Career Academy Overview

A career academy is a small learning community within a large traditional high school. Designed as a four-year high school program, the academy has an open and equitable student recruitment process, resulting in a student body that reflects the community's demographics. However, students must be assigned to LEGUILE ROAD High School as their base school to apply. Once accepted into the program, students remain together throughout high school with a core group of specially trained teachers. The academy model provides an environment for these teachers to develop interdisciplinary activities that make learning relevant and capture students' interest. Through real-world, hands-on experiences, the academy exposes students to careers within an academy career theme. The Academy of communication skills they need to thrive in a global economy and, in the process, introduce them to career opportunities in today's workforce. Academy students will be prepared and encouraged to continue their education at the post-secondary level and build their careers with a strong designant.

There are many benefits to being a student in a career academy. Students complete an internship with a minimum of 120 hours by the end of their senior year. Career Academy Student Agreement

2. Academic Expectations

- I must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 while enrolled in the academy. If my GPA falls below this standard, I will be placed on a performance improvement plan. Failure to improve may result in dismissal.
- If I fail a course and cannot make it up during summer school, I may not be able to rejoin the academy cohort.
- I understand that all academy students must complete the following requirements to graduate from the academy:
 - o Required coursework
 - Job shadowing
 - Internship (120 hours)
 - Off-campus learning experiences
 - Academy nights, expos, mentor meetings
 - Community service

3. Professionalism & Conduct

I must attend all academy activities, such as job shadowing, internships, and work-based learning experiences, dressed appropriately in business attire or the specified academy uniform.

- I understand that I am expected to demonstrate **professional conduct** both inside and outside of school.
- If my behavior jeopardizes a business partnership, I may face expulsion from the academy.
- Repeated disciplinary incidents, suspension, or violations of school and academy rules may result in my dismissal from the program.
- I have received and read the [Academy Name] and WCPSS Career Academy Student Handbook, including policies on:
 - Acceptable student conduct
 - Grading policy and academic standards
 - WCPSS Student Acceptable Use for Electronic Resources (including social networking)
 - o Academic integrity, dress code, and the Memorandum of Understanding

- I am expected to complete an information form and provide updates when necessary.
- Participation and support of scheduled academy meetings and activities are expected of all members.

5. Financial Responsibility & Fundraising

- I am responsible for any costs associated with off-campus learning experiences, academy apparel, books, notebooks, and materials.
- I understand that active participation in **fundraising efforts** (<u>Policy Code: 3320 School Trips</u>) is expected to help offset these costs.
- The academy does have **financial assistance available** for students with demonstrated need.

6. Academy Honor Code

- I acknowledge that I am entitled to an honest and exceptional learning environment and must uphold the values of honesty, integrity, and excellence.
- I will respect the integrity of the academy's **business partners** and the academy learning community.
- I understand the Academy Honor Code and the consequences of violating it.

7. Dismissal & Appeal Process

- I understand that I may be removed from the academy if I:
 - o Repeatedly violate academy or school rules
 - Receive a school suspension
 - Fail to meet academic and professional expectations
