AIG Basics 4-5

Students identified as Academically and Intellectually Gifted (AIG) are given the opportunity to expand their knowledge through extensive instructional support in core classes. They are taught with their academic peers daily for their reading and math instruction. These students also have the opportunity to participate in AIG elective classes.

Grouping K-5

Your child will be assessed on a routine basis and taught according to his/her ability level. Within the classroom students are flexibly grouped by ability for reading and math instruction. This differentiated instruction allows your child to master concepts and continually be challenged whatever his/her level of development. Although the state does not formally identify gifted students until 4th grade, we use assessment data and professional knowledge to accelerate students and provide enrichment classes with highly trained and/or certified AIG teachers as early as kindergarten.

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
