

COLLEGE TECH PREP ARTICULATED CREDIT AGREEMENT
Automotive Technology
Wake County Public Schools to Wayne Community College

Articulated credit is credit which is granted in specified courses by Wayne Community College (WCC) to students who have satisfactorily completed equivalent Wake County School (WCS) high school courses. The general conditions and procedures for granting credit by articulation shall be as follows:


1. The student enrolls in a curriculum program within two years after graduating from high school or as approved by the WCC admissions office and department heads.
2. The student enrolled the semester credit is granted.
3. High school courses for which articulated credit is granted must have been completed with the grade and conditions as specified by the courses
4. Students who receive articulated credit will not be required to register and pay tuition for courses for which they receive such credit.

COURSES AND CONDITIONS FOR CREDIT

High School Courses	Conditions for Credit	WCC Course Credits
Automotive Service Technology (7511)	B or above in Fundamentals of Automotive Technology and 80 or higher on VoCats standardized post assessment	AUT 110 Introduction to Automotive Technology
Automotive Service Technology II (7512) and Automotive Service Technology II (7513)	B or above in Automotive Service Technology III and 80 or higher on VoCats standardized post assessment	AUT 151 Brake Systems and AUT 164 Automotive Electronics

This College Tech Prep articulated Agreement between Wake County Schools and Wayne Community College will become effective for students who enrolled at Wayne Community College beginning with the Fall 2002 semester and thereafter.


Wayne Community College agrees to articulate with Wake County Schools for NATEF certification in the remaining areas of ASE instruction.
