- Teacher Characteristics for 2017-18: If you are interested in providing information about the teacher characteristics that will best support your child in the next grade level, you may send those to Jennifer Thakur (jthakur@wcpss.net) and/or Winston Pierce (awpierce@wcpss.net) by Friday, June 9th. Teachers should not be identified by name, as many of our teachers will be teaching different grade levels next year, but the characteristics that support your child best in a learning environment will allow us to make the best classroom placement decision next year.
- EOG Scores: Please review the following information about the proposed return and sharing of EOG Scores for 2017:
  - 3rd Graders got scores on Thursday, June 1st because those who did not pass the ELA portion retested today
  - 4th and 5th Graders should get scores on Thursday, June 8th
  - Students who are not completed with testing (all test sections : ELA, Math and Science- if 5th grader) by June 6, 2017 will not receive scores until June 9, 2017 or later.
  - If there are any technological glitches there could be a delay in our ability to report scores but we will get them to families as soon as possible
  - More detailed parent reports will be sent to families either in the summer or at the start of the 17-18 school year.
- Yearbooks: Extra yearbooks are available in the front office for \$25 until they run out. Checks should be made payable to FWES PTA.
- Medication Pick Up: All medication kept at school must be picked up by a parent on the last day of school, June 9th- it may not be sent home with students. Medication not picked up by June 24th will be disposed of

# Classroom changes and adjustments for 17-18:

## The Facts for FWES:

- K-3 class size average for FWES (and all NC schools) must remain below 20 students per classroom for the first 2 months (40 school days) of the school year. After 2 months no one classroom K-3 may be larger than 23 students.
  - K-3 at FWES will have 6-8 teachers per grade level- depending on enrollment #s as we get closer to the start of the school year
- All teaching positions, other than State required Art, Music and PE must be used to maintain these lower class sizes. FWES will no longer have Technology or Science as a special in the 17-18 school year. These two positions are not required by the state and must be used to facilitate the mandated lower class size average.
- We will need to move some classroom locations in the summer months to prepare for the need to possibly add classrooms to K-3 grade levels.
- There are no class size limits for 4th-12th grade classrooms in NC. To maintain the staffing possibly needed in K-3, 4th and 5th grade classes may have more students per classroom than in previous years.
- It is highly possible (and most likely) that there may be additional teachers and classrooms added after the start of the school year due to enrollment fluctuations in order to maintain compliance with the K-3 law and if so, changes in classroom placements for students may need to occur. While changes are not ideal- the support of FWES staff and our FWES families make those changes successful for students.
- Formulas for Instructional Assistants will not change, so while there will be more K-3 classrooms, there will be no more Instructional Assistants to serve our entire school community.

## The Good News for FWES:

- Funding for the IB/PYP program is not impacted so we will maintain our Foreign Language program- Spanish and Mandarin. Mandarin will also be expanded to include regular culture and basic language lessons for K-2 classrooms.
- Students will still have 5 Specials each week (most elementary schools are down to only Art, Music and PE)- and we are working on creative options for those grade levels with more than 5 teachers to have more than 5 specials to allow for common planning time for the team- stay tuned! We are very optimistic about some creative options!
- Instructional Assistants will continue to work to support students in an instructional capacity to support the learning needs of all students K-5.
- FWES staff are awesome, flexible and problem solvers and they are already considering the possible changes and how to make it work best for students! We are so lucky to have them at FWES!
