Wake County Public School System will offer the PSAT on Saturday, October 15, 2016. Broughton High School will be a Test Administration site. The deadline to register for the PSAT test is Friday, September 16th. Students must register by the deadline to be allowed to take the PSAT. Your student may register with our counselors at Broughton before school, during both lunches, and afterschool outside of the Student Services Department. Please understand that there is an administration fee of \$15.00 that will be due by the day of the test. Checks should be made payable to Broughton High School. The Wake County Public School System will pay for 11th grade students who have achieved a minimum 4.5625 GPA.

Any freshman who is interested in applying to serve on the Freshmen Class Council or Freshmen Executive Cabinet may pick up an application in room 2402 before school, during 1st lunch, or after school. A **Wake County College Fair** has been scheduled for **Sunday, September 18th**, from 2:00-4:30PM at the NCSU McKimmon Center on Western Blvd. Over 100 colleges will attend to discuss college admission with local high school juniors and seniors. Financial Aid Sessions will be held at 2:45 & 3:45, and Preparing for College Sessions at 2:30 & 3:30. Admission and parking are free. Davidson College invites top ranking seniors to a fall fly-in Multicultural Visit Program (MVP) held **October 30-November 1, 2016**. Visiting students will arrive Sunday afternoon for a two-night visit and will return home on Tuesday evening. In addition to staying overnight in a residence hall, students will attend a class and interact with current Davidson students, faculty, and staff. Priority will be given to students who have not yet had the opportunity to visit campus. Davidson College will cover the direct expenses associated with a visit to campus for each student, including airfare to and from the student's home airport and Charlotte, ground transportation to and from campus, meals during the visit, and overnight accommodations. The admission committee will review submitted applications and notify students if additional information is required. **The deadline for application submission is Friday, September 16.** Decisions will be communicated no later than Friday, September 30. Space is

limited. We will select approximately 35 students to participate. If a student accepts our invitation to visit and then chooses to cancel after air travel tickets have been purchased, the student and his or her family will be responsible for reimbursing the school the cost of the ticket.
