# COURSE: FOUNDING PRINCIPLES OF THE USA & NC: CIVIC LITERACY H







- In this project-based learning unit, students will explore the question, "To what extent is the Constitution a
  living document?" through research and group collaboration. They will analyze how the Constitution has
  evolved through time by examining public policy, legislation, Supreme Court rulings, and key historical events.
  Students will focus on how the Constitution has been adapted to reflect societal changes and values while
  exploring federalism, individual rights, and government power.
- Groups will select a specific topic related to the Constitution and trace how that issue has been shaped over time by societal values, political decisions, and judicial interpretations. The project will culminate in a multimedia presentation where each group presents its findings, supported by primary and secondary sources.

#### **SUSTAINED INQUIRY & AUTHENTICITY**

 The US Constitution is considered the law of the land and is constantly evolving and being interpreted by all branches of government. These interpretations can impact the lives of students. By examining the historical framework of the Constitution, and connecting it to modern issues that impact their daily lives, students will gain a larger understanding of the Constitution and its impact.
