Attendance and Progress - Applies to ALL students both in person and at home

-Summer school staff will maintain attendance records as well as monitor student progress. In any given course, students are expected to engage in coursework daily in order to make adequate progress on their recovery course. Students who do not engage online for three (3) days will receive a warning. Students who do not engage online for five (5) days, may be removed from the summer school program. Individual needs may be addressed with the summer school staff.

-One full day in summer school is equivalent to approximately two weeks of regular school. This makes clear the necessity for daily attendance and significant daily progress.
Tardy/Late - Students are expected to be in their seats and ready to work by 8:00 AM or 11:30 AM.

-Please notify the summer school staff when your child is absent. Please make sure that you closely monitor your child's attendance.
-Students are considered "finished" upon completion of the course(s) - i.e. the faster a student works, the quicker they complete summer school!

Student Conduct - Students are expected to adhere to the Code of Student Conduct of the Wake County Public School System. Students are reminded of the following policies and guidelines:

-No cell phones while working in classrooms
-5 minute restroom breaks (9:30 AM and 1:00 PM)
-No roaming the hallways

-Major infractions, as determined by the summer school administrator, will result in expulsion from the summer school program.
-We have zero tolerance for misconduct in our summer school educational environment.

Academics and Grading

Open Notes on Tests and Quizzes

- Evidence of Completion/Notes/Notebook – A physical notebook is highly recommended for all courses during summer school for notes, questions and documentation of work completed.
- Notes should include main ideas, key words/definitions, examples and sample problems, formulas, charts/graphs, pictures, questions and answers etc...
- Notes should be organized by unit, lesson title and the date.
- Guided notes* are automatically offered within the Imagine Edgenuity lessons. They can be printed at home and used on all quizzes and tests. Students using notes pass their assessments more often and more efficiently than students that do not.

Assignments, Pacing Guide and Homework

- Imagine Edgenuity - Courses and assignments are organized by units. Each unit has pre-assessments, lessons (all video based) assignments, quizzes and post-assessments. Guided notes* accessed at the beginning of each lesson.
- Pacing guide - Summer school is twenty (20) weekdays. Average pace for students is 45-90 minutes per lesson including assessments. I can not stress enough how important daily progress is. Three hours equals a minimum of three to five lessons completed per session per day.
- Homework - Working on lessons from home is mandatory for blended students and highly encouraged for ALL students. The more a student works, the quicker they complete summer school!

The Imagine Edgenuity program is student directed, however, be aware, no extra time will be given at the end of summer school to complete unfinished work. The deadline to complete all assignments is the last day of summer school. Students will be given lessons, quizzes, and tests via the Imagine Edgenuity learning program. The summer school teacher will monitor and track student progress.

Students must complete all course work assigned and achieve a passing score of 60% or higher to earn a "P" (Pass) for credit. Any incomplete assignments will be given a grade of 0%, no credit. Students will have the opportunity to retake failed assignments for which they received a low grade. All lessons will be open to be completed at any time...however all quizzes and tests will be locked and must be completed at school with a summer school teacher.

Grading - All FINAL GRADES will be posted in *PowerSchool* as **Pass or Fail**. All scores from the lesson quizzes and unit tests must meet a minimum standard of **60% passing**, or the student will have to go back and review the lesson material and repeat the lesson quiz or unit test. The teacher will keep students aware of their grades and progress for summer school. **Pre-Tests** do not count for or against a student's grade, however, students who receive a passing score on pre-assessments will be excused from completing the lessons for that objective. Students must still pass the unit tests at the end of each unit.

Imagine Edgenuity - How to log in

1. Log in to your laptop and open your Wake ID Portal
 2. Click the + icon Open App Library and search for “Edgenuity”
 3. Add to your home screen
 4. Open Edgenuity and watch orientation videos
 5. Click on your Summer School course. Begin with Pre-Assessment.
- To access the Guided Notes open the lessons and click on the **Blue Ribbon Banner**. Students may print the guided notes and use them on all quizzes and tests.

Imagine Edgenuity - Where to begin

-All students will begin with a pre-assessment. The pre-assessment is locked and must be taken on campus with summer school staff. Remember, if students do well on their pre-tests, they will be excused from more lessons within the unit and finish quicker.

-You will see your summer school course after you log in. Be sure you find the course that says Summer School and click the tab to open.
