IN-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The UNC-Greensboro Guarantee is a scholarship that helps NC high school graduates with family incomes at or below the poverty line **graduate from UNCG with little or no debt.** Even more than a four-year scholarship, the UNCG Guarantee is their promise that they will provide recipients with an entire community of support – academic resources, professional & leadership development, peer advising, and a UNCG mentor. Inmar Technology Scholarships are awarded to exceptional students who have a strong interest in majoring in Computer Science at Wake Forest University. Inmar Technology Scholarships, valued at \$10,000 annually, also allow students to earn \$6,400 during the summer and up to \$5,000 through fall and spring semester work study at Inmar. Inmar Technology Scholar must declare a major in Computer Science by the start of the junior year and make satisfactory progress toward the fulfillment of degree requirements each year. Scholars must work at Inmar during summers. The Inmar Technology Scholarship Application is due by January 1 of the senior year of high school. Recipients are notified by late March. TEACHING SCHOLARSHIPS/LOANS

East Carolina University offers <u>The Betty S. Abernathy Scholarship</u>, a four year \$20,000 scholarship to an entering freshmen, intended **science education major**. This scholarship offers students the chance to be involved in a structured learning community, with other education majors and built in faculty and staff support systems. Abernathy Scholars participate in community service and professional development and take in-state and out-of-state trips together to learn about the education systems and history of various cities and states. East Carolina University offers the Maynard Scholarship modeled after the NC Teaching Fellows Program. This four year \$20,000 scholarship is awarded to 10 outstanding high school seniors each year. Recipients will be expected to teach in a public, charter or government school for four years in one of the stated counties following graduation. Individuals have up to seven years to complete this requirement. Maynard Scholars participate in community service and professional development and take in-state and out-of-state trips together to learn about the education systems and history of various cities and states. North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority Forgivable Education Loans for Service [FELS] Program. Qualified students committed to working in North Carolina in fields that have a critical need for more employees, such as nursing, teaching, allied health fields, or medicine, may apply for a FELS loan. The loan program provides financial assistance to help students with their higher education expenses. Prior to receiving funding, recipients must sign a promissory note agreeing to pay back the loan after graduation either by working a year in an approved position in North Carolina for each academic year of funding received or by repaying the loan in cash. Full details of the FELS program, the application, eligibility requirements, award amounts, loan repayment details and listing of qualifying academic programs and institutions can be found at CFNC.org/FELS. NON-SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Agnes Jones Jackson Scholarship Program, administered by the NAACP, awards renewable \$1,500 scholarships to seniors who are current members of the NAACP, U.S. citizens, possess a GPA of 2.5+, and demonstrate financial need. For more than 50 years, the **American Music & Dramatic Academy** [AMDA] has been committed to providing an unsurpassed performing arts education to a diverse community of creative artists. AMDA offers Bachelor of Fine Arts Degrees and Conservatory Programs in the Performing Arts. It has two campuses — one on the Upper West Side of Manhattan and the other in the heart of Hollywood. AMDA offers more than \$10 million of scholarship awards each year. Individual annual awards range from \$1,000 to \$18,000. Scholarships are awarded based on talent, merit, academic excellence and financial need. For more information, visit www.amda.edu. The Association for Women in Mathematics (AWM) Essay Contest is open every year to students in grades 6-8, 9-12, and undergraduate college students. Students enter by completing an interview with a woman currently working in a mathematical career. Students may interview and write about any woman currently working in a mathematical sciences career. Interviews must be 500 to 1000 words in length. Essays will be judged for content, grammar, and evaluated by a panel of mathematicians. At least one student will be selected as a winner. Students may choose to do interviews with women who are math teachers in high school, female math college professors, and female math teachers representing a minority group.

The contest is sponsored by The Association for Women in Mathematics (AWM), a non-profit organization founded in 1971 dedicated to fostering interest in mathematics by women and girls. The organization has more than 3000 members around the world.

The deadline for this scholarship is JANUARY 31, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$500. For more details, visit sites.google.com/site/awmmath/programs/essay-contest

The **Benjamin F. Ward Scholarship**, administered by the Triangle Community Foundation, provides financial assistance to individuals seeking to further their education at a public or private college or university in North Carolina. Applicants must reside in Wake County, demonstrate a commitment to community service and involvement, demonstrate a 2.5+GPA and family financial need. Awards will be valued at \$2,500 per academic year, renewable for up to four years, for a total award of \$10,000 per student. Scholarships can be used for tuition, required fees, textbooks, and room and board. The Book Industry Charitable Foundation (Binc) Scholarship Program is available to bookstore employees, bookstore owners, former Borders employees and dependents of bookstore employees, owners and former Borders employees. To be eligible, you also must be planning to enroll in full or part-time undergraduate or graduate study at an accredited two or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school for at least half of the 2017-2018 academic year. Up to 35 awards totaling \$100,000 will be granted this year! Winners for this scholarship program will be selected based off of three equally weighted factors: 1) Financial need 2) Academic performance 3) Leadership, participation and other non-academic criteria Applications are due in February, 2017, and can be found online at https://www.scholarshipamerica.org/binc/. The **Courage to Grow Scholarship** helps students achieve their higher education goals. By taking away some of the concerns such as "how will I pay for college," students can concentrate on their education and focus on the task at hand. Applicants must be a junior or senior US citizens in high school or college student with a minimum GPA of 2.5 or better. A 250 word essay is also required: Explain in 250 words or less why you believe that you should be

awarded this scholarship. The scholarships awards are \$500. To apply, visit https://scholarships360.org/courage-to-grow-scholarship-2/. The Courage to Grow Scholarship is due on the last day of each month.

DoSomething.org asks students to submit a story about "the craziest thing you did to save money." The winning student will receive a \$4,000 scholarship for college. This scholarship is open to students in high school, college, and graduate school who are below the age of 25. You can apply for this scholarship on the DoSomething.org website. The deadlines vary .

The Engebretson Scholarship Foundation Scholarships are for high school students with excellent academic and leadership accomplishments. The scholarship is renewable annually up to four years. Students who meet all criteria for a Engebretson Scholarship may continue to receive the award until they have earned a baccalaureate degree, or four (4) years. They must maintain their grade point level in order to continue to qualify for scholarships. The scholarship may be used at any accredited four-year college or university approved by the Engebretson Foundation. Eligibility requirements include a ACT or SAT score of 28/1240, a GPA of 3.75, and be in the top 5 percent of their graduating class. Students must be recommended by a teacher. The Engebretson Scholarship Foundation was founded in 2006 in Omaha, Nebraska by the family of the late David J. Engebretson, a prominent businessman. It was his dream to give back, especially to children. The foundation awards scholarship every year to help fulfill Engebretson's dream. The deadline for this scholarship is March 1, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$5,000. For more details, visit www.engebretsonfoundation.org/.

Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising [FIDM] National Scholarship Competition is open to all high school seniors, graduates and college transfer students. The competition is for students with talent in design who submit a project in any one of several areas of fashion and design. Project categories include fashion, interior design, graphic design, visual design, fashion design, digital media and trend spotter. A top winner and three finalists in each category will be chosen from all entrants. Scholarships can be used for tuition, fees, books, and most supplies to attend Fashion Institute of Design and Merchandising. Entries can include any idea that is artistic and creative, such as designing a room, creating a new clothing line, or creating an entire promotion for an event or presentation that includes graphic design and digital media. The scholarships are offered by Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising, a fashion college founded in 1969 in Los Angeles. The school offers programs that prepare students for careers in fashion, graphics, interior design, and entertainment. Hugh Morson Memorial Scholarship. [**Hugh Morson Memorial Scholarship** facilitates Wells Fargo Bank's administration of the Fund.] Applicants must be residents of the City of Raleigh, must demonstrate academic achievement and financial need, and must demonstrate traits of high personal character and leadership. Recipients may attend any accredited, public or private, four-year college or university. Scholarships range from \$1,000-\$2,000 per academic year and are renewable for up to 4 years. Applications will be available online in December at https://www.csascholars.org/index.php . February deadline.

Tall Clubs International Scholarship is offered to students under 21 who are planning to attend college for the first time. It is specifically for tall students who are 5'10" for women and 6'2" for men. TCI recognizes that tall people, especially youth, may have diminished feelings about their height. The scholarship encourages students to look at themselves as vertically gifted, not just tall. The scholarship also rewards students for pursuing their post-secondary education. The scholarship is offered by Tall Clubs International, a non-profit organization based in Las Vegas, Nevada, that creates awareness that tall people have problems, too. It is a social organization for tall people. Through local clubs across the country, the organization unites tall people in social events, travel, and conventions where they can foster mutual respect and admiration for tall people. Eligible students may request an application online, or they may search for a club nearest to them and apply. Clubs are available in 26 U.S. states as well as Canada.
