## COMMUNITY SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

Each Broughton student must perform 25 hours of community service per year; and students who perform an additional 25 hours during their four years at Broughton will receive a silver honor cord at graduation. The community service form may be downloaded from the BHS website.

Join fellow citizens and commemorate the 15th anniversary of 9/11 by volunteering during the 9/11 Weekend of Service coordinated by Activate Good with support from the City of Raleigh and Triangle Area Businesses. On Friday, September 9 and Saturday, September 10, businesses, groups, and individuals will honor those lost on 9/11 with volunteerism and acts of kindness at over 100 projects around the Triangle. It does mean that you will be missing some class time [never an entire period] so be selective! If you can't attend because of a scheduled test or lab, see Mr. Rudder afterwards to get copies of the handouts.**

Want a Student ID for 2016-17? Want your picture in the Yearbook? You must have a student photo taken on either of the following dates: Underclassman pictures will be taken **Monday, September 12<sup>th</sup>** during the school day. MAKE UP day for senior picture will be Monday, October 3<sup>rd</sup> during the school day.

Although the ACT will be administered at Broughton on **Saturday, September 10**, both the regular registration deadline and the late registration deadline have passed. You can still try to test STANDBY by going to [www.actstudent.org/start](http://www.actstudent.org/start).

Don't let **test fees** hold you back from taking the SAT/ACT or applying to college. Fee waivers are available to students for whom payment of SAT & ACT fees may be a barrier to testing and applying for college. Check with Dean Sauls in Student Services to see if you qualify.

**Senior Scholar Athletes Considering Davidson College:** Broughton has been asked to nominate up to three athletes for the **Bryan Scholarship** [valued at \$30,000 annually]. Two Bryan Scholars, one male and one female, are chosen for each incoming class. Seniors who wish to be considered for nomination should see Mr. Rudder in the Guidance Center, Room 1209. Completed requests must be returned by **Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup>**.

**Senior Scholars Considering UNC-Chapel Hill:** Broughton has been asked to nominate up to four high-achieving scholars for the **Morehead-Cain Scholarship**, one of the most highly selective of the undergraduate merit scholarship programs in the U.S. Seniors interested in being nominated may pick up applications in the Guidance Resource Center. Completed applications must be returned by noon on **Monday, September 12<sup>th</sup>**.

**Seniors Scholars Considering NCSU:** Broughton has been asked to endorse up to two high achieving scholars for the **Park Scholarship**, a four-year scholarship valued at \$107,000 including the full cost of education, funding for a personal computer, educational trips, retreats, seminars, and grant opportunities. Students interested in being endorsed by Broughton may pick up applications in the Guidance Resource Center. Completed requests must be returned by noon on **Monday, September 12<sup>th</sup>**.
