

SCHOOL NURSE

- Delegation Model of Care
- School Nurses in Wake County are employed by Wake County Human Services, Wake County Public Schools and serve 2-3 schools each.
- Nurses provide services 2-3 days per week in each school.
- One goal of School Health Services is to keep all students healthy and safe in order to improve attendance and educational outcomes.

- X Must be current.
- X The parent, guardian or responsible person has 30 calendar days from the first day of attendance to present the required written proof of immunizations. The child CAN be excluded from school until proof is provided.
- X If you have any questions about your child's immunizations please contact the school prior to the start date.

KINDERGARTEN HEALTH ASSESSMENT(KINDERGARTEN PHYSICAL)



- X The parent, guardian or responsible person has 30 calendar days from the first day of attendance to submit the required health assessment form to the school.
- **X** The child CAN be excluded from school until proof of the assessment is provided.
- X Contact the school nurse for:
 - X Chronic illness, diabetes, asthma, severe allergies, seizures, etc.
- X Contact the nurse to set up a medical plan if your child needs accommodations due to medical conditions BEFORE school starts.
- X It takes time to set up these plans and they cannot be put into place on campus until they are set up formally. Please arrange this before your child starts school.







MEDICATIONS

- X Medications will be administered at school ONLY if a Physician Order for Medication form, 1702 is completed, signed by physician and parent and is in the possession of school officials.
- X These forms are available at the front office.
- X The Medication form and the pharmacy label information must match!







- ALL medications must be brought to school by parent/guardian.
- X ALL medications must be in the original pharmacy container with original label on it.
- X Parents may bring other medications to be administered at school such as cough drops, Motrin or poison ivy creams, etc. ONLY if a Physician Order for Medication form, 1702 is completed, signed by physician and parent and the medicine is in its original container.







WHEN SHOULD I KEEP MY CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL? Children should be kept home from school with:







- Fever of 100.4 or higher (Should be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school).
- X Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- X Severe headache
- **X** Red, watery eyes with yellow drainage
- X Undiagnosed rash

KEEPING YOUR CHILD HEALTHY

- Children learn best when they eat a healthy breakfast and receive adequate sleep. Five year olds require 10-11 hours of sleep every night.
- X It is important for your child to attend school daily and to be on time.
- X Studies show that frequent hand washing prevents colds and flu.
- X Instruct your children in good hand washing techniques.








THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE (WEST)

DID YOU KNOW?

- Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just one or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences and tardiness can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and college.



THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE (WEST)

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your children to their teachers and classmates before school starts.
- Develop backup plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor or another parent.
- Try to schedule non-urgent related medical appointments and extended trips when school isn't in session.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors and other parents for advice on how to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning.


ATTENDANCE RESOURCES (WEST)

- Regular school attendance is necessary for academic success. Students are urged to be present daily unless there is a valid reason for being absent. Students must be in school every day unless they are ill or there is an emergency that prevents him/her from attending. We prioritize and value instructional time and need every minute to provide students with quality instruction. For that reason, we ask that you ensure your child arrives at school on time and that you refrain from early check-out unless it is an emergency or for a scheduled appointment.



MEDICAL DIET RESTRICTIONS

DRESS CODE(MORTON)

Policy 4316: Student Dress Code

- Please click on the link above to familiarize yourself with the WCPSS Student Dress Code. As the weather begins to warm; we will hold students accountable for adhering to this dress code. Specifically, the yellow highlight below:
- Students must wear clothing that <u>covers their skin from chest to</u> <u>mid-thigh</u> with opaque (non-see-through) fabric in front, back, and on the sides.



(KEEP PERSONAL ITEMS AT HOME (MORTON)

WHAT TO BRING/WHAT NOT TO BRING TO SCHOOL:

- Students should be prepared each day with paper, pencils and other school supplies.
- Any money brought to school lunch money, picture money and book money should be in a sealed envelope with the child's name and the teacher's name on front. Students should not bring extra money to school.
- Students may NOT bring toys or athletic equipment to school. The school is not responsible for lost or damaged personal items. Toys and trinkets like: Rubix cubes, keychains with toys attached, tech decks(mini skateboards), fidgets, spinners, putty/slime, figurines, toy cars, stuffed animals, journals, pens with items that are distracting, excessive accessories (hair accessories, headbands with distracting attachments), slap bracelets, bracelets with toys attached, pop-its, fans, beyblades, cards (Pokémon, baseball, playing cards, etc). Radios (headphones, air pods), and hand-held games or other such items are not allowed.
- To protect our building and furniture, chewing gum is not allowed.

SCHOOL DEVICES (WEST)

Overview of Student Device Program

- The WCPSS Student Device Team partners with schools to ensure that all K-12 students have access to devices.
- Kindergarten students have access to classroom sets of Chromebooks.

K Classroom Devices

 Kindergarten classrooms are provided sets of 20 Chromebooks for students to use while in school only. K Devices are not assigned to individual students and do not go home with any student.

Personal Devices

 Computers/tablets, phones, watches must be in sleep mode and/or theater mode so that screens are off. <u>Phones/computers/tablets must be in backpacks at all</u> <u>times.</u>If items are made visible, they will be confiscated by the administration. Items will be released to parents/guardians only.





ROUTINES AND INDEPENDENCE (ALSTON)

We start building routines and independence in the classroom from day 1. These are some things you can do to help build your child's independence.

- Practice putting things in and out of your learner's backpack. We expect your child to take his/her daily materials out independently each day with reminders.
- Make sure your child can open and close all containers independently. No glass containers!!!
- Make sure your child can use the bathroom and wash their hands independently.
- Practice buttoning and zipping clothes independently.
- Practice tying shoes independently.

DAILY BEHAVIOR (ALSTON)

- Build morning routines to support students before they get to school (Getting dressed, packing backpack, eating breakfast, lots of positive affirmations, etc.)
- Arrive to school on time, and leave student all day (8:45-3:45 PM)
- Practice talking about feelings




