Senior Scholar Athletes Considering Davidson College: Broughton has been asked to nominate up to three athletes for the **Bryan Scholarship** [valued at \$30,000 annually]. Senior Scholars Considering UNC-Chapel Hill: Broughton has been asked to nominate up to four high-achieving scholars for the **Morehead-Cain Scholarship**, one of the most highly selective of the undergraduate merit scholarship programs in the U.S. Seniors interested in being nominated may pick up applications in the Guidance Resource Center. Seniors Scholars Considering NCSU: Broughton has been asked to endorse up to two high achieving scholars for the **Park Scholarship**, a four-year scholarship valued at \$107,000 including the full cost of education, funding for a personal computer, educational trips, retreats, seminars, and grant opportunities. Students interested in being endorsed by Broughton may pick up applications in the Guidance Resource Center. Completed requests must be returned by noon on Monday, September 12th.

Any summer hours turned in after this date will not be accepted.

Want a Student ID for 2016-17? Want your picture in the Yearbook? You must have a student photo taken on either of the following dates: Underclassman pictures will be taken Monday, September 12th during the school day. MAKE UP day for senior picture will be Monday, October 3rd during the school day.

Although the ACT will be administered at Broughton on Saturday, September 10, both the regular registration deadline and the late registration deadline have passed. You can still try to test STANDBY by going to www.actstudent.org/start.

The registration deadline for the October 22 ACT is September 16. To register, go online at www.actstudent.org/start. This year the test fee for ACT [No Writing] is \$42.50 and the fee for ACT [With Writing] is \$58.50.

The registration deadline for the October 1st SAT is September 1, 2016. To register, go online at www.sat.org/register. The SAT fee is \$45 or \$57 with Essay. The Subject Test fee is \$26 + \$20 for each non-listening subject test or \$26 + \$26 for each listening subject test. Visit www.sat.org/practice to take the Official SAT Practice test.

Don't let **test fees** hold you back from taking the SAT/ACT or applying to college. Fee waivers are available to students for whom payment of SAT & ACT fees may be a barrier to testing and applying for college. Check with Dean Sauls in Student Services to see if you qualify.
