IN-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

Davidson's prestigious **John Montgomery Belk Scholarship**, valued at over \$63,000, covers tuition, fees, room & board plus two summer stipends. Up to six Belk Scholars will be chosen. Candidates must be nominated for consideration and **Broughton may nominate one or two candidates**. Scholarship finalists participate in mandatory selection interviews on campus in March. The application for nomination form is available in the Guidance Resource Center and must be returned by Friday, October 20, 2017.

UNC-Greensboro_has an extensive number of merit scholarships for students with a minimum 1200 SAT or 27 ACT, and a minimum 3.5 GPA. Annual awards range from \$1500 to full tuition, fees, room & board, and are renewable for a total of four years. For application information and deadlines, go online at https://admissions.uncg.edu/cost-and-aid-scholarships.php . The UNCG Blue & Gold Scholarship priority deadline is **December 1, 2017**.

NC State – Goodnight Scholars Program, a premier scholarship program for outstanding students majoring in STEM and Education disciplines. The Program invests in students from **middle-income families**. In early December, the Goodnight Scholars Program will issue approximately 700 invitations to apply to prospective NC State students who have applied for fall admission by October 15, 2017. Applications for the Scholars Program are due in January. From this applicant pool, 96 finalists will be selected to attend the Finalist Interview Day in late February. Recipients will be selected in March, and will have until mid-April to accept the scholarship offer. The value of the scholarship is \$19,500 and is renewable for up to four years. Students, who are not invited but wish to be considered for an invitation to apply, may nominate themselves for consideration. The Thomas Wolfe Scholarship offers **full undergraduate support** for student writers entering **UNC-Chapel Hill** in the fall of 2018. **The Thomas Wolfe Scholarship** will receive applications beginning **September 1st, 2017**. Our Thomas Wolfe Scholarship application process involves **two steps**: <u>1</u>) an application to the University of **North Carolina at Chapel Hill by October 15th, 2017**; and, <u>2</u>) an application to the Thomas Wolfe Scholarship by **November 15th, 2017**. Students **must** apply to **both** the University and the Scholarship to be considered. Preliminary screening will be completed in January, 2017, with final screening concluding in early March, 2017. Three outstanding candidates will be brought to the UNC-Chapel Hill campus for interviews, and a final decision will be made in early April, 2017. The **Cheatham-White Scholarship at North Carolina A&T State University** will provide an outstanding educational experience for students who are exceptional scholars, versatile and well-rounded individuals. The scholarships will be awarded to students with a broad range of interests, proficient in areas of both the arts and sciences, who demonstrate leadership potential and a strong commitment ot service. Each scholarship covers tuition, student fees, housing, meals, textbooks, a laptop computer, supplies, travel and personal expenses. Each also provides four summers of fully funded enrichment and networking opportunities that may include international travel and study. Applicants should have a cumulative GPA of at least 4.0, a minimum score of 1280 [new] or 1200[old] on the SAT or 28 on the ACT. Financial need shall not be a consideration. In order to be considered, you must first be nominated by a high school official (for NC residents) or by completing a self-nomination form. Broughton may nominate 4 seniors. NON-SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

American Radio Relay League [AARL] Foundation Scholarships. ARRL Foundation Scholarships are open to students pursuing a college degree at a two-year or four-year institution who are active licensed amateur radio operators. Seventy different scholarships are available. Each scholarship has its own criteria for eligibility. Some scholarships are for students currently attending college or residing in certain states. Others are for particular fields of study, such as electronic engineering, communications, business, computers, medical, nursing, and science. Required grade point averages vary by scholarship. In addition, ARRL Foundation offers scholarships for students with learning disabilities, high school seniors only, and graduate students. Some scholarships require demonstrated financial need or demonstrated volunteer work in the community. The deadline for this scholarship is January 31, 2018, and the award amount is usually \$500 - 10,000. All applicants must submit a full online application and transcript to be considered. *Applications are due between* October 1 and January 31. Transcripts and the FAFSA document are due February 16 and should be sent electronically to foundation@arrl.org. For more details, visit www.arrl.org/scholarship-program.

Asian & Pacific Islander American Scholarship Fund. APIASF has distributed more than \$50 Million College Scholarships to Asian American and Pacific Islander students. Applicants must be a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident of the United States. Citizen of the Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of Palau are also eligible. Applicants must have a 2.7+ GPA and apply for federal financial aid by February 15. Applications are available online at <u>http://www.apiasf.org/scholarships.html</u> on September 14. AES Engineering Character Essay Scholarship. AES Engineering offers a \$500 scholarship to seniors on the basis of character, as determined by an essay of no more than 1000 words. AXA Achievement Scholarships. The AXA Achievement Scholarship in association with *U.S. News & World Report* provide \$670,000 in annual scholarship to young people throughout the nation. Fifty-two winners – one from each state, the District of Colombia and Puerto Rico – are selected by non-profit partner, Scholarship America, to receive one-time scholarship awards of \$10,000 each. From the pool of 52 state winners, ten are selected as national winners and earn an additional one-time scholarship of \$15,000. These top ten also receive the offer of an internship with AXA. Scholarship winners are known as AXA Achievers. They are ethnically and economically diverse, but they share these qualities: Ambition & drive; determination to set and reach goals; respect for self, family and community; and ability to succeed in college. Box Engineering Diversity Scholarship is open to female, minority, and LBGT students who are pursuing a degree in engineering, computer science and related fields. Five scholarships are awarded every year. Box Engineering is based in Redwood City, California. The company was founded in 2005 to offer an enterprise content management platform that enables sharing and accessing files on mobile devices and other sophisticated business processes. Colgate-Palmolive Haz La U Scholarship Program is open to Hispanic students who demonstrate academic excellence, dedication to community service, and leadership in their community. Applicants must be graduating from an accredited high school, have a GPA of 3.0 or above, and be of Hispanic heritage (includes Spain, Brazil, Philippines). Candidates must be planning to enroll full-time in a bachelor's degree program at an accredited higher education institution in the fall directly after graduation from high school. Qualifying students could earn one of 31 scholarships, which include:

- 1 National Grant, at \$15,000

The organization was established by the White House in 1987 and is headquartered in Washington, D.C. College Jump Start Scholarship is held every year for high school students in grades 10 - 12, current college students, and non-traditional students. The scholarship can be used at any college the student wishes to attend. Eligibility requirements are for students to be planning to attend or currently attending a U.S., accredited 2-year, 4-year or vocational or trade school. Students must also be motivated to use their education in some way that will better their lives and their communities. When applying, students must answer an essay question regarding their career goals, how their education will them attain those goals, or their experience with work or volunteering in their communities. The scholarship is sponsored by the College JumpStart Scholarship Fund in Los Altos, California. It is funded through corporate donations. **The deadline for this scholarship is OCTOBER 17, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$1,000. For more details, visit www.jumpstart-scholarship.net/**

DAR's Christopher Columbus Essay Contest. The DAR sponsors this contest with the National Italian American foundation [NIAF] in honor of Christopher Columbus. Each academic year, an essay topic is chosen and contest instructions are made available online at http://www.dar.org/natsociety/essays.cfm. The contest is open to students in grades 9-12. One winning essay from each participating chapter is submitted for judging on the state level. Each state winner is judged on the divisional level and the divisional winners move on to the national level, where the winner is announced. The contest winner will receive \$1,200 plus a trip to D.C. to present their essay at the Columbus Memorial on Columbus Day, Monday, October 9, 2017. Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarships. Through its Education & Leadership Development Program, the Jackie Robinson Foundation provides scholarships of up to \$7,500 annually to minority high school students showing leadership potential and demonstrating financial need to attend an accredited 4-year college or university of their choice. Applicants must have a minimum SAT score of 1000 [math & critical reading] or a composite ACT score of 22. National Foundation for Advancement of the Arts (NFAA) Recognition and Talent Search is open to high school students in grades 10-12 (age 15-18). Awards are given in ten specific areas, including cinematic arts, dance, design, jazz, music, photography, theater, visual arts, voice and writing. Up to 700 students are chosen each year as national winners. The application consists of sending in either a portfolio or audition tape that demonstrates the student's talent in one of the selected ten areas. There are no transcripts or references needed. From the national winners, 160 will be chosen as finalists. From the national winners, each year up to 60 are nominated to the Presidential Scholars Commission, and 20 students are selected as Arts Scholars. Arts Scholars are invited to perform at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, or be invited to display their work at a Smithsonian art museum. The awards are sponsored by NFAA, now known as The National YoungArts Foundation. The non-profit organization was formed in 1981 to support young artists who have strong talent in the areas of visual, written or performing arts. The organization gives scholarships and talent recognition, and offers other programs to young artists to help them pursue careers in the arts. **The deadline for this scholarship is OCTOBER 13, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$10,000. National Merit Scholarship Program is open to all high school students who meet published entry requirements. **The National Achievement Scholarship Program** is an academic competition in which only Black American high school students participate. The **Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test [PSAT/NMSQT]** is the route of entry to NMSC programs. Annually, about 10,500 students are chosen to receive scholarships for college undergraduate study. [The PSAT/NMSQT will be administered at Broughton on Wednesday, October 11, 2017. **Prudential Spirit of Community Award.** This program is a nationwide program for students in grades 5-12 who are **volunteering** in their communities. Interested applicants must apply online at http://spirit.prudential.com or www.nassp.org/spirit by November 7, 2017 and then submit their applications to Broughton's Principal before November 17, 2017, for certification in order to be considered. Students chosen as Local Honorees receive a Certificate of Achievement from their schools. Those who qualify [100 hours of service] also receive the President's Volunteer Service Award. State Honorees receive an award of \$1,000, an engraved silver medallion, and an all-expense-paid trip with a parent or guardian to Washington, D.C. for national recognition events. National Honorees receive an additional award of \$5,000, an engraved gold medallion, a crystal trophy for their school and a \$5,000 grant from The Prudential Foundation for a non-profit, charitable organization of their choice.

Unigo.com Education Matters \$5K Scholarship. The Education Matters \$5K Scholarship is given to one student yearly who best responds [in 250 words or less] to the following question: "What would you say to someone who thinks education doesn't matter, or that college is a waste of time and money?" United States Senate Youth Program. This program provides a unique educational experience for outstanding high school junior and senior leaders interested in pursuing careers in public service. Two student leaders from each state will spend a week in D.C. [March 3-10, 2018] experiencing their national government in action. All transportation, hotel and meal expenses with be provided. In addition, each delegate will also be awarded a \$5,000 college scholarship for undergraduate studies, with encouragement to pursue coursework in history and political science.
