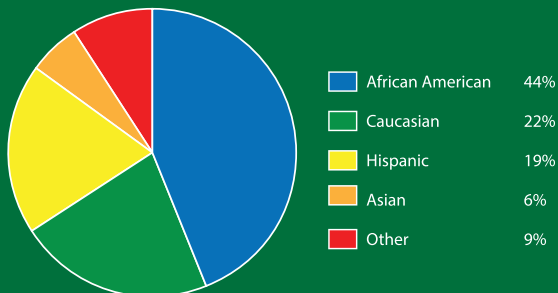


WYMLA Overview

Academics

LOWER ACADEMY

Wake Young Men's Leadership Academy has a transitional middle school program (6-8) developing elementary boys into responsible, respectful, and dedicated young men. Middle school students are prepared for the academic and social rigors of high school through an integrated advisory course and various enrichment activities and programs.

UPPER ACADEMY

Wake Young Men's Leadership Academy's Upper School program (9-13) transitions middle school young men into college and career ready leaders. Upper School students are engaged in a rigorous Early College program integrating leadership development and service learning throughout the curriculum. Ninth and tenth grade students take Honors level courses to prepare for their Early College experience at St. Augustine's University starting in eleventh grade.

Admissions

Applying to WYMLA requires two steps:

1. Locate or register for a Student Identification Number. Families not currently enrolled in WCPSS must register with the WCPSS Office of Student Assignment prior to completing the application.
2. Complete the online application. Online applications are available at **www.wcpss.net/page/113**.

Student applications are reviewed and scored based on a rubric. If there are more applicants than seats available, the Student Assignment Department will utilize a lottery system for seat and wait-list assignments.

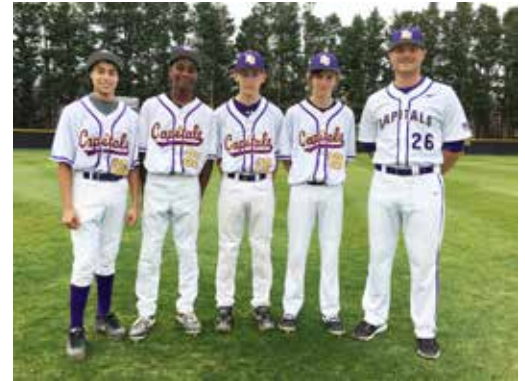
