School Community

East Wake High School is located in rural Eastern Wake County, approximately 12 miles east of Raleigh, NC. The diverse school population consists of students who reside in Wendell, Zebulon, Knightdale, and Raleigh. East Wake offers a variety of Advanced Placement (AP) courses as well as Career & Technical Education (CTE) courses. East Wake has the second-largest CTE program in the WCPSS by offering programs in Automotive Technology, Construction Technology, Agriculture, Family Consumer Sciences, Business, Technology, Computer Science, Project Lead the Way, and Health Sciences. Students may choose to apply to our Academy of Life Sciences to experience a deeper dive into a medical or veterinary science career.

East Wake was named a Capturing Kids' Heart National Showcase School by the Flippen Group in 2020 and 2021. To be nominated, 75% of campus had to participate in the *Capturing Kids' Hearts* processes, and the campus had to see measurable increases in attendance, advancement rate, climate/culture, and academic performance, as well as decreases in discipline referrals. Aside from academics, East Wake High School offers student opportunities to participate in our competitive athletic programs and a thriving arts community, including our award-winning band, orchestra, theater arts, and chorus programs. EWHS is a part of the Wake County Public School System which consists of 191 schools and approximately 160,000 students. EWHS is accredited by the North Carolina State Board of Education and AdvancEd. In 2019, EWHS was designated as a Title I school. Schools qualify for Title I funding by demonstrating economic needs among its population.
