We emphasize leadership development, entrepreneurship, and community service. Our school serves approximately 55 students per grade level in grades 6 through 13. We currently are the only all-girls school in North Carolina that is associated with a public school district.

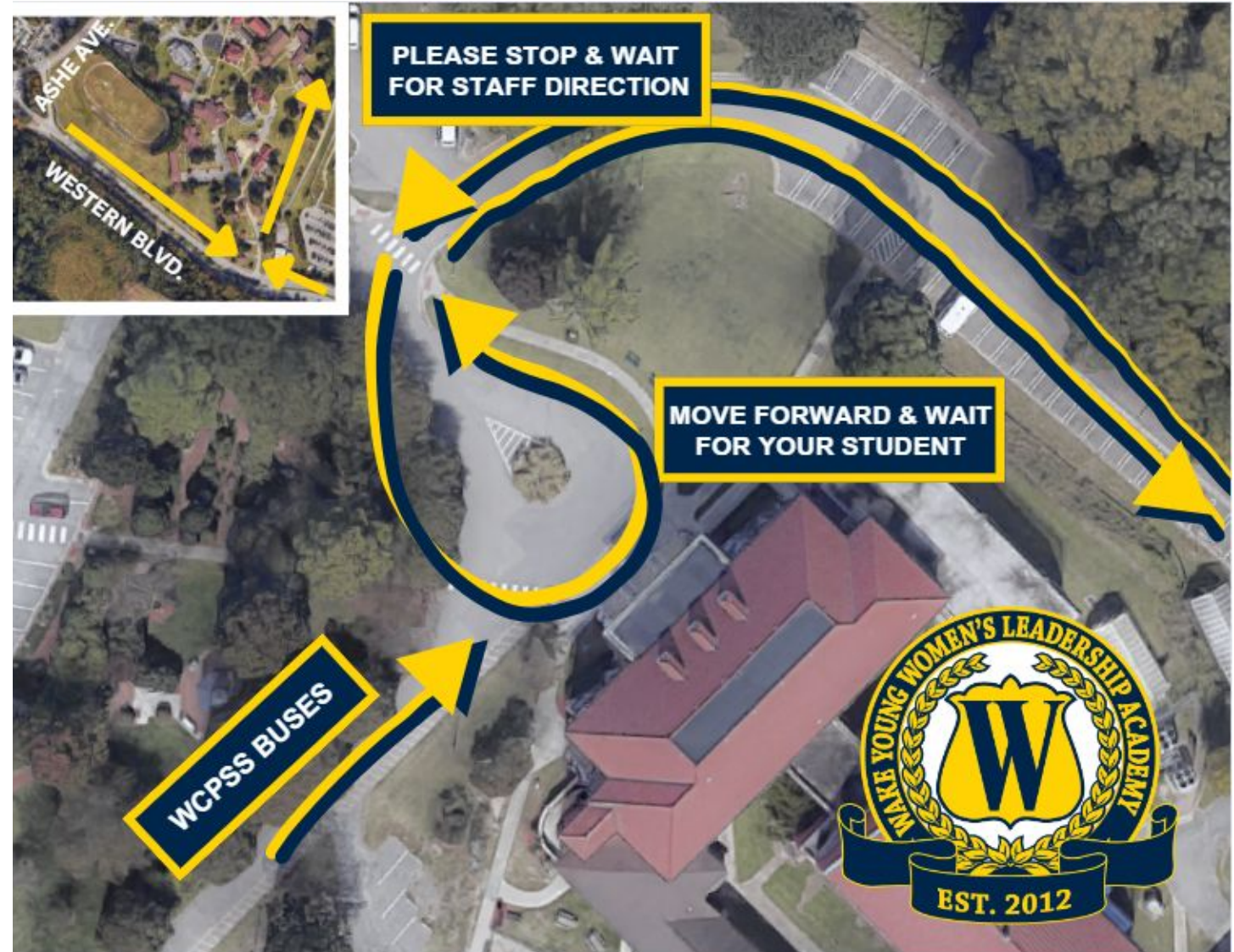

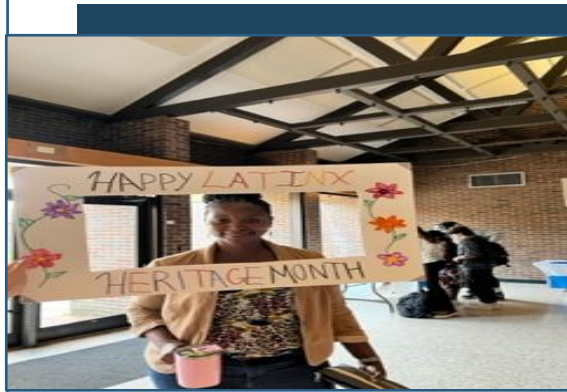

## What is Early College

Students have the opportunity to earn up to 64 hours of transferable college credits. Beginning in the 11th grade, students take all of their classes on the Shaw University Campus. They are required to be enrolled in at least one high school class during each semester. Students must maintain a fulls schedule and academic cohort GPA.

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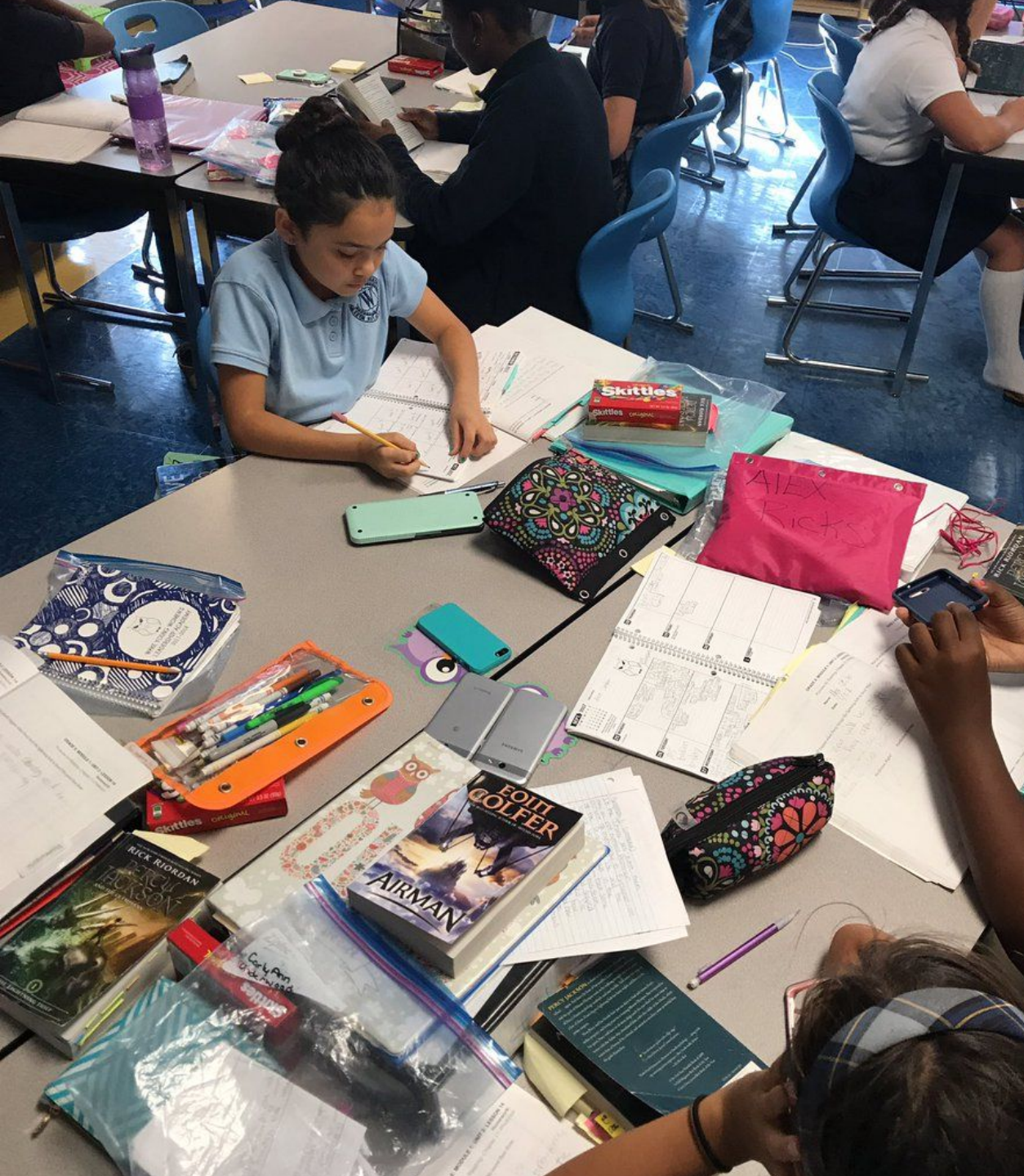

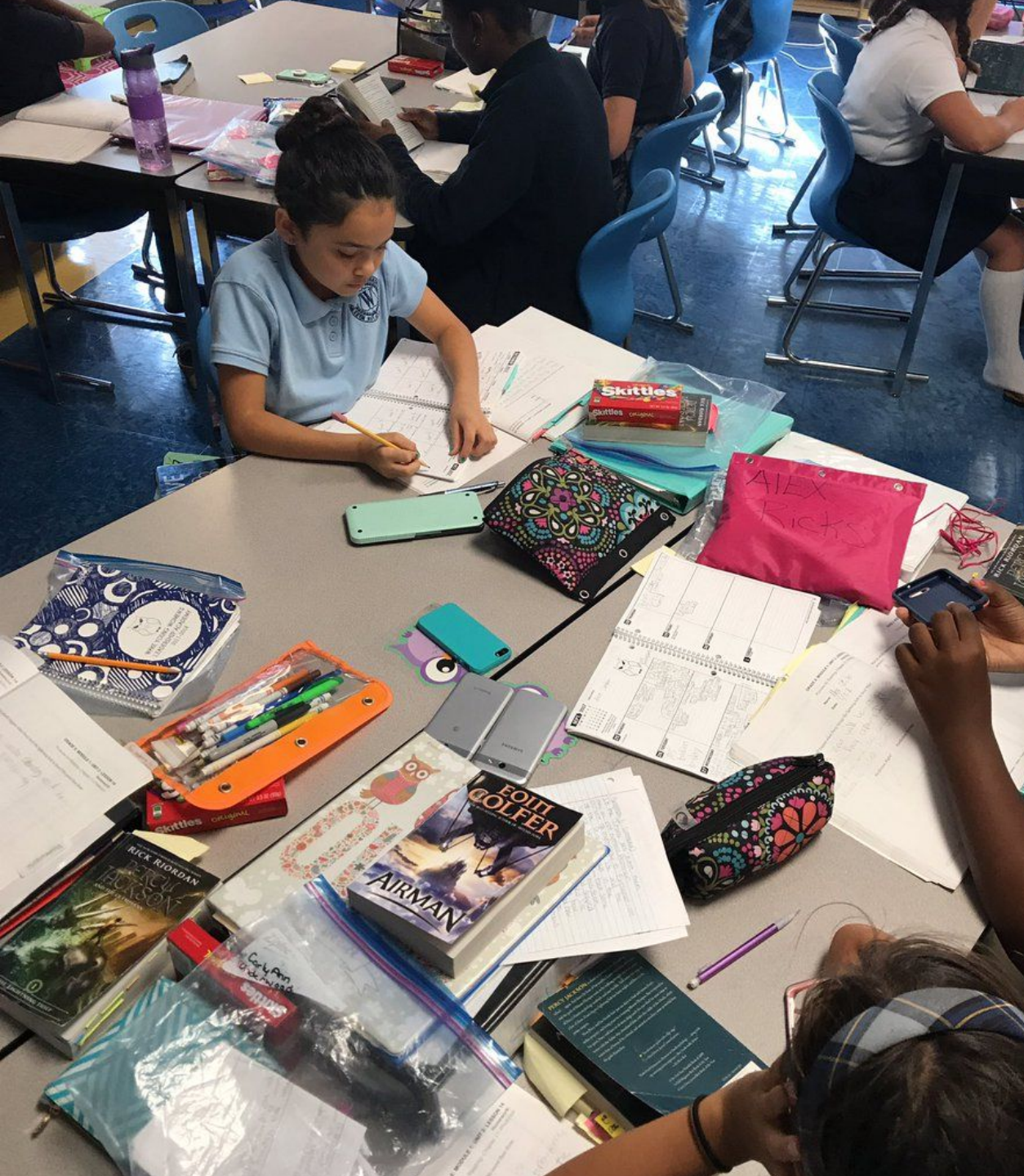
# Rigorous Learning
