#### **ASSIGNMENT SUBMISSION**

We expect students to submit assignments on the teacher's designated due date

- Assignments not submitted by the designated due date will be recorded as a zero and marked missing in Infinite Campus
- If an assignment is incomplete and turned in by the designated due date, your grade will reflect only the work you submitted
- If you have a planned absence (e.g., field trip, school event, family trip, medical, college visit) you must communicate (email, face-toface, or both) with your teacher ahead of time to create a make-up plan, including designated due date(s), or a zero may be recorded
- If you have an unplanned absence (e.g., sick, emergency), you must communicate (email, face-to-face, or both) with your teacher ASAP to create a make-up plan, including designated due date(s), or a zero may be recorded

## **TARDIES & EXAM EXEMPTIONS**

We expect students to attend school and be on time for each class, every day

If you are tardy, report to the nearest tardy station and check your pass for the consequence based on how many tardies you've accumulated.\*

\*Tardies reset at the beginning of each quarter

# of Tardies	Consequence
1 - 5	Warning
6 - 10	Lunch Detention
11 - 15	ISS or loss of lunch pass
16 and above	TBD by administration

# Students may be exempt from exams if they meet all 3 criteria:

- No more than 10 tardies for the class
- No more than 10 absences (of any kind) from the class
- An A or B final average in the class

Students CANNOT be exempt from state testing including WorkKeys and field testing.

## **OFF-CAMPUS LUNCH PASS**

Juniors/Seniors with an off-campus lunch pass must remain in good standing or risk losing the privilege

#### "Good Standing" means meeting all 3 criteria:

- Having 10 or fewer absences (of any kind) in any class
- Having 10 or fewer tardies (of any kind) in any class
- And passing,
  - Q1, Q2 and Q3: 3 out of 4 classes
  - Q4: pull if failing 1 or more classes as of 5/18/26

### **GATOR TIME: ADVISORY + CONNECTIVITY**

#### We expect students to participate in Gator Time daily.

- Gator Time consists of Advisory and Connectivity
- Skipping Gator Time is the same as skipping a class
- Advisory is every Monday (attendance required for late arrivals)
- Connectivity is Tuesday-Friday
- Students will sign up for Connectivity sessions in AllTimely during Advisory
- For content area support, sign up for a tutorial with your teacher:

  - o **Friday** Science & Fine Arts

### PERSONAL WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES

All student personal wireless communication devices (PWCD)

instructional time

#### If a student uses a device when they shouldn't:

- The teacher will give the student a verbal warning
- If the behavior continues, the device will be confiscated for the remainder of the period
- Parents will be contacted if it becomes a pattern
