COGNITIVE & GENERAL KNOWLEDGE



- Identifies self by first and last name.
- Writes first name.
- Knows basic colors and shapes.
- Has awareness of self and family.
- Draws picture of self.




 Knows that actions have consequences.

HEALTH & PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

- · Has had vision/hearing screenings and required immunizations.
- Receives medical care when sick and receives regular dental check-ups.
- Eats a balanced diet and gets 10-12 hours of sleep each night.
- Demonstrates self-help skills, such as use of toilet, unassisted eating, dressing self, washing hands, etc.
- Cuts with scissors appropriately.

APPROACHES TO LEARNING

- Enjoys exploration and discovery through play.
- Pays attention to task for short period of time (about 15 minutes).
- Persists with tasks even when difficult

SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Plays cooperatively and participates appropriately in a group.
- Follows basic rules and routines.
- Demonstrates some independence and can separate from parents.
- · Respects people and property.
- Begins to identify and express feelings appropriately.

LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT

- Knows many vocabulary words in his/her own language.
- Uses sentences of several words and speaks in a way that is understandable.
- Follows directions that have one, two, or three steps.
- Recognizes familiar alphabet letters and knows the letters of his/her own name.
- Is interested in books/stories; retells a story or a life event.

STAGGERED ENTRY

Staggered entry is a transition day during the first week of school. Each kindergarten child will come for one full day to be with a small group of students. The smaller group sizes allow teachers to offer support as children meet new friends, learn a new routine and try new things. Informal assessments are integrated throughout the day. These assessments as well as observations over the first few weeks of school will allow your child's teacher to plan for instruction.
