Student Council Requirements:

-Students must complete the Applicant Packet

The packet is four pages long and includes: *Teacher Recommendation Form, Parent Permission Form, Application (Part 1), Application (Part 2).* **THE FOUR PAGES MUST BE STAPLED AND SUBMITTED TOGETHER!**

-Students running for office must have the *Teacher Recommendation* form signed by all current teachers -Students may not handout any food or candy.

-Students may display up to 3 posters around the school. Posters should not cover any doorways, student work, or signs. After the election, take down your posters.

-Students must be able to attend every meeting

-Student Council Officers must maintain good academic standing while in office

-Students must have transportation to meetings

-Parents must fill out a permission form for students to run for office

-Students must be of high character and a good role model for all students at Hilburn Academy

VICE-PRESIDENT- Must be in 7th Grade

•Work closely with the president to be fully aware of his/her role and responsibilities in the event of his/her absence and/or to assume the role per his/her direction. The president may assign the vice-president to reside at the meetings, general or executive board.

•Collaborate with PTA and attend meetings if invited during the school year.

•Actively plan and participate in fundraising.

•Exhibit exemplary behavior, leadership and acceptable academic standards.

TREASURER- Any Grade

Some of the jobs of Treasurer position include:

•Assist the Student Council in the conduct of its business.

- •Responsible for reporting on a monthly basis the income and expenditures of student body monies.
