## STUDENT ANNOUNCEMENTS [JUNIOR & SENIORS]

A rep from the Honors College at East Carolina University will be at Broughton this Thursday, September 1<sup>st</sup>, at 8:15am. Seniors planning to attend ECU next year who have a **weighted 4.0+ GPA along with a minimum math/critical reading combined score of 1200 on the old SAT, and/or minimum composite score of 1270 on the new SAT, and/or minimum ACT composite score of 27** are invited to attend. To meet with the rep, sign up today or tomorrow in the Guidance Resource Center [Room 1209].

Although the ACT will be administered at Broughton on Saturday, September 10, both the regular registration deadline and the late registration deadline have passed. You can still try to test STANDBY by going to [www.actstudent.org/start](http://www.actstudent.org/start).

The registration deadline for the October 22 ACT is September 16. To register, go online at [www.actstudent.org/start](http://www.actstudent.org/start). This year the test fee for ACT [No Writing] is \$42.50 and the fee for ACT [With Writing] is \$58.50.

The registration deadline for the October 1<sup>st</sup> SAT is September 1, 2016. To register, go online at [www.sat.org/register](http://www.sat.org/register). The SAT fee is \$45 or \$57 with Essay. The Subject Test fee is \$26 + \$20 for each non-listening subject test or \$26 + \$26 for each listening subject test. Visit [www.sat.org/practice](http://www.sat.org/practice) to take the Official SAT Practice test.

Don't let **test fees** hold you back from taking the SAT/ACT or applying to college. Fee waivers are available to students for whom payment of SAT & ACT fees may be a barrier to testing and applying for college. Check with Dean Sauls in Student Services to see if you qualify.
