#### **TEACHING SCHOLARSHIP**

**Hammond-Hill Scholarship [Alpha Delta Kappa /Beta Omicron Chapter].** This \$2,000 scholarship is awarded to a Wake County senior planning to pursue a degree in education. April 10<sup>th</sup> deadline. Applications are available In the Guidance Resource Center, Room 1209.

The **Dr. James E. Hedrick, Jr. Memorial Scholarship,** a one-time scholarship, is being offered for high school seniors graduating in June 2017 with an interest in pursuing a career in education, with special emphasis given to future educators with a strong interest in **athletic coaching.** The awards, which may vary in size from \$1,000 up to \$5,000 in value, will be announced in May 2017. Award checks will be issued in June 2017, and these checks will be made payable to both the scholarship winner and the winner's post-secondary school. Therefore, the student(s) receiving these scholarships will need to work with the Bursar's office at their post-secondary school to ensure that the funds are appropriately applied to the student's account. Please work on your initial draft of the scholarship application outside of the Survey Monkey tool, as Survey Monkey will only allow you to submit one application. You cannot save your progress and come back to the application, but rather it must be done all in one sitting once you've opened the Survey Monkey tool. For ease of application, we recommend that applicants consider writing responses in Word for the entire question set. Give yourself a chance a review and edit while your responses are still in Word. Once you're satisfied with the response, then copy and paste them into the Survey Monkey application tool.

The application tool will close on Sunday, April 16th, 2017, at 9pm. This is the evening before traditional WCPSS students return to school from Spring Break. No late applications will be accepted. Applicants will be informed of scholarship decisions via email no later than close of business on Friday, May 5th, 2017. All decisions of the scholarship awards by Wake County PTA Council will be final and not open to further review or discussion. Online Application Deadline: 9pm on Sunday, April 16, 2017. Only online submissions accepted. No paper applications will be reviewed. # NON-SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

**American Indian College Fund** offers a \$10,000 Ford Motor Company Scholarship, a \$10,000 Morgan Stanley Scholarship, and a \$5,000 United Health Foundation Scholarship to American Indian/Alaskan Native students planning to attend a mainstream university. The Fund has recently converted to a complete online application requiring one application to apply for all scholarships. The **Development Fund for Black Students in Science and Technology** (DFBSST) Scholarship is open to African-American undergraduate students who enroll in scientific or technical fields of study at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). The scholarship can be renewed annually for up to four years. Applicants must be African American students who plan to enroll or are already enrolled at one of the participating predominantly Black colleges or universities and who are majoring in a technical field of study, such as science, technology, engineering or mathematics. Applicants are evaluated first on academic achievement, career goals and extracurricular activities, recommendations from teachers, and financial need. All students applying must be full-time students, and they must maintain their academic standing in order to renew their scholarship annually for up to 4 years of college. Students may apply by requesting an application from one of the 20 participating colleges. The Development Fund For Black Students in Science and Technology is a non-profit organization based in Washington, D.C. who helps black students achieve their career goals in technical fields. Since its beginning, the organization has awarded over \$383,000 in scholarships to 140 students pursuing an education in science and technology. The application is available April 15<sup>th</sup> and the deadline for this scholarship is JUNE 15th of each year, and the award amount is usually \$2,000.For more details, visit www.dfbsstscholarship.org/dfb\_sch.html .

The **Mesothelioma Center**, an organization dedicated to spreading awareness about mesothelioma and the dangers of asbestos, is offering a new scholarship biannually to students who bring awareness to asbestos-related cancers. One recipient will be selected each semester for a scholarship valued at \$5,000. The spring semester deadline is January 20th, and the fall semester deadline is August 18, 2017. NICHE Scholarships are offered every month throughout the year and are open to all high school students and college students. One scholarship is offered every month. High school and college students, as well as anyone looking to attend college or graduate school in the next year, may apply. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or legal residents of the U.S., or international students with valid visas. Eligible students may apply once each month. No minimum GPA is required; winners are randomly drawn each month. Scholarship money can be used to cover tuition, housing, books, or any education-related expenses. Scholarship winners are contacted directly and announced in Niche's e-newsletter and on the Scholarship Winners page. Scholarship money goes directly to the winner. Niche is a website that provides information on schools and neighborhoods. The company analyzes public data and millions of reviews to produce comprehensive rankings, report cards, and profiles for every K-12 school, college, and neighborhood in the U.S. The deadline for this scholarship VARIES each year, and the award amount is usually \$1,000.

**North Carolina Strawberry Association Scholarships.** The scholarship program accepts applications for seniors accepted to a land grant university who are interested in or have declared a major in a program of study directly related to the strawberry industry [small fruit production, marketing, food science, nutrition, entomology, agronomy, etc.]. The **Shawn Carter Foundation Scholarship** provides financial support to high school students as well as undergraduate students entering college for the first time. The purpose of the scholarship is to help under-served students who may not be eligible for other scholarships. Students who have either graduated from high school or earned their G.E.D. may apply. Minimum grade point average is 2.0. Students must have a strong desire to go to college and earn their degree. Students must also have a desire to give back to their communities. The scholarship fund was established by Gloria Carter and and her son Shawn Carter (better known as rapper/ business mogul Jay-Z) to offer a unique opportunity to students who have been incarcerated or faced particular life challenges but still want to pursue higher education. The program gives them a chance that most other programs do not offer. The Carter Foundation is a firm believer in helping young people not only reach their career goals but also establish a secure future. Students up to age 25 may apply. The scholarship can be used for tuition, room and board, books, fees and other college-related expenses. All high school seniors, undergraduate students at two-year or four-year institutions and vocational or trade school students are eligible. **The deadline for this scholarship is April 30, 2017, and the award amount is usually \$1,500 - \$2,500. **Taste of Soul Verizon Scholarships** are offered to high school seniors who plan to attend full-time a four-year college or university or a community college. Eligible students must be committed to providing outstanding community service and leadership in the areas of education, healthcare, domestic violence prevention or sustainability. Students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.5 and complete a 500-750 word essay on the subject of community service. The essay must explain how important community service is to the student and what they have done to serve their community during high school. To apply, students must submit a completed application, along with a resume and two letters of recommendation. One of the letters must be from someone who can vouch for the student's involvement in volunteer service within their community. The scholarship is sponsored by Bakewell Media's Taste of Soul in partnership with the African American Unity Center, a non-profit organization that helps improve social and economic conditions for families in southern Los Angeles. Taste of Soul is a popular, annual food event featuring African-American foods which was founded by Danny Bakewell, President of the National Newspaper Publishers Association and President and CEO of Bakewell Media.
