

2024 - 2025 Club Application Window

The 2024 - 2025 Club Application Window will open on April 3rd, 2024. Students interested in renewing or starting new clubs should follow the steps below.

Club Renewals - Opens: April 3 // Closes: April 12

Existing Clubs should follow the following process:

- Complete the Renewal Form
- Category II Clubs are only eligible to reapply if they have held leadership elections (as stipulated when they applied last year).

Legacy Status

Clubs which have existed since 2021 - 2022 school year are eligible to apply for “Legacy Status” - these clubs will not have to complete the renewal process each year and will be identified as Legacy Clubs in the Club Directory.

New Clubs - Opens: April 22 // Closes: May 03

Students who wish to start a new club should complete the New Club Application. Here are the criteria for new clubs:

Category II “Chartered Clubs”

Chartered Clubs have long term goals and normally engage in medium to large scale projects (service projects, competitions, etc...)

- May engage in service projects
- Can receive approval for off campus trips and competitions (outside the school day)
- Can request posts on the TVs, Social Media Posts, and School Website
- Must have elected Officers
- Must host at least one Gator day activity
- Must submit their “plan of work”

Category III “Informal Clubs”

Informal Clubs are for groups of students who share certain hobbies or interests. They tend to meet to have fun or relax, but don’t plan on hosting big projects or competitions.

- Not permitted to fundraise or engage in school sponsored service projects.
- Cannot engage in off campus trips

Additional Information

- This year, new clubs will not seek out advisors - during the application process we will match teachers with new clubs or existing clubs which have lost advisors.
- Existing clubs will get priority over new club applications.
- Administration and Student Government will review all Renewal Applications to ensure those clubs have been meeting regularly, held elections for leaders, and interview advisors to see the work those clubs have done this year.
