MANDATORY SENIOR CLASS MEETING

SENIOR ACADEMIC HONORS DINNER - BY INVITATION

The Senior Academic Honors Dinner will be held in the Spring with the location to be determined. The Date will be announced by January 2026. This event is sponsored by the Broughton Academic Booster Club and is by invitation only for current seniors with Summa Cum Laude designation as of February 2026 (4.25+).

MANDATORY SENIOR ASSEMBLY REHEARSAL

May 27th promptly at 12:45 pm, Seniors will report to the Holliday Gymnasium to rehearse for the Senior Assembly. Instructions will be given for lining up and marching. All Seniors must attend this rehearsal. Work-study students must make arrangements with employers to attend. Cap and Gown are not worn for the rehearsal.

SENIOR AWARDS ASSEMBLY & SENIOR LUNCH

Senior Awards Assembly at 8:45AM

The Senior Awards Assembly is a wonderful time to celebrate our Seniors and their accomplishments with Broughton students and staff.

Seniors should report to their assigned areas at **8:15** am on May **28th** and line up as practiced at rehearsal. **Seniors should wear caps and gowns and suitable graduation attire. No jeans, shorts, flip-flops, sunglasses or tennis shoes** (see section on appropriate attire in graduation information).

Etiquette and Guidelines for Senior Assembly:

- Caps and gowns should always be worn in a dignified manner. Be sure that the gowns are always neatly pressed. Use a cool iron when you press the gown or have it dry-cleaned.
- Caps are always worn straight on the head—not tilted sideways or back. There should be nothing other than the tassel on top of the cap. The tassel is always worn over the right temple until the end of the graduation exercises when the senior class president gives the signal to turn the tassels to the left side.
- At the senior assembly any cords and medals are allowed to be worn.

Senior Lunch

After the Senior Assembly, the PTSA will treat Seniors to lunch in Jack Spain Stadium. Lunch will be provided for Seniors (only).

The Senior Edition of the Hi-Times will be distributed to Seniors during this annual celebratory luncheon.

HANDICAPPED SEATING REQUESTS FOR GRADUATION

Any Senior who has a guest who will require handicapped seating at graduation must complete the Handicapped Seating Request Google Form by 3:00 pm on Friday, May 29th. The google form will be available in March 2026 after the Senior Meeting. The staff contact for questions is Mrs. Amy Merriman.

Handicapped parking will be available in the parking lot beside the Pods for vehicles that have an appropriate handicapped tag displayed.

SENIOR FINES DUE

Senior Fines are due to be paid by May 30th at 3:00pm. Senior fines can include textbooks owed to teachers, uniforms that need to be returned to JROTC, Media Center fines, uniforms to be returned by athletes, money owed for Arts field trips, and any other classroom items borrowed by students.

CANDLELIGHT SERVICE AND LIGHTING OF THE BELL TOWER

Since 2006, this service has brought together family and friends of multiple faiths to celebrate Broughton's senior class. The service includes music, readings, and spiritual reflections offered by students and faith leaders in the community. A candlelight procession to the Broughton front lawn concludes the service and serves as a blessing for the Class of 2026. Following the candlelight procession, Seniors and their families are invited to view the Senior Slideshow projected onto the Belltower. Chairs and blankets for viewing from the front lawn are encouraged.

MANDATORY GRADUATION REHEARSAL & GRADUATION TICKET DISTRIBUTION

Graduation Rehearsal

All graduating Seniors must be in the Holliday Gymnasium in his/her/their assigned seat by 12:45 pm on Thursday, June 10th for graduation rehearsal. Please do not bring caps and gowns to rehearsal. Seniors who plan to participate in the graduation exercises MUST ATTEND REHEARSAL! Seniors who do not attend rehearsal will not be permitted to attend graduation.

Graduation Ticket Distribution

Tickets for graduation will be distributed following the rehearsal. Each senior will receive admission tickets for commencement. Only those guests (including children 1 year of age or older) with tickets (not announcements) will be admitted. Please remember that all financial obligations (Senior fines) must be met in order for a student to receive admission tickets for graduation.

COMMENCEMENT & RECEPTION

Commencement: June 11th (10:00AM)

All graduating seniors should report to their assigned locations at 9:00am on June 13th. Be sure you are dressed appropriately (see dress code section below) with your cap and gown. Handicapped guests can be seated with one (1) escort only to allow room for other guests. Immediately following Commencement, seniors will have an opportunity to sign the bell tower and will then join their families on the front lawn for a graduation reception sponsored by the PTSA.

Graduation Etiquette, Guidelines, and Dress Code

The faculty and staff of Broughton High School want to make your graduation a most memorable experience. We ask for your full cooperation with the dress code for our graduation ceremony. If you have any questions as to the appropriate dress for these occasions, please check with Mr. Sauls, our Dean of Students, in Student Services. Any student, who cannot acquire an item necessary to meet the dress code requirement should discuss this issue with Mr. Sauls. We encourage students, family, and friends to conduct themselves in a way that brings honor and prestige to each student and our school and continues our tradition of excellence.

Etiquette and Guidelines for Graduation:

- Caps and gowns should always be worn in a dignified manner. Be sure that the gowns are always neatly pressed. Use a cool iron when you press the gown or have it dry-cleaned.
- Caps are always worn straight on the head—not tilted sideways or back. There
 should be nothing other than the tassel on top of the cap. The tassel is always
 worn over the right temple until the end of the graduation exercises when the
 senior class president gives the signal to turn the tassels to the left side.
- **Dress Code**: Required to wear dress shoes (no boots, flip-flops, top-siders, or sports-styled shoes), dark dress socks (no white socks), dress shirt with a collar and tie (bow ties are fine), dress slacks (no jeans or shorts), suitable dresses. Please bring several pins if you need to pin your cap on your hair.

- Only official cords and medals that are distributed by Broughton should be worn with the gown.
 - National Honor Society blue/gold; NC Scholar Purple; Silver Community Service; White Service Club; French Honor Society blue/red; Spanish Honor Society red/yellow; German National Honor Society red, black and gold; NHSDA- light blue and white;; IB medal; Presidential Pin pin; Stoles (white) only NBHS Latin Honors; hood new for NBHS (gold); Math National Honor Society (Mu Alpha Theta) light blue and gold; Arts National Honor Society red, blue and yellow.
- Seniors will graduate in alphabetical order. Upon hearing your name called, you
 will walk across the stage and receive your diploma cover. Please note that
 diplomas will not be in the cover. You will receive your diploma after the ceremony
 in the Auxiliary Gym. The diploma cover will be received by the left hand and you
 shake the hand of the principal with your right hand.

**NOTICE: Seniors should have nothing on them except their clothes, cap, and gown. NO ELECTRONIC DEVICES, NO PURSES, NO KEYS OR CHANGE THAT CAN MAKE NOISE, ETC. SENIORS WILL BE CHECKED PRIOR TO THE CEREMONY.

**NOTICE: Seniors should remain quiet at all times and should not get out of line at any time.

Other Important Information

- Doors to Holliday Gymnasium will open at 9:15 a.m. for the ceremony.
- Doors to the Holliday Gym will be LOCKED promptly at 10:00am. Any guests arriving after 10:00 am or any guests who do not have a ticket will need to attend the live-stream of the ceremony in the Diane Payne Auditorium.
- A professional photographer will be taking pictures at graduation. Because the senior class has contracted a photographer to take pictures of each senior receiving a diploma, no other picture-taking near the stage area is permitted.
- All fees, fines, etc., must be paid by the deadlines. Seniors who fail to clear up all
 financial obligations to Broughton High School cannot participate in the graduation
 activities. A student will not receive graduation tickets unless all financial obligations
 have been met. These include fees and fines charged to you and not paid during the past
 four years.
- Each graduating senior will receive 5 admission tickets for graduation. Tickets will be distributed following the Graduation rehearsal to those students who have met all requirements for graduation. There are no additional tickets available. Tickets are required for all individuals aged one (1) and above.
- All diplomas will have your birth certificate legal name. If you would like to be called by your preferred name at graduation please contact your administrator. All preferred names must be submitted and listed in powerschool.
- Seniors will pick up diplomas in the Auxiliary Gymnasium immediately after the Commencement Ceremony.
- Anyone dressed inappropriately will NOT participate in senior activities or graduation exercises.
- Seniors who do not meet graduation requirements will be notified on Tuesday, June 9th.
 Only those seniors who meet graduation requirements are eligible to participate in the graduation rehearsal and commencement ceremony.

- Note of Caution A Broughton High School graduation tradition includes an optional "signing of the bell tower" during the graduation reception. Graduating students may enter into the bell tower in order to sign their names on the belfry walls with markers. This part of the building was never designed to provide access to the general public and as a result the stairs are steep, narrow, with open risers, and without handrails. There is no air conditioning within this space and there are cable conduits which run across the floor and across the steps of the stairwells. Graduating students are welcome to participate in this tradition, but extreme caution should be used while moving about the area. High-heeled shoes are strongly discouraged and under no circumstances are windows to be opened or leaned upon within the belfry.
- All Wake County Public School System School Board Policies must be followed at all times! Students who do not follow the appropriate code of conduct during graduation will have their diploma pulled, and they will not receive it. Additionally, the principal may not allow students to participate in commencement if they do not abide by the Code of Student Conduct prior to graduation.
- Please make wise choices that are respectful of your health and safety as well as that of your classmates and others attending graduation

Final Exam Exemptions for Seniors

Seniors may be exempt from exams based on the following criteria:

- Students must have a projected final grade of B or higher;
- Students must have 10 or fewer absences in the course (includes excused and unexcused absences)
- Students cannot be exempt from state testing including field testing
