Take a Realistic Approach to Applications

 By September of your senior year, try to have a list of schools you are interested in. Make sure the schools are a mix of:

Dream/Reach Schools- academic credentials fall in the lower end, or even below, the school's average range for the cohort of students accepted the previous year. Dream schools are long-shots, but they should still be possible.

Match/Target Schools- your academic credentials (grades, SAT/ACT scores, etc) fall well within the school's average range for the most recently accepted class. There are no guarantees, but it's not unreasonable to expect to be accepted to several of your match schools

Safety Schools- your academic credentials exceed the school's range for the average freshman. You should be reasonably certain that you will be admitted to your safety schools.
