TEACHER REFLECTION



- I was pleased with the outcome of the PBL as it allowed me to formatively assess the student's abilities, how well they worked in groups, their prior knowledge, as well as teach the content of Unit 1, "What is Marketing?" In the future, I would discuss the rubrics more in detail at the start of the project. Finally, in reflection, it was helpful that I took time to review how to work in groups and did not give the students a lot of voice and choice on who was in their group (too early in the semester). I did this as there were 9-12th grade students in each class. I had to divide up the seniors and freshman which worked well.

- "I learned the basics about what marketing is, where it happens, who does it, and more. Everything we do is marketing and how we market ourselves and other things will be part of our everyday lives."
- "I learned how to use more sites like Canva."
