





Things to Do Now

September

- Register for the SAT and/or ACT
- Compile information needed for college applications
 - Essays
 - Letters of Recommendation
 - Prepare Brag Sheet or Resume
- Narrow down your list of colleges
 - Match
 - Reach
 - Safety
- Start completing your college applications
 - Some deadlines are as early as October

October

- Check college deadlines for this month, including priority financial aid deadlines
 - Early Decision deadlines (BINDING!!)
 - Early Action deadlines (early response, non binding)

Items to include on Brag Sheet:

- Work experience
- Extracurricular activities
- Community service
- Honors & Awards received
- Leadership positions held
- Interest & hobbies
- References

College Selection Checklist

- Programs and Degrees offered
- Location of school (In-State/Out of State)
- Cost of attendance and financial assistance available
- Size of School and Class ratio
- Athletic and Extracurricular Activities
- Is this school the best fit for the student?



College Admissions Process



College Admissions Options

- Early Decision: Binding Option!
- Early Action: Not Binding
 Deadlines: Oct Nov!
 Recommended for scholarship eligibility
- Regular Admission: General deadline for all applications
- Rolling Admission: No set deadline for applications



Factors in the Admissions Process

- Rigor of high school course work
- Grades (Weighted & Unweighted GPA through the end of Junior Year)
- Class Rank
- SAT and/or ACT scores, if required
 - many schools are still test optional
- Extracurricular activities/Leadership
- Essay (not required by all schools)
- Interview (not required by all schools)
- Recommendations (not required by all schools)



Community College Admission

- Rolling Admission for applications
- SAT and ACT testing are not required for admission
- Wake Tech Articulation Agreement with Universities
 - Associates degrees can transfer to the 16 UNC System schools

College Application Process



Where do I go to apply to college?

- CFNC: College Foundation of NC
 - www.cfnc.org
 - Application portal for colleges and universities in NC
 - Free application week for select schools: Oct. 21-27
 - Pros: Easily navigate between in-state schools
 - Cons: Can be cumbersome, No out of state applications
- Common App: www.commonapp.org
 - Very popular, used for most colleges and universities
 - Pros: Everything in one place, Easy to Navigate
 - Cons: Costs can add up
- The Black Common App:

- For all HBCUs
- Pros: Low Cost, Multiple applications at once
- Cons: Must be completed separately from non-HBCU school apps

What "To Do" When Applying to College

- Students fill out applications.
- Pay attention to deadlines! Listed deadlines are for the student application – students will not be penalized for late teacher recommendations.
- When listing extracurricular activities, go for quality over quantity!
- Make sure you submit at least a week prior to the deadline and make/save copies!
- Take the SAT or ACT if required
- Use the Common Application if an option.
- Be honest!



Transcripts

What's included on a Transcript:

- History of high school courses and grades
- Weighted and unweighted GPA
- Class rank

Where to send Transcripts:

- To any school, including community colleges, that students are applying to
- Some scholarships require a transcript
- Final transcripts must be sent to college that student decides to attend – Final transcripts are requested at the end of the year through completion of Senior Surveys and are sent to colleges in mid/late June



Sending a Transcript

Scrib Online

Send transcripts through WCPSS. Can be send to any entity of choice (out of state college, Scholarship, NCAA, etc.)

Free to Send on ScribOrder for current WCPSS students

Unofficial and Official Transcripts

CommonApp

Your high school counselor uploads a transcript on your behalf that is then downloaded by the colleges you've applied to.

CFNC

Send transcripts electronically to any college or university in North Carolina.

Always free to send through CFNC

- 1. <u>ScribOnline</u> NCAA, out of state, scholarships, etc.
- 2. <u>Common App</u> Counselor will upload for you in this portal when you attach our email address to complete your Secondary School Report
- 3. <u>CFNC</u> All NC colleges and universities it sends immediately and also sends your final transcript at the end of the year



Letters of Recommendation

- Students should ask someone who knows them well and with whom they have had positive encounters.
 - Consider asking teachers from last school year
 - Some colleges ask for academic recommendations and give the option of additional letters from community leader (ex Boy Scout leader, Youth Group Leader, etc) or work supervisor
- Give recommender a Brag Sheet or Resume
- Give at least two weeks notice



Counselor Statements

- Some colleges will require a Counselor Statement form to be completed by your Counselor
- Sometimes called a "school report"
- Automatically done by your counselor if you add them to Common App
- Submit a Brag Sheet/Resume to your Counselor.
- Please give Counselors at least 2 weeks notice!



Sending Test Scores

Note: Some schools have changed their testing requirements and are now test optional. Confirm with each school what their testing requirements are.

CollegeBoard

Send scores to up to 4 colleges for FREE when you register for SAT and up to 9 days after the test.

Send via website later for \$14

Each score report contains all SAT scores for superscoring.

ACT

Send scores to up to 4 colleges for FREE when you register for the ACT.

Send via the website later for \$18 each.

Have to send score report from each test session if superscoring.

AP

Send 1FREE report when you set up account.

Send via the website later for \$15 each.

Score report contains all AP Scores.


Send to school you are enrolling in for college course credit and placement.




Decisions, Decisions!

- Accepted: You're In!
- Deferred: Student's application is moved to the next deadline.
 - Student may be asked to submit further info, such as 1st semester grades.
- Waitlisted: If space becomes available, you will be notified.
- Denied: It's ok, there is a better fit for you!

**If you are either denied or waitlisted, you may want to consider entering the CFNC Redirection
Pool in the spring (usually available April 1).

- CSS Profile
- Scholarships



Residency Key Points

 For NC Public Colleges the process will be part of admission (eligibility for in-state tuition)

For NC Independent Colleges the process is part of financial aid (eligibility for state grants)

CFNC Infographic Timeline



Residency Key Points

- www.ncresidency.org
- Students will access using CFNC account username and password.
- Upon completion, they will receive a residency confirmation number (RCN) that can be added to non-CFNC applications.
- Can be completed now.
- Only has to be completed once



Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Just went through major overhaul to make process more user friendly
- 100% of students/families should complete regardless of income or whether you plan on attending college immediately
- Only way to access federal and state educational aid (including loans)
- Safeguard in case of change in situation
- studentaid.gov
- Must be completed every year



THE FAFSA

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID allows college students to access financial aid for college, including grants, scholarships, work-study and federal student loans

The 2025-26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will be available to all students on or before December 1, 2024. The application will be released in phases, with a limited number of students and institutions able to access it on October 1.

Information you'll need to fill out the FAFSA:



Your social security number and driver's license, and/or registration number



Student's 2023 federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned.



Parent's 2023 income tax returns, W-2 forms and 1040 forms if you're a dependent.



Bank statements and records of investments.

*The FAFSA will want information on available cash, balances in savings and checking accounts and any investment portfolios as of the date of the FAFSA.

*All real estate holdings other than the house you live in must be listed. The net work of Family farms and small businesses are assets a a required part of the application



Child support counts as an asset.

The number of family members in college is no longer considered in the needs analysis formula, but it is still a required question on the FAFSA® form.

Students & Contributors <u>must</u> provide consent to:



their federal tax information transferred directly into the FAFSA® form via direct data exchange with the IRS.

(FA-DDX- Future Act Direct Data Exchange replaces the IRS Data Retrieval Tool)



their federal tax information used to determine the student's eligibility for federal student aid, and



the U.S. Department of Education to share their federal tax info with postsecondary institutions & state higher education agencies for administering financial aid.

- Even if students or contributors don't have a Social Security number, didn't file taxes, or filed taxes outside of the U.S., they still need to provide consent.
- If a student or required contributor doesn't provide consent to have their federal tax information transferred into the FAFSA®form, the student will not be eligible for federal student aid—even if they manually enter tax information into the FAFSA form.



When to Complete FAFSA

- Students can begin completing FAFSA for the 2025-2026 school year on December 1, 2024
- Students can use tax information from 2023 to complete 25-26 FAFSA (Import Federal Tax Info)
- 3 Aid Deadlines (National/State/School)

CSS/Financial Aid Profile

- CSS/Financial Aid Profile: <u>https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/about</u>
- Some schools use this to determine eligibility for non-federal institutional aid
- Deadlines set by college/university (opens Oct 1st)
- There is a cost (\$25 initial school, \$16 for additional schools – waivers are available)
- Schools in NC that use CSS Profile:
 Davidson, Duke, Elon, UNC, Wake Forest


