With new technologies that continue to change the world in which we live comes many new and positive educational benefits for classroom instruction. To encourage this growth, Brooks Museums Magnet Elementary wants you to bring your own device (BYOD).

Definition and Purpose of "Devices"

BYOD technologies are privately owned, wireless, and portable electronic devices that can be used for wireless internet access, word processing, image/video capturing, sound recording, and information transmitting. Please note that portable gaming devices (i.e. Playstation and Xbox units) will not be supported by our wireless network and should not be brought to school.

Brooks Museums Magnet Elementary School believes that BYOD will allow students to enhance critical thinking skills through collaboration with peers. We are looking forward to seeing creativity blossom as students develop stronger communication skills through engaging and challenging projects that will require the use of 21st century skills. It is not about the devices themselves, but rather, it is about embracing them as a tool for enhancing great instructional practices.

Brooks Museums Magnet Elementary School will continue to develop rigorous technology-integrated lessons to enhance student learning and teach about responsible use and digital etiquette. Teachers are facilitators of instruction and will not spend time fixing technical issues with personal devices in the classroom. They will educate and provide guidance on how to use devices for learning, but technical support is the responsibility of the parents. Teachers will regularly communicate information regarding educational apps that parents may choose to download to their child's personal devices at home. Students unable to bring own devices to school have ample access to technology available at Brooks Museums Magnet Elementary School.

Security and Damages

r any device that is stolen or damaged.

Responsibility to keep the device secure rests with the individual owner. Teachers are required to lock the doors when leaving for lunch, MIT's, recess, etc. to ensure limited access to the classrooms. We strongly suggest using protective cases for easy identification, differentiation, and protection of personal devices. If a device is stolen or damaged, the situation will be handled accordingly.
