IN-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The **NC State George & Reba Worsley Finance and Business Scholarship** has been established to provide scholarship support for the children of permanent employees in the Finance and Business division at NC State University. Students can be enrolled at the graduate or undergraduate level, but must be enrolled full time for consideration. Awards are made based on financial need, with academic merit as a second criterion. Eligible students must apply for this scholarship annually, and may be considered for funding for no more than four academic years (or eight semesters). To demonstrate financial need, applicants must complete and submit a *Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*, available at www.fafsa.gov, and request that the results be released to NC State (school code 002972). Applicants are strongly encouraged to complete the FAFSA by March 1, 2016. To apply, go online at https://studentservices.ncsu.edu/your-money/financial-aid/types/scholarships/. Scholarship applications should be submitted to the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid **by May 1, 2017**

The **North Carolina Central University Alumni Association** offers several "National Alumni Scholarships" to students at NCCU. The scholarships vary in amount and may be renewable for up to four years. Recipients of these awards are designated "National Alumni Scholars." Though the majority of the National Alumni Scholarship awards made annually will be to incoming freshman students, applications are acceptable from any student regardless of classification or academic interest. OUT-OF-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

Savannah College of Art and Design offers the SCAD Distinguished Scholars Award valued at \$20,000. The award is renewable annually for students who maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0. Applicants must be recommended by their teacher or guidance counselor, have a minimum 1350 SAT combined math and critical reading score, or ACT composite score of at least 30, have a GPA of 3.75, demonstrate outstanding visual arts, performing arts, writing or riding capabilities as well as leadership skills. He or she must be a graduating high school senior who will receive a diploma from an accredited high school, located within the state where they apply. Applicants must be accepted for admission to an accredited college or university, matriculating the following year. Each eligible student must have a father, mother or natural guardian who meets the following qualifications: a. The student's school must be located in the state where the parent is a full-time active employee OR within a 100mile radius of where the parent is a full-time active employee. b. Parent must be a full-time paid member of the police or sheriff's department or fire department. Parent/guardian may also be a volunteer member of a fire department. c. Parent or guardian must be an active duty police officer, firefighter, paramedic, or EMT (public sector). Children of administrative staff do not qualify. d. Children of DHS, FBI and other Federal employees do not qualify. e. Children of reserve officers, part-time sheriff's deputies and retired, deceased or disabled employees do not qualify. They have headquarters in California and treatment centers located across California and Texas. They are a national leader in the treatment of chemical dependency. SEG[Society of Exploration Geophysicists]Foundation Scholarships encourage the study of geophysics and related geosciences. The SEG Foundation offers a range of <u>different scholarship opportunities</u>. SEG Scholarships are based on merit and applicants must be intending to pursue a college curriculum directed toward a career in applied geophysics or a closely related field such as geosciences, physics, geology, or earth and environmental sciences.

<u>Scholarships</u> range from \$500 to \$14,000 USD per academic year; average awards are approximately \$2,500. There are approximately 75 different scholarships. TheDream.US Scholarship Program offers scholarship awards to first-time college students who have a financial need and are <u>undocumented immigrants</u>. It is specifically for students whose undocumented immigration status meets the qualifications for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA). DACA was approved by President Obama in 2012 which defers any deportation action for undocumented young people who came to the U.S. as children and have pursued education or military service in the U.S. Students may be either already DACA approved or may apply for DACA approval if they believe they are eligible. <u>Eligible students must be planning to attend participating colleges in New York City</u>, Miami, Washington D.C., El Paso, Rio Grande Valley, and online and pursuing an associate's or bachelor's degree. They must have a grade point average of 2.5 or above. The scholarship may be used for tuition, books, and other college fees and expenses. The scholarship is offered by TheDream.US, a Washington D.C.-based non-profit organization that provides college education. The goal of the organization is to enable 2,000 eligible students over the next ten years to realize their dream of a college education and joining the U.S. workforce. **The deadline for this scholarship is February 1, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$25,000.
