Important Dates:

Now-January 30: Magnet School Application Period (If your child is planning to apply to a magnet high school, he/she will need to complete an application online. If you have questions about magnet schools, please contact your child's counselor or review information on the WCPSS website.)

February 13th and February 19th: PHMS Rising 9th Grade Parent Meeting: The Nuts and Bolts of the High School Transition [Feb 13: 6 PM and Feb 19: 9:30 AM] *See attached flier

February 21st – **March 6**th: WCPSS Transfer Period (If you are requesting your child attends a school other than your assigned base school. Please see the WCPSS website for more information.)

February 11th-March 27th: High School Registration at Pine Hollow (The counselors will be conducting 2 classroom lessons with all 8th grade students to facilitate the registration process.)

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Registration Details at PHMS

We will be meeting with your child twice in the next two months. See below for exact dates.

In the first lesson, we will be reviewing high school courses, starting four year plans, and selecting 9th grade courses. After the first lesson, your child will come home with a red folder. It will include course selections, high school information, and a signature sheet for permission to register at school. In the second lesson, students will be completing high school registration online through Powerschool.

In between the first and second lesson, we highly recommend that you sit down with your child to review his/her 4 year plan, teacher recommendations, and 9th grade course selections.

- The 4 year plans are <u>not</u> permanent, but they should serve as a guide to help your child see how many courses he/she needs, how each year might look, and how to fit in all of his/her desired classes.
- Teacher recommendations will be entered in Powerschool by February 21st. Your child can log-on to Powerschool to review these recommendations while selecting 9th grade courses. **We highly recommend that your child follows his/her teacher recommendations.**
- Students will select 9th grade courses on paper. If they have a parent-signed sheet and their choices at their second lesson date, they can register online. We highly recommend that students register with us so we can troubleshoot problems, double check to ensure the right courses were selected, and answer any questions. Students will be registering on Powerschool and the registration window is February 21- Mar 27. Please note: **There is NO benefit to registering early.** The high school pulls the course selections in April by grade level to start the class selection process. Please have your child take his/her time selecting courses as schedule changes can be difficult at the high school level.
- Please encourage your child to view their base high school's website. The student services link contains information about specific classes, course rigor, and additional information about the transition to 9th grade.
