Science	3 Credits	Earth Science, Biology, and Physical Science (or Chemistry)		
Humanities	4 Credits	World History, Civics & Economics, American History I & II		
World Languages	Not required	Not required for graduation. Two years of the same language required for admission to 4-year public universities.		
Health and PE	1 Credit	Health & Physical Education or JROTC I & II		
Electives	10 credits	2 Elective credits or any combination from either CTE, Arts, or World Language		
Total Credits	26 Credits	*Plus 100 hours of community service

# 10th Grade Info

For Promotion to the 11th Grade:

- Earn a minimum of **12** credits
- Pass English II
- Pass at least one of *each* other core (Math, Science and Humanities)

PSAT and Pre-ACT (practice for next year!)

- 10th graders can pay to take the PSAT here at school on **October 16th**
- ALL 10th graders will take the Pre-ACT here at school October TBD

# 11th Grade Info

For Promotion to the 12th Grade:

- Earn a minimum of **18** credits
- Enrolled in ALL remaining classes required to graduate

### Standardized Tests

- 11th graders can pay to take the PSAT here at school on 10/16/19.
- ALL 11th graders will take the the ACT here on campus at the end of February. This score can be used when applying to college.

## Senior Conferences

- Begin September 9th
- Sign up on your counselor's door (beginning Tuesday September 3rd)
- Parents are welcome to attend
- Bring the <u>completed</u> Student
  Self-Assessment and Parent
  Assessment to your appointment
  (copies are at counselor's door)

## Transcripts

- Counselors will review all senior transcripts to make sure you have met the required graduation requirements.
- You will receive directions in Advisory class on how to send <u>transcripts</u>.
- You are responsible for sending your transcript to colleges.
- GPA and rank will be run on the 20th day of school - September 25th.

## Standardized Tests ACT/SAT

- ACT
  - Oct 26th (deadline: 9/20; late: 9/21-10/4)
  - Dec 14th (deadline: 11/8; late Nov 9-22)
- SAT
  - Oct 5th (deadline: 9/6; late: 9/7-9/17)
  - Nov 2nd (deadline: 10/3; late: 10/4-10/15)
- Make sure you know how to log into the websites. Scores must go straight from the testing companies to colleges.
- Select your colleges on the registration site before you test to save money.
- See your counselor if you need assistance with ACT/SAT fee waiver.

# School Hours



- Students should not arrive on campus before 6:55 unless they are under the direct supervision of a staff member.
- Students must leave campus
  by 2:30 unless they are participating in a school-sponsored activity and are under the direct supervision of a faculty member. Doors will be locked.



## School Hours Continued



- Once on campus, students must remain on campus.
- No student can leave campus for any reason without checking out through the Attendance Office (Ms. Manring).
- A parent must be contacted before a student can leave campus.



## Tardy Policy

- Students who arrive between 7:25 – 7:45 will report to the tardy sweep.
- Students who arrive after
  7:45 must check in through the Attendance Office, drop off their note, and obtain an admit-to-class slip.
- Students must have a pass to get into class.
- Missing 20 minutes of class counts as an absence.

- If your bus is late, you will receive a late bus pass.
- Tardiness due to parent tardiness, weather, car trouble, and traffic is <u>not</u> excused per school board policy.

## Attendance

- Absence reports will be produced daily.
- Administrators will meet with students daily.

## Hall Passes

- Must <u>always</u> be a Broughton High School Hall Pass
- Be prepared to present your hall pass to staff members upon request.
- Refrain from disruptive behavior while in the hallways.
- Students are not to leave class during the first ten minutes or the last ten minutes of instruction.



## Lunch

- Students may bring lunch from home or take advantage of Broughton's cafeteria selection.
- To purchase meals in the cafeteria, students must use an identifying lunch number.
- Students may choose to eat in the cafeteria, picnic area or courtyard.
- Students can only enter the small gym from the outside and to play basketball. No food or drinks.



## Lunch Continued

- Students cannot be in the pad area outside the small gym.
- Students cannot be in the breezeway between the cafeteria and main building.
- Only juniors and seniors with an official lunch pass can leave campus at lunch.
- Students who leave campus during lunch without a lunch pass will be subject to disciplinary action.

## Dress Code
