Habit 3: Put First Things First	 Schedule your day Check Google Classroom each day and write down your assignments (either in a notebook/planner or using a digital tool) Organize your assignments based on your class times (ex. If math is your first period, do your math assignments/studying first) 	
Habit 4: Think Win-Win	Adopt an "everyone can win" attitude How can you share your work space at home with the people you live with?
