AABE Scholarship. The North Carolina Chapter of the **American Association of Blacks in Energy** offers scholarships ranging from \$1,000-\$3,000 to underrepresented minorities [African Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans] seeking financial assistance for post-secondary education. Applicants must have a 3.0+ GPA and be planning to major in business, engineering, environment studies, mathematics or physical sciences [astronomy, chemistry, geology, mineralogy, meteorology, physics]. The **American Bicycle Association** is proud to announce the release of the 2016 Bob Warnicke Memorial Scholarship Application. The Bob Warnicke Memorial Scholarship Fund was created to assist students and their families in meeting the costs of undergraduate college education, trade school, etc. USA BMX/BMX Canada members who have a current USA BMX/BMX Canada license or Track Operators/Officials who participate in BMX racing events sanctioned by USA BMX/BMX Canada are eligible to apply. In 2015, the Warnicke Scholarship program awarded \$75,000 to 74 individual students with BMX backgrounds - selected from 76 applicants. As more tracks and riders get involved in the Warnicke Scholarship races, the number and amount of scholarships awarded will only grow. Scholarship applications must be submitted by March 6, 2017 to be considered. The Scholarship Committee will review the application materials and select the deserving applicants. The awards will be

American Legion's Colon Furr Memorial Nursing Scholarship (\$600 Award). This scholarship is Open to any permanent legal resident who resides in North Carolina and has been accepted to or is enrolled in a 1 year Licensed Practical Nurse Program or who is enrolled in a 2, 3, or 4 year program that leads to certification as a Registered Nurse is eligible for this scholarship. The school must be in North Carolina. Applications are also available in the guidance office. Transcripts and three letters of recommendation are required to be submitted with the application. Selection process will occur at the Fall Conference in October. Applications must be received at Department Headquarters on or before September 25, 2017.

Caremark's Eric Delson Memorial Scholarship. Created to support and encourage education for **students with bleeding disorders**. Applicants must be planning to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study at a two or four year school. Award amount is \$2,500. The **Coca-Cola Pay It Forward Scholarship Program** offers scholarship awards and once-in-a-lifetime apprenticeship experiences to African American youth looking to pave the way for their futures. The program is under the umbrella of the Steve and Marjorie Harvey Foundation, and since 2012, the popular talk show host and best-selling author has been providing this opportunity. Partnering with the Coca-Cola Pay It Forward program builds on Harvey's long-term commitment to mentoring youth. His foundation has long hosted mentoring camps for young African-American men. The camps promote educational enrichment, one-on-one mentoring and global service initiatives. Each year, the program impacts 100 youth in five cities across the country. Winning students will get to participate in an apprenticeship allowing them to help with the Steve Harvey Mentoring Program, including working with members of Steve Harvey's team and learning what it takes to run the Steve Harvey Morning Show and Family Feud. They also get an opportunity to meet and be mentored by Steve Harvey himself. The winning student will also be awarded a scholarship to help pay for college tuition. The program is open to both teens and young adults between the ages of 16-21. Nominators must be 16 years of age or older. Eligible youth also may nominate themselves. Winners will be selected and contacted within two months after the deadline. **The deadline for this scholarship is May 15, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$5,000. Fund II Foundation UNCF STEM Scholars Program is open to African American students pursuing careers in the STEM fields—science, technology, engineering and mathematics. The Scholars Program includes scholarships, internships, mentoring and other tools to help African American students reach their goals. The scholarship is open to African American high school seniors planning to attend college as freshmen and will cover up to 5 years of college. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or above and high academic performance in math and science. They must also have demonstrated financial need. To apply, students must complete all essays, include a description of all student leadership and community service activities, and send two letters of recommendation. Eligible majors include Biological/Life Sciences, Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science/Engineering, Engineering (industrial, electrical, mechanical, chemical), and Mathematics. The Fund II Foundation UNCF STEM Scholars Program is a \$48 million initiative aimed at addressing diversity gaps in the STEM fields. The scholars program was created as a pipeline that will prepare African American students for careers in technology and innovation. **The deadline for this scholarship is February 23, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$20,000. GlaxoSmithKline Opportunity Scholarships. These scholarships, administered by the Triangle Community Foundation, offer residents of Durham, Orange, or Wake County, **who have overcome significant adversity**, the opportunity to pursue their dreams and improve their lives through education or training. Applicants must be eligible to receive North Carolina resident tuition costs and must demonstrate the potential to succeed despite adversity as well as an exceptional desire to improve him or herself through further education or training. Due to

the nature of the scholarship, high school students seeking general scholarship assistance are discouraged from applying unless they have faced significant adversity. There are no limitations on age, income level or previous education. Similarly, there are no limitations on the course of study or type of education or training program the applicant is planning to pursue. Awards may be up to \$20,000 and all applications must be submitted by using the Foundation's **online system** at <http://trianglecf.org/scholarships-awards/>. Deadline: March 15, 2017. Applicants will create a profile, upload completed application forms and required attachments, and will provide the names and email addresses of recommenders (if applicable). Recommenders will be notified by email through the portal and will be asked to submit their recommendations online by each scholarship deadline. Generation Google Scholarship. This is a new program for aspiring computer scientists to excel in technology and become active role models and leaders in the field. Selected students will receive \$10,000 a year for up to four years as long as they maintain criteria for renewal. Recipients will also be invited to attend Google's Computer Science Summer Institute. Applicants must be African American, Hispanic, American Indian, Female, or a Person with a Disability and be planning to enroll in a baccalaureate Computer Science, Computer Engineering, Software Engineering, or related program. They must also have a 3.2 GPA and have participated in at least one K-12 outreach activity to promote the study of CS. Josh Gibson Foundation Scholarship is offered every year to high school students planning to attend either a college or university or a technical school. Students must have a strong academic record and demonstrate active participation in their communities. Candidates must have a grade point average of 3.0 or above to apply. The scholarship is based on good grades, community involvement, and knowledge of the history of the Negro Baseball League. Applicants will be required to write a 500-word essay on the topic. The Josh Gibson Foundation is a private, nonprofit organization based in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. It was established in 1994 in honor of Josh Gibson who was known as the *Black Babe Ruth* and played for the Negro League's Homestead Grays. He ranks second to Satchel Paige as the best-known Black player. The purpose of the foundation is to provide scholarships and other educational resources, as well as athletic programs, to help youth reach their potential. Other programs provided by the foundation include mentoring, cultural programs, and after-school programs for youth in the Pittsburgh public schools. **The deadline for this scholarship is April 7, 2017, and the award amount VARIES. Louie Family Foundation Scholarship is open to high school seniors planning to attend a U.S.-accredited college or university. Qualifying students must demonstrate financial need, disabilities, have overcome great adversities in their lives, or whose parents are in the military. Students must have a grade point average of 3.4 or above, a SAT score of 1800, or a ACT score of 25. In addition, they must have outstanding personal achievements and leadership qualities demonstrated through helping their communities. Applicants may attend either a two-year or four-year college or university or vocational school in the U.S. The scholarship is sponsored by The Kim and Harold Louie Family Foundation which was established in 2005 by Betty B. Louie in honor of her parents. The scholarship is one of many foundation programs which assist the sick and disabled. Ms. Louie co-founded a company that is a leading provider of disability evaluation services. The foundation awards 25 scholarships a year to deserving students. **The deadline for this scholarship is MARCH 31, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$4,000.
