

Former Wildcat Sets Campbell Record

Millbrook Basketball alum, Chris Clemons converted on a three-point play in round one of the CBI Tournament to set the Campbell University all-time scoring record.

Clemons, a three year letter winner at Millbrook scored a total of 1,230 career points in high school; he has 2,241 at the collegiate level.

In the 97-87 victory over Miami (OH), the junior point guard hit 11-of-19 shots, including 4-of-9 threes, and 6-of-7 from the stripe and notched his sixth 30-plus point outing of the season. His drive to the bucket with 5:06 left in the first half provided his seventh and eighth points of the night to move by Jonathan Rodriguez for the record.

After a quarterfinal round win over New Orleans, Clemons currently sits third all-time in scoring in Big South Conference history. He has scored in double figures in an NCAA-best 81 straight games, and sits 4th overall in the NCAA in scoring.

As both a junior and senior at Millbrook, Clemons earned Cap-8 Player of the Year honors. His 599 points scored during his senior season are a school record, as are his ten 30+ point games. He also holds the Campbell record for career 30+ point games with 16.

Last week, Clemons joined Duke's Marvin Bagley, Grayson Allen and Wendell Carter, UNC's Luke Maye and Joel Berry, UVA's Kyle Guy and Devon Hall, Clemson's Marcquise Reed, and Virginia Tech's Justin Robinson as members of the 10-man USBWA All-District Team.
