- Picture ID Required for Sign Out of Students: In order to maintain the safety and security of ALL students, picture ID is required for the release/pick up of a student. This procedure insures the safety and security of each student. Please remember your Photo ID (and remind anyone coming to pick up your child that they will also need photo ID) when coming to sign out you child.
 - Update Blue Cards- Please make sure blue cards are updated if new individuals are going to be picking up and signing out your student. If a person is not listed on the card, we cannot release the child to that person, for their safety. Thank you for keeping that list updated!
- Walk In Transportation Changes: All transportation changes must be submitted in writing. Walk in last minute transportation changes will not be allowed repeatedly and should only be used in the event of an emergency circumstance Changes due to appointments should be given to the teacher the morning of the appointment. To maintain appropriate safety, students will not be dismissed to parents from the carpool area or from classrooms prior to the start of the After School Program at 4:15pm.

- It is getting to be that time of year—Sick Students: We want our students at school each day, however, if your child is sick- or shows any of the symptoms below, he/she will need to remain at home. NC Health Policy dictates the events that require students to be excluded (sent home) from school. If your child demonstrates one of these symptoms we are required to send them home. Please make appropriate arrangements if you receive such a phone call. Students must go home from school if the following symptoms are present:
 - Temp of 100 or more (cannot return until they are fever free for 24 hours without medicationif your child leaves during the day for a fever, he/ she may not return the following day as it will not have been 24 hours without fever)
 - Vomiting or Diarrhea (cannot return to school until they have been free of either symptom for at least 12 hours)
 - Severe headache
 - Red, watery eyes with yellow drainage
 - Undiagnosed or treated rash
 - Inability to attend to learning activities due to change in student's usual medical status

Read Around the World ... The first Read Around the World "travelers" are beginning to turn in their reading logs and selecting a charm. Remember you can turn in your log whenever you are finished and get the next log. The second continent on our reading around the world is ASIA. 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
