Special Messages from Kildaire Farm Home Owner's Association:

- 12 Noon, Monday through Friday.

Parents should provide

- Their child's original certified birth certificate,
- Parent/guardian picture ID and
- Copy of a current proof of residence (one of the following: a light, gas or water bill, or recently signed lease or closing statement.)
- The child's North Carolina Health Assessment form and up-to-date immunization record is due by the first day of school. Parents must register their child at the base school for their address.

5th Grade Middle School Registration

Your child will be recommended for core courses (Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies) and any support services that are received (IEP, 504, ESL). This information will be provided to you on a course verification sheet, and you will have the opportunity to review and approve the information on the sheet.

Your child will also be able to select elective courses. These courses are not required subject areas like reading and math, but instead are optional courses that may be of interest to your child. Each middle school offers unique elective courses that your child can choose to take.

Your child will choose his/her elective courses online using PowerSchool. School staff will guide each student in this process, as the courses will be selected during the school day. This process will occur March 20 - April 21, 2017.

Once students have selected their elective courses, you will receive a course verification sheet to review and approve along with the core courses previously referenced.

We encourage you to review the elective course options available to your child prior to the course selection period. You can view the electives offered at your child's assigned middle school by visiting www.wcpss.net/rising6th

WAKE Up and Read ... Collection has ended for this school year. Thank you to all the families who donated books to this year's drive. We collected <u>OVER 1200</u> books during our 4 week collection. These books will be added to the other books collected and distributed to families in Wake County. Thank you for your support.

Read Around the World ... We will begin giving out the last continent reading log (Australia / Antarctica and the Arctic) in a few days. Remember you can turn in your log whenever you are finished and get the next one. Those students who complete their travels around the world will receive a special golden globe charm and attend an event near the end of the school year ... Can you be a "world reader"?

One School, One BookStudents and families continue to be enjoying the read-aloud of Where the Mountain Meets the Moon by Grace Lin. We are working to arrange a schoolwide skype with Ms. Lin near the end of March. She is unable to visit our school in person but we are hoping for a "virtual visit". Ms. Lin's skype with the students is being sponsored by FWES PTA.

March Book Madness ... has begun at Farmington Woods. Students in grades 2-5 have been given a tournament bracket where they can make their selections for the "FWES 2017 Book of the Year". All brackets must be turned in by Monday, March 6th as weekly voting rounds begin in the Inquiry Center. We will announce the winning book on Monday, April 3rd. The top three winning brackets will receive a poster from the Book Fair in April. Several K and 1st grade classes have chosen to participate in classroom voting for a separate picture book bracket. The classroom with the most correctly completed bracket will receive bookmarks and pencils. Let the madness begin!

Lynda Mullaly Hunt ... Author of <u>Fish in a Tree</u> and <u>One for the Murphys</u> will be visiting with the fifth grade students on Monday, March 27th. <u>Fish in a Tree</u> was the <u>Global Read Aloud for 4th and 5th grades last school year and remains a favorite book for many of our students. Students have the opportunity to purchase one of her books for autographing at the time of her visit. Information about the presale ordering of her books has been sent home to each 5th grade family. NCCBA ... All kindergarten classes as well as some 1st and 2nd grade classes are working hard to read the nominees for this year's North Carolina Children's Book Award (NCCBA). The current favorite for kindergarten is Wolfie the Bunny but we still have several to read including I Yam a Donkey! and Mother Goose Bruce. Voting will take place the week of March 20 -24.

What's the Buzz on... Learner Agency

Engaged and excited learning is the goal for every student at FWES each day they come to school! In fact, this concept is the foundation of this year's theme: FWES Ignites Learning. Our goal is to spark the interest and desire for students to learn, be reflective and take action from their learning. In the classroom, teachers are using the concept of learner agency to foster a deeper engagement in the day's activities. Learner agency a component of the dynamic learning experience outline in the Wake Country strategic plan in which students are given choice and autonomy over parts of their learning. Students have choice in the classroom

ranging from seating options to topics of research. They are choosing partners during small groups, types of text to read, and which learning station to visit first. Many of our teams have also introduced learner agency in the structure of their homework. Your student may be bringing home a choice board or week to two week long learning log to increase choice in how they practice the current learning objectives and increase engagement. Additionally, students have opportunities such as open Art room and open Gym beginning at 8:45 and lasting until the bell rings to help begin their day of learning in a way that engages

them. As a family, you can extend learner agency by creating "choose to and have to" jobs in the home. These can be learning tasks related to school, family chores, input in meal planning or activities for the weekend. Agency is the opportunity for students to voice their opinion, desire and experience in actives. Our aim in increasing agency is to increase engagement and ultimately increase the action of our IB learners.

- ⇒ District 9 Board Advisory Council Notes- Mano Meenaksh FWES Parent Rep: WCPSS Budget: Do you know the WCPSS school system's budget for 2016-17 school year was out of balance by \$17.5 million! This budget shortfall was primarily caused by changes implemented and required by the State Legislature. Building an annual budget requires insight to some complex and unique requirements. Do you have suggestions on how to balance WCPSS budget, visit this website for an interactive tool to submit your balanced budget - http://wcpss.abalancingact.com/. If you would like to know more attend a public hearing on Superintendent's Proposed Budget, Next Meeting April 24th at Reedy Creek Middle School. Crossroads FLEX High School: Do you know of any high school students pursuing to be an athlete or other professional careers and therefore not be able to attend high school full time? Let them know about Crossroads FLEX school, that was created and opened in 2016-17 school year to meet student need for flexible schedules due to outside activities. The school provides a blended learning environment, combining online courses (NCVPS), face-to-face support, and small group sessions. Blended content is available for both core classes and electives.
- > Yearbook LAST CHANCE to submit candid pictures for the yearbook by Sunday, March 19th. We still need a lot of photos from your child's classroom activities and field trips. The yearbook has to be sent off to the printer at the end of the month so we need the pictures as soon as possible. Uploading them is simple. If you have pictures on your phone, get the ReplayIt app from your app store. If you want to upload via your computer, go to www.ReplayIt.com. In either case, you will need to create an account. You

- will then be prompted for your school name and a school password (which is "fwbears"). Then you simply choose your pictures to upload. Thank you to everyone who have helped out this year!
