	PBS Module Action Plan	Guide for use during module training as teams begin work; seek clarity and further their knowledge of concepts presented.
1	SST Six Step Process Questions a PBS school might ask	Questions that align PBS to the goals of SST.
2	Pre-SST Interventions Flow Chart	This a flow chart that is helpful to track what steps to take in addressing a student's concerns prior an SST referral.
3	Teacher Interview for Behavior Concerns	To be used in conjunction with Student Support Team requests for students with behavior concerns for teachers.
4	PBS and Functional Assessment Article	Article that demonstrates that PBS and FA are effective in assisting students with challenging behaviors
5	Data Collection Tools and Samples	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ABC Observation • Frequency Counts • Duration Recording • Intensity Recording • Direct Behavior Ratings
6	Student Examples At-Risk Behavior Handouts	This tool describes typical problem behaviors with possible functions and prescribes interventions.

7	Function-Based Intervention Decision Tree	This a graphic that shows you how to decide if a particular problem is a performance or skill deficit and how to choose strategies based on that decision.
8	Pyramid of Interventions Brainstorming Example	Example of a school developing ideas for responding to students with problem behaviors.
9	Triangle of Interventions Example	Example of a school developing ideas for responding to students with problem behaviors.
10	PBS Annual Recognition Application	This is the form necessary for your school to be recognized by the NC DPI.
11	Team Process Evaluation	Subjective feedback tool for teams to use as needed to evaluate team process.
12	PBS In-School Staff Development Planning Guide	Planning form that teams should complete annually as they seek valuable staff development time and resources to deliver PBS training.
13	Training Opportunities	A sampling of trainings that are available to Wake County Public Schools to foster an improvement in school climate, and a paradigm shift towards utilizing positive behavior support.
