Requesting Transcripts for

College Applications:

All Official Transcripts are to be requested online at **wcpss.net/transcripts** or through **CFNC**.

Only unofficial transcripts can be mailed to your home. Unofficial transcripts used for application information may be picked up in Student Services.

All transcripts for scholarships are available in Students Services.

CFNC

If you are planning on going to college in North Carolina you may register with CFNC.

You will be able to take virtual tours of over 110 NC colleges, find out about scholarships, loans and financial aide. Important upcoming dates for events are posted.

Transcripts may also be requested through CFNC.

COLLEGE VISITS

FEE WAIVERS FOR ACT AND SAT TESTING

Fee waivers are available for ACT and SAT college entrance tests Eligibility includes public assistance recipients, wards of the state, those living in foster homes, free or reduced lunch recipients, or those who have income within the Bureau of Labor Statistics Low Standard Budget. For specifics concerning your eligibility, please see your school counselor. Applications are available in Student Services.



TEST SCORES

In most cases, universities/colleges require the SAT and ACT scores to be reported directly to them from Education Testing Services (ETS) or ACT. There are two ways to have your scores reported to colleges:

- 1. When you register to take the test, designate which universities/colleges are to receive your scores. All scores will be reported.
- 2. If you have already taken the test and now want the scores sent to a university /college you had not previously designated, you can do so by sending ETS an "Additional Report Request Form." This form comes with your SAT scores or online at sat.collegeboard.org.

ACT/SAT INFORMATION AND TEST DATES:

Students may take one or both for college admission entrance. Registration may be completed online at <u>collegeboard.org</u> and <u>actstudent.org</u>. SATII Subject Tests (formally Achievement tests): Some colleges require subject tests for placement. Contact the college's Office of Admissions for details. <u>Keep all registration information in a safe place so you are able to refer back to your scores and send them to colleges of your choice.</u>

Pre-College Check list for September

- ⇒ Wake Forest High School will communicate information to Seniors and their parents several ways. Make sure to view our Website. wcpss.net/wakeforesths Also on the website, under Student Services (which is under the Students drop down menu) there are two ways to request to be sent electronic information by email and text. Please register for these two valuable tools. The senior newsletter will be delivered to families by email and updates and reminders will be texted by the Remind app. Please make sure to go there and sign up.
- ⇒ Visit Colleges
- ⇒ Prepare portfolios/auditions for any specialty schools
- ⇒ Make an Activity Sheet/Resume
- ⇒ Keep in touch with college admissions counselors
- ⇒ Parents: Submit FAFSA as soon as possible after October 1st. This must be completed in order for your student to qualify for any financial aid. You will use your 2016 tax information . https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/about/announcements/fafsa-changes
- ⇒ Find out which college offers which majors
- ⇒ Narrow your college list to 5-8 schools; if you are having difficulty, do a college search with your counselor or on CFNC.org (North Carolina Schools) or www.college board.org (National Schools).
- ⇒ Register with NCAA if you intend to play Division I or Division II sports.
- ⇒ Pay attention to announcements for scholarship opportunities.
- ⇒ Attend Wake Forest High School Senior Information Night September 6th at 6:30 pm.
- ⇒ Attend Wake Forest High School NCAA Information Night December 8th at 6:30 pm.
- \Rightarrow Stay aware of college entrance exam dates and deadlines. See previous page. Register on line at:

ACT—www.act.org; SAT—www.college board.org

- ⇒ Start filling out your college applications, especially if you plan to apply through an early decision or early action program. Be sure that your counselor and teachers writing recommendations for you are aware of these deadlines.
- ⇒ Pay attention for contact from your counselor. She/he will be meeting with you for your senior interview. Have your post-high school plans ready to discuss!
- ⇒ Finalize your high school activity sheet. Request letters of recommendation from a least 2 teachers. Follow up those requests with thank you and reminder notes.
- ⇒ Provide your activity sheet/resume to your counselor and/or teachers at least 2 weeks prior to application deadline.
- ⇒ Pick up UNOFFICIAL copy of your transcript from Ms. Johnson or your counselor. You will need information on the transcript for your applications.
- ⇒ Be sure your teachers know the due date for their letters of recommendation. Check on their status.
- ⇒ IF you are applying on line, tell your counselor once your application is submitted.
- ⇒ If colleges request official transcripts be sent order them on wcpss.net/transcripts or CFNC.
- ⇒ Listen to morning announcements for visits from college representatives. Remind will also notify you.
- ⇒ Get started on your college application essay.
- ⇒ Many scholarship applications will require an essay. Prepare your essays.
- ⇒ Find out which test (ACT or SAT) the colleges you are interested in prefer. Make sure your scores are sent to them.

THE FOLLOWING TWO SCHOLARSHIPS ARE <u>FULL RIDE TO</u> NC STATE:

PARK SCHOLARSHIPS: The Park Scholarships application is online and is part of the NC State Undergraduate Admissions application. The Park Scholarship is a four year scholarship valued at \$98,000 for in state students and \$166,000 for out of State. Over 40 scholarships are awarded each year. Wake Forest High School's Scholarship committee will be accepting applications for nominations. They can be found on our website or they are available in Student Services. Deadline is September 21st.

GOODNIGHT SCHOLARSHIP: To be eligible you must complete a general NC State application using the wolfPAW system. Select a STEM major or STEM Education major. Students who are invited to apply typically rank in the top 2% of their class, Score above 1400 on the SAT and/or scores above a 32 on ACT and have at least a 3.9 (unweighted) GPA and or 4.8 (weighted). If you do not receive an invitation to apply from NC State and want to self nominate submit your nomination form by December 10th. Forms are available at emas.ncsu.edu/goodnight/how-to-apply/.

FULL RIDE TO UNC CHAPEL HILL:

MOREHEAD-CAIN SCHOLARSHIP: Apply to UNC

(http://admissions.unc.edu/apply by the Early Action Deadline of October 15th to be considered for the Morehead-Cain. Be nominated by the UNC Admissions Office through the Admissions Referral Program. You may also be nominated by your high school or self nominate. Wake Forest High School's Scholarship committee will be accepting applications for nominations. They can be found on our website or they are available in Student Services. Deadline is September 21st.

FULL RIDE TO UNC CHAPEL HILL AND OR DUKE UNI-VERSITY:

ROBERTSON SCHOLARS: Students must apply to Duke or Chapel Hill by the respective Early or regular deadlines. Duke's early decision deadline is November 15, 2016 and regular deadline is January 1, 2017. UNC-Chapel Hill's early action deadline is October 15, 2016 and regular decision deadline is January. Students may self nominate by completing the Robertson online application. Robertsonscholars.org/apply/

<u>VFW Voice of Democracy:</u> A premier scholarship program that is an audio-essay contest for high school students that provides millions in scholarships and incentives. Students compete by writing and recording an audio essay. Keep posted for more information.
