Table 4. 2008-09 Special/Optional Schools. 350 students are enrolled in 4 special/optional schools. 65.4 percent of students are participating in the Free and Reduced Lunch Program (F&R), and 0.3 percent students are enrolled in English as a Second Language Program (ESL). The overall campus capacity is for 366 students (including 1 mobile classroom), with crowding percent of 95.6%.
