

# Course Selection for 9<sup>th</sup> Grade



- 8<sup>th</sup> grade teachers have made recommendations based on high school guidelines
- If the recommendation is not what you hoped for, have your student talk with Ms. Alcorn before or after school.
- Students who enroll in a class above what was given in the recommendation are generally not as successful as those who follow the teacher's recommendation.

Students taking NC Math 1 or NC Math II in 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> grade may earn a high school credit in Math, but the grade will not be part of the high school GPA.

# 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Registration

- 3. Science
- 4. Social Studies
- 5. Healthful Living
- 6. Additional Courses/Electives
- 7. Additional Courses/Electives
- 8. Additional Courses/Electives

Plus 3-4 alternate electives—as 2<sup>nd</sup> choice electives

# **Registering for Classes**

The eight classes should be the ones they hope to have 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.

- ► The alternate electives are those classes they are willing to take if they do not get their first choice.
- These classes are requests at this time, not a final schedule.




Choices are generally based on Math recommendation to keep Math and Science aligned throughout high school

# World Languages - When to do it?



World Language is <u>NOT</u> required for graduation <u>and is</u> <u>no longer</u> required to meet minimum admission requirements for UNC system.

High Schools will give priority to upperclassmen for first credit of World Languages.

If a student earned HS credit in MS, they will be able to take the second credit in 9th grade.

10<sup>th</sup>- Part 1 (Fall) / Part 2 (Spring)

11th - Part 3 (Fall) / Part 4 (Spring)

12th Part 5 or AP

If you are taking a year long elective such as Band, you must select Band twice in your elective selections

**GPA** is **QP** divided by # of credits

31 divided by 8= a weighted GPA of **3.87 YEAH!!! GOOD JOB!!!!**

# Cumulative GPA (cont'd)

QP divided by # of credits = GPA

64.5 divided by 24 = 2.68 Overall Weighted GPA
