-to-date immunization record is also required and must be presented by the first day of school.

Magnet Applications

- On-line Magnet School Application Window will be available January 12-31, 2017. Applications for magnet schools should be submitted through the Wake County Public School System website at Magnet Application Process
- anytime during the application window.
- Incoming K students must be registered at their base school and have a student ID # to submit a magnet application. Rising K students who have magnet siblings MUST complete this process to attend FWES.
- Notification of application results will be available on February 16, 2017.

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

Dismissal Safety Reminders...

Safety and security are our highest priorities. Please help us maintain attention to safety by following our afternoon dismissal processes and guidelines.



For those families that pick-up students as walkers please note that cars must park in a designated parking space and that students must be picked up in front of school and walked by an adult to vehicles parked in the busy parking lot. We also ask that drivers using the parking lot at the end of the day maintain safe speed limits.

Lastly, we ask that our families be good neighbors by not parking on sidewalks, blocking traffic, in yards of neighboring homes or creating crowded street parking during afternoon dismissal.

For the safety of your student and all other pedestrian traffic, if you need to drive and park to pick up a walker, the school has permission from The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on Seabrook Avenue for parents to park and walk from that parking lot to pick up students from 3:30-4:15pm.

FWES students take lots of action! We see it in daily routines, parents share it with staff and students are empowered to make a difference.

During a study of "Sharing the Planet" FWES 2nd graders learned of conservation and human impact on the world. They studied the water cycle, explored the ways water is cleaned and found ways to take action at home through recycling and other projects. This unit of study coincided with the recent floods to the eastern region of North Carolina due to Hurricane Matthew. Students were amazed at what flooding can do to man made structures and compassionate about how they could help others. There was a need for just about everything.

friend, I was able to contact the principal North Carolina, Eric Sanders shared that

many of his students were greatly affected by the floods and could use take home school kits to help with homework, creative writing and drawing. Thanks to donations from the entire school community the 2nd Graders were able to create 150 school kits as well as some faux "stained glass paintings" to brighten the school.

Enola Grice and I took the donations to the school in Lumberton right before the winter break. We were welcomed by the school and given a tour of the building. We passed out the kits to the 2nd graders and their smiles and thank you's made our hearts sing. The principal and many of the teachers shared stories of students that attended the school, many still without permanent homes. During the heart of the storm some of the families had to escape to their roofs, spending days waiting for rescue. So often we see these type of disasters on the news and never meet the individuals affected. It was a humbling experience, and one I will remember for

years to come.

I am so proud of the work of our second graders and school community. This small action made a big difference to many children in NC. Thank you.

One School, One Book ... On January 30th, every child at Farmington Woods will receive a copy of Where the Mountain Meets the Moon a book by Grace Lin. As a school we will be participating in this program that promotes reading aloud as a family. The benefits of reading aloud are remarkable. Studies have shown that reading to children helps them to listen better and longer, to build bigger vocabularies, to understand concepts better, to feel positive about both books and learning. More information, including a weekly reading guide will be coming home soon. Get ready to go on a remarkable journey with Minli, a magical goldfish and a dragon that cannot fly as they journey to find the Old Man of the Moon.

WAKE Up and Read ... This year Farmington Woods will be participating for our third year supporting this wonderful book donation program. WAKE Up and Read conducts a book drive each year to help build home libraries and make books readily available to children who need them. Through the book drive, every child at 10 high-need elementary schools and 20 childcare centers can choose 10 books and keep them for their home libraries. Last year WAKE Up and Read collected over 114,000 books with several of our teachers working to sort and box the books at the Cary Towne Center collection site. As a school we will be collecting books from February 6th - February 24th. This year our goal at Farmington Woods is to collect 2,000 books to donate. This is approximately 3 books from each student. To help make this easy, Mrs. Grice or Mrs. Wilson will stand at the front of the school to collect books in the carpool lane on Wednesday and Thursday mornings during our collection weeks. Books can always be dropped off in the Inquiry Center or in the front office. Start looking for those books that you are ready to donate Let's see if we can collect 2,000 books to donate.

What's the Buzz on... The 4C's for 21st Century Learning



As WCPSS is emphasizing the dynamic learning experience as part of the Strategic Plan, it will be helpful to know more about one element of Dynamic Learning- The 4Cs. These C's are Creativity, Collaboration, Communication and Critical Thinking.

The National Education Association has outlined these four skills as key components of 21st Century Learning Skills. Wake County has included these as one part of the dynamic learning experience. While the 4C's are not expressly outlined in the

standards, they are an important element of the learning experience that takes place at school. To prepare students to be career and college ready, they must practice sharing ideas, solving problems, working together and thinking outside the box. As teachers plan and implement lessons, they use these concepts to guide student interactions and activities. Increasing opportunities for student dialogue, questioning and teamwork will all be part of your student's day at Farmington Woods.

The 4C's are not directly outlined in the IB program either, but they

are a strong complement to the program's focus on inquiry, global mindedness and action. The IB attitudes also support and teach traits necessary to be strong collaborators, communicators, critical thinkers and creative learners. Today's students are tomorrow's innovators, designers and leaders. Focus on the 4C's now will help our students be more prepared and successful as they become career and college ready.
