Stough Elementary Homework Plan

Homework:

Homework is a part of our educational program at Stough that is designed to be a purposeful extension of our students' learning. Homework should reinforce concepts taught at school and should focus on activities with which a student can expect to be successful. It should fulfill the following purposes:

- 1. To enrich and extend school experiences through related home activities.
- 2. To reinforce learning by providing practice and application.

Guidelines:

- 1. Before assigning a homework assignment, the concept/skill will be thoroughly taught and practiced at school.
- 2. Homework assignments will be specific, within the student's ability and have defined expectations.
- 3. Homework assignments will not be given as punishment or busy work.
- 4. Homework assignments will not require the use of books or materials that are not readily available in the home or accessible to the student.
- 5. The length of time spent on homework must be developmentally appropriate and manageable in a child's life.
- 6. Teachers will provide feedback on homework assignments as needed.
- 7. Departmentalized teams must collaborate on homework so as not to exceed the maximum time.

Frequency:

The research-based guidelines of minutes of homework per day are:

- Kindergarten: Maximum of 30 minutes per day to include 15 minutes of practice and 15 minutes reading/read aloud.
- Grades 1-2: Maximum of 40 minutes per day to include 20 minutes of practice and 20 minutes of reading.
- Grades 3-5: Maximum of 50 minutes per day to include 30 minutes of practice and 20 minutes of reading.

Homework may be assigned Monday through Thursday nights. Occasionally, some projects/assignments may extend into the weekend. Homework is not graded.
However, its completion is reflected in the work habits section of the report card.
