### Pyeong Chang, South Korea 2018 Winter Olympics

It may seem like the Olympics are very far away, but it takes a lot of preparation. The 2018 Winter Olympics is 2-5 going to be held in South Korea. They hope that the Olympics will bring back the nations pride. The Olympics is the biggest sporting event of the year. It 6-7 helps bring the entire nation together. During the Olympics the entire world watches and people from all around the world compete in the Olympics. The 10-11 2018 Winter Olympics will be held in Pyeong Chang, South Korea. days. Olympic.org said, "With Pyeong Chang's strategic position in Asia and it's access to a young and growing youth market, the 2018 Olympic Winter Games will no doubt expose new generations of potential athletes to the power of winter sports."

### Louisiana Tornadoes

On February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2017 tornadoes touched down in the southeast part of Louisiana. Seven different tornadoes touched down. At 11:00 A.M the first tornado touched down in Killian, Louisiana. Every tornado that touched down was part of one big storm that swept through Louisiana. There was major damage in some parts of Louisiana. Governor John Bel Edwards declared a state of emergency. At least twenty people were injured. No one died though. Fifteen thousand people were without power. There were gas leaks all around Louisiana. If fire touched gasoline it could cause an explosion.

There are different ways to protect yourself in a tornado. If you buy a weather radio you will get alerts if there is bad weather in your vicinity. When your local weather service issues a tornado warning, you immediately take cover in a small confined area on the first floor in your house. Kids should wear bicycle helmets to protect their heads from flying debris. If you don't have a bicycle helmet you can put pillows over your head. If there is a window in your bathroom you must move to a small closet. Flying glass can be dangerous. Meteorologists use a scale called the Fujita scale to determine how dangerous a tornado is. Refer to Table 1 below.

The TVPRA made it so departments of labor have to publish a list of products produced by forced labor.



There are not just laws being passed to help this issue. If anyone is experiencing forced labor or even just seeing signs of it, they can call the National Human Trafficking Resource Center line, 1 (888) 373-7888. There are also people volunteering at anti-trafficking events. You can join current fundraisers for human trafficking. Human trafficking month is in January and human trafficking day is on January 11th.

### Country Split over South Korean Impeachment By Salma Mourad

On Sunday March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017 the first woman South Korean president, becomes the first democratically elected president to get impeached. President Park Geun-hye was impeached by unanimous vote by the constitutional court. The cause of her impeachment stems from a bizarre scandal. The President and her friend Choi Soon-il both extracted bribes and asked big businesses for donations. Geun-hye leaked private information to Choi Soon-il, and then proceeded to lie about it to cover up her tracks. Samsung itself was accused of giving 37 million dollars to the pair. To make matters worse, Choi Soon-il is the daughter of a Shaman Cult leader, and convinced Geun-hye to stream millions of dollars into the cult, and won favors for her family's Shaman cult.

Outrage has erupted all over the country of South Korea. There has been a multitude in different types of protests some peaceful and others that have ended in fatalities. The more conservative members of society were in support of Geun-hye, while the others were very strongly against her. In the end the President was impeached by a unanimous vote. The citizens of the country were baffled of how Choi Soon-il, someone with no political experience or importance had such a ginormous influence over President Park Geun-hye just because they are good friends. Citizens were overall worried that Choi had a dangerous influence over Park Geun-hye. Half of the country was crying in triumph and others in devastation.

"The negative impact of the president's legal violations is serious, and the benefits to defending the constitution by dismissing her from office is overwhelmingly large" said the Chief of Justice about the subject. This is the country of South Korea's first impeachment after having thirty years of democracy, after breaking off from North Korea. The hope for South Korea is a stop to the violent protests, and for their president to finally find peace and for a new president that will give them justice.

On March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017, President Park Guenhve of South Korea was taken out of office. The Supreme Court of South Korea came to a conclusion; impeach Park Guen-hye. The 8 judges had to make the final decision. Park is the first South Korean president to ever be impeached and elections are being held all over South Korea to elect a new president. A new president has to be elected within 60 days. Justice Lee Jung-mi announced the decision of the Supreme Court on national TV. After the announcement citizens immediately hit the streets of South Korea and people began protesting. Some of the protests were good and some were bad. A selection of people were happy that she was impeached, as many people did not like her methods of being president. Riots broke out and many citizens were injured. Three people have been killed. The other protests that took place were from people that supported Park. Most of South Korea thinks that Park is a common criminal. Park abused her power of president and violated her constitutional duties. The Prime Minister of South Korea, Hwang Kyo-ahn is acting as President until someone replaces Park Guen-hye. Many people were disappointed in her. Guen-hye's father was a former president of South Korea, and he was assassinated in 1979. The media is comparing Park to Trump. Some Americans think that Trump is going to be impeached like Park.

### **Fentanyl Outbreak**

Officials are armed with a new outbreak which is occurring across the nation with an illness known to be called fentanyl. It is also blamed to cause deaths in Europe, Australia, and Africa. Hundreds of people globally are reported to be dying due to taking higher doses than needed to relieve pain. Fentanyl is a powerful synthetic opioid that is said to be the strongest painkiller right now and is highly addictive.



Reports have stated that sometimes fentanyl is stronger than heroin itself. Fentanyl used to be found only in pharmacies, but it is now found in many pills. Hundreds of people globally are dying because fentanyl is 25 to 50 times stronger than heroin and can even be 100 times stronger than morphine. The American black market makes the painkiller widely available.

Consult with a doctor if you are prescribed to use this pain reliever. If used in high doses, respiratory illnesses and death may most likely occur, because fentanyl is combined with other dangerous substances. Stiff muscles and a tight throat are common side effects this drug times into. If you are allergic to other narcotic pain medicines do not use this medication.

Officer D.C. Twiddy, shot and killed twentyfour year old Akiel Denkins on February 29, 2017 on Bragg Street in Raleigh, because he feared Denkins had what appeared to be a handgun. He will not be charged with corruption. Denkins was wanted on felony drug charges, and was shot four times in the back.

Wake County District legal counsel Irving Joyner announced, "We have not had any witnesses who indicated Mr. Denkins had a gun."

Akiel Denkins' family responded that he was a brilliant human being.




Officer Nelson Visits Hornet Headlines Newspaper By Aiden Fine

The Hornets Varsity Team earned eleven medals and the Junior Varsity Team earned eight medals, totaling eighteen medals for the team. Out of the eighteen medals, Holly Ridge Middle produced six first place gold medals, one second place silver medal, and six third place bronze medals. Overall, HRMS came in fourth place, landing a spot in the State Science Olympiad Tournament! Also awarded was the Team Spirit Award given to the team who shows good sportsmanship and has a positive outlook on the situation.

The North Carolina Science Olympiad is an annual competition for K-12 students in our state to compete in all science areas. Events include anatomy, chemistry, geography, biology, medical science, math and engineering. Some tests are done with paper and pencil and others require students to engineer devices to solve problems. More than five hundred teams compete in regional competitions within all science areas, representing schools from all over our state. There are fifteen regional tournaments. For each regional tournament, the top five middle and high school teams advance to the state competition. This year, the state competition will be on Saturday, April 22, 2017 at NC State University.

The forty second annual AT&T American Gymnastics Cup was held on Saturday, March 4<sup>th</sup> for the men and women's divisions at the Prudential Center in Newark, New Jersey. The Cup features eighteen of the world's best gymnast to compete for the all-around title.



Ragan Smith, the 2016 Olympic alternate won for the women's division with an amazing score of 56.099. A 14.400 on the uneven bars, a 13.266 on the balance beam with a fall on her standing back pike full twist, a 14.000 on the floor exercise, and a 14,433 on the vault. She won with nearly two points ahead of second place. Her teammate Riley McCusker had a rough meet with a fall on the uneven bars and a tremendous fall on the beam. She was doing a back handspring step out, back handspring two foot, double back off of the beam, but her foot slipped and on the second back handspring her foot slipped and she smacked her head on the beam, landing on her back. Luckily she was okay and finished off with the floor exercise.

Yul Moldaver, A sophomore from the University of Oklahoma had a win for the men's division. He won with an all-around of an 85.931. A 14,566 on the floor exercise, 14.000 on the pommel horse, a 14.300 on the still rings, a 14.466 on the vault, and a 13.733 on the horizontal bar. He won with three tenths ahead of 20016 Olympic gymnast Oleg Vernialev from the UKR. Sadly Samuel (Sam) Mikulak, former 2012 and 2016 Olympic gymnast, tore his Achilles at the winter cup and was unable to compete.

The Nastia Liukin Cup was the day before, on March 3rd. This was the 8<sup>th</sup> annual named after Nastia Liukin, a five time Olympic medalist, who competed at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing.

### The Warmth of the Blue Lagoon

The Blue Lagoon, located in Iceland, is one of the 25 wonders of the world. It is a giant pool holding 9 million liters of warm water from the depths of the earth. This giant spa is a place for relaxation where you swim and hang out in the warm water. In order to go you must book your visit previously. The air is cold and so it is nice to relax in a hot lagoon.

Anyone can swim and relax in the lagoon located in Iceland. The lagoon was formed in 1976 and people started to bath in it. It is a good way to relax and have fun. 2,000 meters underground freshwater and seawater mix together at really hot temperatures. Holes are then drilled which creates electricity for nearby towns and also creates hot water for the lagoon.

It costs ISK 5400, which is about \$50 in American money for the standard pass. Standard is if you only want to swim. There is also a Comfort, Premium and Luxury pass, which is more expensive. The water temperature is usually 98-104 degrees Fahrenheit. The water is self cleansing- it renews itself every forty hours. BlueLagoon.com states, "The Blue Lagoon

is an oasis of relaxation." The water is actually white but the sun makes it look blue. The water is 0.8-1.2 meters deep (2-3 feet) the deepest point is 1.6 meters deep (5 feet).

There are a few things to know if you want to visit the Blue Lagoon. Since the water is very warm drink lots of water so that you don't get dehydrated. The water can dry out your hair so make sure to put conditioner in it before you go swimming. Remove jewelry because the water can damage it. It is not necessary to wear goggles because underwater nothing is visible. Bring sunglasses for sunny days, the sun can reflect off the water. There are many restaurants and places for dining. The Blue Lagoon in Iceland is a really popular place to visit.

### **Amur Leopard**

The Panthera pardus orientalis or in other words the Amur Leopard is one of the rarest big cats in the world. There are thirtyfive left in the world that's in the wild. The Amur Leopard is going extinct because of habitat loss and poaching. The Amur Leopard is located in North East China, North Korea,



and Far East Russia. Russia has prohibited killing the Amur Leopard because it's at the brink of extinction.

The Amur Leopard lives a lifespan of 10-15 years in the wild, it stands to 2.1-2.6 ft. its mass for males is 71-110lbs, and for females it's 55-94lbs. In length for the male Amur Leopard is 3.4–4.5 ft, and for the females its 2.4-3.7 ft. The coloration for the leopard is a pale color with dark rosettes, which are large and widely spaced with thick unbroken rings. The coloration also changes depending on the season, in the winter it can vary from a fairly light yellow to a dense yellowish-red with a golden tinge or a rusty-red yellow, while during the summer the coloration is brighter with a vivid pattern. Their coat has fairly long and soft fur that is also very thick. Also they have very long limbs that way they can walk around in the snow.

The Amur Leopards diet is roe deer, sika deer, badgers and hares. The Amur Leopard mainly hunts at night and normally have large territories that way they don't have to compete to get food. They silently watch their prey from a distance and then ambush them using a burst of their energy reaching speeds to 35 mph. They then carry their prey, sometimes up a tree where they sleep by it that way no other leopards or other carnivores can take the prey away from them.

#### **Undertale:** Not to be Underrated

Warning! Spoilers ahead! Read if you already completed the game, or read on if you are not able to play the game!

Undertale came out on September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015 and was released on the steam platform for \$10. The game was made by Toby Fox and Temmie Chang with a Kickstarter goal of \$5,000, but reached \$51,000, because the game sold about one million copies in approximately twenty-four hours.

The game takes place in the Underground, where the monsters were sealed in many years ago. The game's year is 201X, and a cut scene shows us a child climbing up Mt. Ebott, and they see a hole that leads to the Underground. They go towards it for a closer look, but they trip and fall in. You, the player, wakes up on a bed of golden flowers, which broke your fall. You control Frisk, a human with a lot of DETERMINATION. You decide to find a way to get home, so you go deeper. You meet flowey the flower, a nice, somehow alive, flower that "teaches" you the ways of the underground. Flowey tricks you by saving to collect his "friendliness pellets" but they do 19 damage to you. Flowey then says "IT'S KILL OR BE KILLED!" Before he kills you, you are rescued by Toriel, a goat mom. She is like the game's tu-Toriel! Her name is a pun, and she tells you that killing is wrong, and asks you to talk to a dummy. This determines which path you go down: the mercy, neutral, or no mercy run. On the mercy run, you don't kill anything. After that, you come into the first fight of the game against a froggit, which is a frog. You either complement it, threaten it, or you can see its stats. Toriel comes and makes the froggit go away.

The game takes six hours to complete. The game is great, but people are forgetting about it. There are theories, YouTube channels about it, and a lot of fan games (about seven truckloads). My favorite fan game is still in development, but there is a demo on GameJolt, the game is called UNDERTALE YELLOW, and the main character is Clover, AKA Justice. The demo is only the dark ruins, which were only made for the game. Check the game out! It's free! Back to Undertale. You exit the Ruins, and enter Snowdin, there, you meet sans and Papyrus, the skele -bros (but if you watched Mat Pat's 3 part theory on the many sides of W. D. Gaster, you will know what I think they are). Papyrus wants to capture you so he can be part of the royal guard, aka the underground. Undyne, the head of the royal guard, wants your soul, which is the 7<sup>th</sup> soul that their king, Asgore, needs to get the monsters out of the underground. Papyrus' traps are easy, and sans' 1 trap is 100% easy. You can just walk past it. Stuff happens, and you end up on a date with papyrus. It's weird, but funny. Next is waterfall, which is super long. Waterfall has a lot of puzzles, but they are easy. There are some special rooms, which you will know by your character being in shadows. These rooms I like to call Undyne rooms because Undyne tries to kill you.

When you finally meet Undyne when she doesn't try to kill you. She starts to tell you the lore, until she screams "SCREW IT!" and takes off her helmet. And, apparently, she is missing an eye. She chases you, but she collapses because you run into Hotland. You pour a cup of water on her, saving her, because she is a fish. You become friends with her by cooking. In Hotland, you meet Alphys, the royal scientist, who made a human-killing robot named Mettaton. He tries to kill you, but you come out fine, a lot of stuff happens, and you end up in the core. You fight Mettaton, and you flip his switch, transforming him into Mettaton EX. You defeat him, and go to Asgore, and apparently, he literally DE-STROYS YOUR MERCY BUTTON! So you need to fight him. You almost kill him, but then you can mercy him. If you do, flowey kills him and absorbs the 6 human souls Asgore has so far. And flowey literally ALT-F4 CRASHES YOUR GAME. When you restart the game, you fight Photoshop flowey, which is hard. You beat him, and you go to the true lab. In there you met amalgamates, which are made of monsters. "Link...you are the light, our light that must shine upon Hyrule once again." E3 of 2014, the date Nintendo officially announced their new game that would give the Legend of Zelda franchise a new perspective. It was said to release in 2015, then delayed



to release in 2015, then delayed to 2016, and the final delay pushed it to March 3rd, 2017 along with launch of the Nintendo Switch. The Wii U would also be able to run this title at 720p and 30FPS. The Nintendo Switch version is the definitive version and the version that more

consumers would go on to buy. This claim is further proven as Nintendo has announced it selling over 1.34 million units worldwide.

When beginning the game you will immediately notice something that separates this entry from previous titles; voice acting. A series first and an amazing addition, every main character has their own unique tone, perfectly fitting their personality. Link on the other hand was not given a voice (other than his usual grunts) which fans were pleased to hear. The game is far-beyond visually pleasing, running as smoothly as any PS4 software. The land of ruined Hyrule is massive this time around, taking Link around thirty three minutes to span its entirety. Different regions exist throughout becoming available when Sheikah Towers are activated. As you traverse Hyrule shrines will be found. Activating these will open up a mini-trial for Link to complete which awards him with a Spirit Orb. Receiving four of these orbs from the slum of 120 different shrines will grant you the option of exchanging them for an extra Heart Container or Stamina Vessel.



A maximum of thirty hearts can be obtained along with three full stamina wheels. Hearts allow Link to take more damage without dying and stamina allows Link to perform more actions before becoming tired, such as when climbing or sprinting. Dungeons can now be completed in any order the player chooses, and a unique item is NOT found throughout your exploring, such as the previous Clawshots or Whip. Link is always equipped with a shield, sword, and a bow and arrows. Each of these items have durability, so using them mindlessly is

not an option this time around. Materials will be found when exploring Hyrule which can be cooked towards meals for Link to consume or be used to upgrade armor. Bonuses from dishes are quite helpful, only certain foods



unlock these abilities. Damage increases, defense increases, stealth increases, speed increases, and heat, cold, shock, and fire resistance are all bonuses that can be cooked into dishes or found in elixirs.

I don't want to spoil all of the game, and secrets need to be found solo, so go out and find them for yourself. Reviewers are rewarding Breath of the Wild a perfect rating, and the game is now said to be the most reviewed title in history. Discover the land of Hyrule in this truly breath-taking video game full of mystery and adventure.


