Can you believe our kids are officially **SENIORS**? Our class has an exciting but **busy** year ahead! Be sure to read class and PTSA emails and check the DAB for important deadlines and information.

Senior Fees: Each year, seniors are required to pay a fee to cover graduation expenses. The fee covers all school-supported events like senior breakfast, senior t-shirts, senior assembly and lunch, senior family picnic (student meal only), graduation and reception, caps, gowns, tassels and diploma covers. Because of your generous support of class fundraisers over the last three years, we are able to keep the fee minimal. This year, every senior is required to pay \$40 to cover projected graduation expenses. Please fill out the enclosed senior dues form and return it with a check to Sara Katherine Little or pay by e-check or credit card at <https://seniordues2020.cheddarup.com>.

Meeting with Counselors: Counselors will be meeting with seniors in large groups the first week of school to talk about preparation for post-secondary options, including but not limited to applying to college. In addition, counselors will be inviting all seniors to sign up for a senior conference to discuss their future plans and to talk through the college application process. Parents are encouraged to attend these conferences as well. Please have your senior stop by student services after Labor Day to sign up for a conference with their counselor and pick up a "senior self-assessment" to complete in preparation for their conference. Students that are applying to college during the early application period should make themselves aware of each school's application deadlines, and speak to any teachers they wish to write a recommendation as early as possible.

Many colleges will make their applications available on-line in late July or early August. Be aware that transcripts cannot be mailed or sent to your colleges until the 20th day of school. Please check dates and deadlines to register for ACT and SAT tests.

Underclassmen News: Summer readings, SAT and ACT practices, community service, resume updating, summer programs, and exploring future college options would be profitable. Remember the wonderful online resource that North Carolina has for in-state college exploration: CFNC.org. All students should create an online account if they do not have one.

Incoming Freshmen and New Students to BHS: Freshmen Early Start date is Thursday, August 22nd from 8:30am-11:30am. After scheduled activities, students and parents are free to visit teachers and classrooms as they follow their schedules. Freshmen need to report to the front lawn while new upperclassmen should report to Student Services. Parents will meet in the auditorium at 9am for general information and also questions and answers with Mrs. Ashburn. There will be an additional parent information session from 6-7pm on Thursday, August 22nd as well if parents are unable to attend the morning session.



IMPORTANT SCHOOL INFORMATION

Attendance: At Broughton, we believe every student should be in class every day possible to maximize the learning experience. Please remember that if a student has missed five days of class in a course, the student has missed the equivalent of two weeks of instruction on our A-day/B-day schedule. If a student misses ten days of a class, the student has missed an entire month of instruction. Below is a synopsis of the Wake County Public School System and the Broughton High School attendance policies. Please refer to the *Wake County Parent-Student Handbook* for more information.

Excused absences include illness or injury, isolation ordered by the Health Department, death in the family, medical or dental appointment with prior approval, court when a student is under subpoena, religious observance, and participation in a valid and **pre-approved** educational opportunity. *Request for Excused Absence for Educational Reasons* forms can be found in the front office on the BHS website; approval must be granted three days prior to the trip.

Unexcused absences include, but are not limited to the following: missed bus, oversleeping, car trouble, personal errands, out-of-school suspension, trips without prior approval, and failure to bring a parent note in the allotted time frame.

Absence Procedures:

- Parents are called by PowerSchool each time a student misses a class.
- When returning to school after an absence, students must bring notes from parents or guardians to the Attendance Office.
- Absence notes should include the student's full name, student id#, the date(s) of the absence(s), the reason for the absence(s), valid telephone numbers, and a parent/guardian signature. These absences will be recorded on a spreadsheet that the faculty will receive daily.
- Students have **two school days** to bring a note after an absence. If a student does not bring a note within two days of returning to school, the absence will be marked unexcused (6000.4).
- If a student does not bring in a note indicating a parent/guardian approved an absence, the student will be turned into an administrator for skipping.

Checking out of school: Students cannot leave campus during the school day without permission from parents or guardians, and the school. Students may get permission to leave campus from the Attendance Secretary or from their administrator. Teachers cannot give students permission to leave campus for any reason. (See Attendance Procedures.) Students who are dismissed early for internship, PEPI, modified schedule, etc. may be required to show their schedule when leaving campus.

- No student can leave school for any reason during the school day without checking out through the Attendance Office (Yellow Slip).
- Leaving school for any reason without checking out through the Attendance Office will be considered as an unexcused absence or skipping even if the student returns with a note from a parent or guardian the next day.
- Students are to bring a note from a parent/guardian between 7:25 – 7:55 a.m. to the Attendance Office (date, time, parent signature, valid telephone number(s) and reason for leaving).
- If a parent/guardian needs to check out a student during the day, the parent must come to the Attendance Office to check the student out or call the Attendance Office. If a parent calls to check out a student, the student must bring a note from the parent the next day. No "walk in" checks are permitted between 1:45 and 2:18 p.m.
- Telephone numbers will be called to verify checkouts.
- If a student does not return to school from lunch, a parent/guardian must call the Attendance Office that day. The student must bring a note to the Attendance Office when returning to school.
- If a student becomes ill during the school day, they must have a note from a teacher to come to the Attendance Office.
- Students who check out for dental or doctor appointments must bring proof of the appointment to the Attendance Office when returning to school. Failure to bring proof will result in an unexcused absence.

Arrival/Departure of Students: Students should not arrive on campus before 6:55am unless they have made prior arrangements with a faculty member. Students must leave campus by 2:35pm unless they are participating in a school-sponsored activity or are under the direction of a faculty member.

Student Drop-Off: Student drop-off in the mornings and pick-up in the afternoons are in the main lot at the front of the school. Cars should enter the 4th (last) school entrance on St. Mary's Street heading towards Peace Street. Do not block St. Mary's traffic by trying to make a left turn into this lot! Cars should enter the lot from St. Mary's Street, pull around to the front steps, drop off students and exit onto Peace Street. Peace Street is for exiting only. Your cooperation while parents and students get used to this procedure is appreciated. Please do not drive through Cameron Street ("The Strip") or enter the back parking lot in the mornings or after school. Cameron Street and our back parking lot need to be kept clear for student cars and buses.

Buses: The back lot is reserved for buses and assigned parking. Do not use this lot for student drop - off. Students riding the bus should get to the bus lot as quickly as possible at dismissal to avoid missing their bus. Students should stay alert when leaving school and stay clear of the bus lane. Traffic is directed by a police officer or school official. Changes to bus schedules will be made via school announcements when necessary. Parents, please allow time for bus drivers to get to know the routes and their passengers during the first two weeks of school. Drivers, please be aware that no cars can exit the back lot at dismissal until all buses have departed.

TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Summer moves along quickly and in preparation for the new school year I would like to share the most current information relating to student transportation.

Virtually all of Broughton High School transportation policies and procedures will not change for next year. Attaining assignment to transportation, recommended carpooling procedures, on campus parking, student operation of vehicles on and about campus, and After School Activity (ASA) buses operations will all remain largely unchanged. The information below is provided as a reminder of the most prominent features relating to these prevailing policies:

Assignment to Transportation - When a student, enrolls in a WCPSS school, the default assumption by the district is that the student will not require WCPSS transportation. This dictates that any student, who is completely new to the system or any student who did not utilize WCPSS transportation at the end of the previous school year, will not have a bus route or a stop assigned, until one is requested for them on-line, through the web site. The location of the web site as well as the location for most transportation related policy information is found at <http://www.wcpss.net/domain/30>. On-line registration is a one-time requirement. All students, who live in the Broughton High School base assignment area and have previously been assigned a bus route or rode WCPSS transportation at some other school last year, will continue to be "grandfathered" transportation and will automatically be assigned a bus routes and stop for coming school year. Students, who do not live in the Broughton High School base assignment area or those students who do not register on-line for transportation through the web site are required to utilize other means to get to and from school. If you desire to have WCPSS transportation and are in any doubt whether your student has been registered to receive bus services, please utilize the web site above to initiate your request, as soon as possible.

Changes to Bus Stops - Once again, an important issue to consider for this coming school year is the ongoing effort by the WCPSS Transportation Department to increase efficiency by limiting the number of bus stops. Transportation planners work continually to reduce the number of bus stops utilized within the system. Please make sure to check on the correct location of your student's bus stop by using the WCPSS bus route directory. The home page for WCPSS transportation routes is at <http://webarchive.wcpss.net/school-directory/bus-routes/348.html>. Please be aware that normally the school's finalized bus route plan is not published until approximately one week prior to the start of the school year. This year that date should fall on August 21st, 2019.

Car Pooling - Carpooling is encouraged as an efficient and safe way to transport students to and from school. Drivers dropping off students should utilize the front parking lot (the lot facing Peace Street) in the areas designated by signs and markings. Please do not drop off students in the rear parking lot (the lot adjoining the Holliday Gym, the auto shop, and the modular units), as this area is the designated bus loading zone and is in significant use during the 45 minutes before the start and during the 45 minutes following the end of any given school day.

Student on Campus Parking - Parking at Broughton is limited to Juniors and Seniors, who have completed 25 hours of community service for each year that they have attended BHS. There are only 150 parking spaces available. Students who were interested in on-campus parking were afforded the opportunity to sign up last May and parking assignments for the 2019-2020 school year have already been made. On-campus student parking fees for the 2019-2020 School Year will remain at the same annual fee from last year, \$200 and it is recommended that the fee be paid through the On-line Student Payment (OSP) system. Alternate student off-campus parking options include a free school-owned parking location (the "Pit" parking area - a gravel lot adjacent to the baseball field), and street parking available along Cameron Street, Washington Street, Smallwood Street, as well as several other areas. This subject is covered in greater detail on the BHS website. Visitor parking space locations are on the south west section of our front parking lot (by the tennis court) and they are numbered F095 to F110. Contact Mr. Lentz, AP 919-856-7810 EXT 23260, if you have any parking related questions.

Parking and Driving Courtesy - Courtesy when operating a vehicle around campus is expected at all times. Both parking and driving on campus are privileges that can be revoked for inappropriate behavior. When operating a vehicle on and about the campus, drive defensively and within the proper speed limits, show courtesy to fellow drivers, utilize seatbelts, and exercise control over the behavior of your passengers in keeping with proper expectations for safety and decorum. When parking, be considerate of your neighbors, allowing sufficient space and patience for other parkers. Do not loiter in the parking lot upon arriving and departing campus, follow parking regulations, and do not litter in the parking areas, park in assigned parking spaces, or tamper with other people's vehicles.

After School Activity (ASA) Bus Transportation - ASA bus routes start approximately one week after school starts. The ASA runs are expected to include stops as follows; RUN A - Daniels Middle, Joyner Elementary, N. Raleigh Boulevard and Glasscock Street, Poe Elementary, Ligon Middle, Bugg Elementary, Tower Shopping Center (near Popeyes), Walnut Creek Elementary, and Raleigh Ice Plex; RUN B - Lake Boone Trail & Wycliff Road (shopping center at McDonalds), Stough Elementary, 5800 Duraleigh Road Public Library, Jeffreys Grove Elementary, Wildwood Forest Elementary, and Wilburn Elementary. All ASA routes will load in the rear parking lot, bus loading area, beginning at 4:45 P.M., departing Broughton High School at 5:00 P.M., and run Monday through Thursday (There is no service on Fridays or early release days). ASA locations are subject to change based upon need and feasibility. The most current ASA route information can be found on the BHS website, <https://www.wcpss.net/Page/20669>.

"The Community Service Program at Broughton High School is designed to teach citizenship skills and the value of serving others. Service is a value firmly positioned in the mission of the school."

The Community Service Program has been an integral part of the educational community at Broughton High School and has been fully integrated as a part of the learning environment. For the 2018/19 school year, students completed 71,959 hours of community service hours for Broughton and for non-profits in the Triangle area, in North Carolina and all over the world. Volunteer activities have included serving dinner at the Salvation Army, church and community mission trips in other countries, coaching students for Special Olympics and volunteering for agencies such as Interact, Boy Scouts of America, The NC Art Museum, The NC Food Bank, YMCA, Habitat for Humanity, Planned Parenthood, The NC Science Museum and many more. Many graduates report that volunteering was one of the most gratifying experiences of their high school years at Broughton High School.

All students are required to complete 25 hours of approved community service hours each year they are enrolled at BHS in order to graduate. Service hours must be performed for a NON-PROFIT, 501c3 organization, unless pre-approved by Mr. Cassady. When in doubt about whether or not an agency is a non-profit, please ask someone at the agency about their non-profit status.

Students are welcome at the WELL after school from 2:15pm – 6:00pm Mon.-Thurs., and 2:15pm-4:00pm Friday. There are extended tutoring hours, by appointment, Monday – Wednesday. Most programs are offered free of charge, however some programs – like ACT and SAT test prep - have associated fees. All students must fill out an annual membership application for access to our programs, services and events. Visit our website www.wade.org to learn more.

Computer Lab: The WELL has supervised space available for homework and studying. Our computer lab has 20+ computers with internet access and printing capabilities available for student use. Users must be members and follow behavior expectations.

Tutoring Appointments: Tutoring is by appointment only and is at no cost to WELL members. Tutors work with students in a variety of core subject areas. Please fill out the online tutor request form at www.wade.org (after Sept. 1). Tutoring begins in October and runs through mid-April.

WELL-Rounded: A bi-weekly program focused on developing essential workforce and life skills that will support a student's success in high school and beyond. Themes change monthly and focus on real world experiences, skills and careers. All are welcome however freshmen and sophomores find this particularly helpful as they prepare for their first job.

LEAP & LEAP Jr.: A biweekly College Prep program. Participants will follow a curriculum with staff to ensure students meet deadlines, file paperwork and are prepared for college. Students will be assigned mentors for support. High Juniors and Seniors only.

Teen Talk: Weekly facilitated discussion for teens led by partners from Interact and CCERC. Focuses on healthy relationships, social and emotional wellness, communication skills, etc.

CCERC Counseling Center: The NC State University Community Counseling, Education, and Research Center (CCERC) provides mental health and career counseling services at the WELL to students, individuals, couples, and families – free or on a sliding scale. Request Appointment @ www.wade.org/CCERC.

WELL Service Warriors: Students participate in monthly community service projects both at the WELL and in the community. Remember – 25 hours per year for Broughton students.

ACT/SAT Test Prep: The WELL offers comprehensive test preparation workshops to help students tackle the ACT/SAT. Participants will learn what to expect on test day, basic test-taking strategies, general study strategies, and section-specific review. 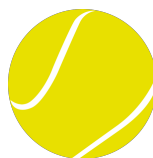

Broughton High School has a long history of strong athletics and Championship teams. The 2018-2019 school year represented another successful athletic campaign, including the following successes:

Broughton currently requires an annual athletic budget of \$190,000 to field 34 teams in 19 different sports with over 900 athletes. Wake County contributes \$874 – **or less than \$1.50 per individual student-athlete** – for the entire program, **making the Caps Club the primary funding source for Broughton athletics**. Your support directly impacts our ability to provide the quality programming our student-athletes and community deserve.

Many teams are gearing up for the fall season with summer workouts. Broughton High School Pantry

The Broughton Pantry supports our students who are in need of food, clothing, hygiene items and school supplies. Students with needs are identified by teachers and guidance counselors. The pantry is open every Monday and Thursday from 6:50-7:25am and 2:15-2:45pm. Drivers Education Information

The Drivers Education program is already in full swing at Broughton for the summer. Classes began the week after graduation with students showing up bright and early for the first summer class. The summer classes run every week of the summer except the week of July 4th. Students should bring a bag lunch, drink, pen, pencil, paper, and a copy of their birth certificate. During the week, students are exposed to presentations from various speakers, videos, computer lessons, group reports, skits, and interactive lectures.

Students must be at least 14 1/2 by the first day of class to take Drivers Ed. There is a required \$65 fee that must be paid by the first day of class. Parents may go on-line at Jordandriving.com, and print off a registration form, pick one up in the front office or outside my room, 1215. Return the completed registration form to Ron Wheeler at Broughton via email, fax(919-856-7822) or hand-deliver. Once you have been notified that your child has been assigned to a class, go to Jordandriving.com, click on SUMMER CLASSES, FEES and find BROUGHTON. Click on the class date and pay for the class. Payment must be made to Jordan Driving School prior to the first day of class.

Parents, if you forgot to register your child for Drivers Ed this summer or were not aware that there was Drivers Ed this summer, don't despair. Though summer classes at Broughton are full, there may be availability at other Wake County high schools. You may go to Jordandriving.com for class times, dates, and locations. All Wake County students (public, private, or home schooled) are allowed to take Drivers Ed. Students can also opt to take a class at another school instead of their home school.

Remember, if the Summer Drivers Ed program does not fit into your summer plans, *you can always take it during the school year after school*. Depending on enrollment, there is at least one class every month. The Fall class schedule should be available on Jordan's website on August 1st. During the school year, classes are after school for 10 days, from 2:30-5:30pm. The process is the same as the summer classes above and students should also bring a copy of their birth certificate, a snack, drink, pen, pencil and paper.

I hope that I have simplified the process of Drivers Ed. Most all the information you need is on the Jordandriving.com website. You will find the registration form and the directions for completing the registration process. Remember once the classroom portion of Drivers Ed is completed, parents will be contacted by the driving instructor to schedule the driving portion. Remember the whole process could take as long as 3-4 months so please plan accordingly.
